Monthly Board Meeting

Those Present: Breanne Zaremba, Vaughn Kuehl, Adam Balz, Ernie Thackeray, Betty Stoltenberg, Teresa Hubert, Al Bartels, Randie Johns, Howard Hanson, Shannon Sparks, Todd Sparks, and Valerie Holmes.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman Hanson.

The clerk's report was read. A change was made to the minutes to say the Ambulance Commission will purchase a new ambulance in the future. Randie Johns made a motion to accept the clerk's report. Allan Bartels seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The treasurer's report was read. Allan Bartels made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Randie Johns seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Public Comment

- Howard Hanson received notice that the County ET project is now scheduled to start Spring of 2022.
- Todd Sparks would like to have the ditches checked where the patrolmen fixed the road/culvert, apparently the material was put in the ditch 100 yards down the road and he is afraid the culverts will be plugged up.
- Valerie Holmes asked if we have any information on the school survey that was sent out about new construction. The town has no more information to offer.

Redistricting for Monroe County

- Adam Balz, the chairman of the redistricting committee for Monroe County was present to answer any questions anyone has about the redistricting process. He says that the county has found no evidence that there are discrepancies from the Census Bureau about the population as suggested by Mark Nicholson last month.
- A discussion of the purpose of redistricting occurred.
- If discrepancies are found, any resolution created by the town will become null and void, and the same county districts will be used for the Spring Election.
- Randie Johns made a motion to Pass a resolution to divide the town into 3 wards and approve the new supervisory district. Al Bartels seconded the motion. Motion carried.

LRIP Meeting

- A meeting will be held of October 13, 2021. Howard Hanson will be attending the meeting. The county has \$148,000 to divide between 8 projects this year.
- Todd Sparks asked if a culvert on Holiday Road is scheduled to be replaced...Howard Hanson will check the culvert, but no replacements have been planned at this time.

Monthly bills were reviewed and approved.

A motion was made by Randie Johns to adjourn the meeting. Allan Bartels seconded the motion. The motion carried.
