

Q1: “What is the chief end of man?”

Answer: “Man’s chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy Him forever.”

Scripture References:

- *1 Corinthians 10:31* — “So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, **do all to the glory of God.**”
- *Psalms 16:11* — “**You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy;** at your right hand are pleasures forevermore.”

1. Key Concepts to Teach

- **Glorifying God** means honoring Him with our **thoughts, words, actions, and choices**.
- **Enjoying God** means **taking delight in God Himself**, not just His blessings.
- **Forever** reminds us that God’s glory and our joy in Him are eternal, not temporary.

2. Teaching Tips

- **Use everyday examples:** Ask your child how choices like helping a friend, telling the truth, or praying glorify God.
- **Keep it age-appropriate:** For younger children, you might say: “*God made us to love Him and be happy with Him forever.*”
- **Relate to experiences:** Point out moments of joy in creation, music, or family, and connect them to God’s glory.
- **Model enjoyment of God:** Pray, sing, and read Scripture with delight; children learn by example.

3. Questions to Discuss

- “How can we show God we love Him today?”
- “What makes you happy, and how can we see God in that happiness?”
- “Why do you think God wants us to enjoy Him forever?”

4. Activities

- **Scripture memorization:** Memorize Q1 along with *1 Corinthians 10:31* and *Psalms 16:11*.
- **Draw or craft:** Have your child illustrate ways we can glorify God in daily life.
- **Prayer time:** Encourage your child to thank God for things that bring joy and to ask how they can honor Him today.

5. Practical Application

- Encourage children to **look for God in ordinary life**—in school, at home, and during play.
- Celebrate small acts of obedience and love as ways of glorifying God.
- Reinforce the idea that **true joy comes from God**, not just toys, games, or achievements.
