#### Grosbeak Ave Culvert

The tenth of a mile of Grosbeak Ave that belongs to the Town of Tomah has a culvert that needs to be replaced. The culvert has been ordered.

#### Hiawatha Bridge

The bridge was paved last week. Final walk thru with the state and contractor will be Wednesday June 14, 2017. Howard Hanson will meet with them.

#### Loan from the Bureau of Commissioners of Public Lands

The loan was approved last week. The Town will have 4 months to draw out the funds. The first yearly payment will be due in March.

#### Badger Coulee Transmission Line

The Public Service Commission approved our request to use the funds from ATC towards the Salt/Sand Shed.

#### 1 Ton Truck

The new truck was ordered. It will be a 2018 GMC. The price went down to \$39,411.

#### Open Bids for Salt/Sand Shed

- JD Reilly--\$76,616 for the building, \$5,849 for the apron. Total price \$82,465. They did not mention in bid if price includes state approved plans.
- Brickl Brothers--\$104,300 for the building, \$4640 for the apron. Total price \$108,940.
- T2 Contracting--\$79,152 for the entire project (they did not break down cost of building and apron).

The board looked over the bids. Allan made a motion to accept the lowest bid by T2 Contracting for the Salt/Sand storage building as per plans. Randie Johns seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Monthly bills were reviewed and approved.

A motion was made by Allan Bartels to adjourn the meeting. Randie Johns seconded the motion. The motion carried.
