

Q3: What do the Scriptures principally teach

Answer: *The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man.*

1. Key Concepts to Teach

- **Two main things the Bible teaches:**
 - **Who God is and what we must believe about Him** (His character, His work, His plan of salvation).
 - **What God wants us to do** — how to live in obedience and love.
- The Bible is both about **faith** (belief) and **practice** (duty). We believe in God's truth and live according to it.

Scripture References:

- *Deuteronomy 6:5* — “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.”
- *James 2:17* — “So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.”
- *John 14:15* — “If you love me, you will keep my commandments.”

2. Teaching Tips

- Use **simple explanations**: “The Bible tells us what to believe about God and how to live in a way that pleases Him.”
- Help your child understand that **believing and doing go together**—we show what we believe by what we do.
- Share stories from the Bible that show both belief (like trusting God) and duty (like loving others).

3. Questions to Discuss

- “What are some things the Bible tells us to believe about God?”
- “What are some things God asks us to do?”
- “Can you think of a story where someone believed in God and obeyed Him?”
- “Why do you think God wants us to believe and obey?”

4. Activities

- **Story Time:** Read a Bible story and ask your child what it teaches us about God and how to live.
- **Sorting Game:** Write down some Bible commands and beliefs on cards; have your child sort them into “What we believe” and “What we do.”
- **Memory Verse:** Learn *John 14:15* or *James 2:17* to remember that faith and action belong together.
- **Role Play:** Act out scenarios where someone chooses to obey God or show faith.

5. Practical Application

- Encourage your child to **think about both what they believe and how they act**—faith and obedience are partners.
- When making family decisions, ask: “Is this what God's Word teaches us to believe and do?”
- Praise your child when you see them obey God's Word—it shows they understand and love Him.
