

Q4: What is God?

Answer: *God is a Spirit, infinite, eternal, and unchangeable in His being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth*

1. Key Concepts to Teach

- **God is Spirit** — He doesn't have a body like people. He is everywhere and sees everything.
- **Infinite** — There is no limit to God; He is greater than anything we can imagine.
- **Eternal** — God has always existed and will always exist.
- **Unchangeable** — God never changes. What He says and who He is will always be the same.
- **Attributes** — God is wise, powerful, holy, just, good, and true — everything He does flows from these qualities perfectly.

Scripture References:

- *John 4:24* — “God is spirit, and those who worship him must **worship in spirit and truth.**”
- *Malachi 3:6* — “**For I the Lord do not change.**”

2. Teaching Tips

- **Keep it simple and visual.** You might say: “*God doesn't have a body like us. He's everywhere and always with us.*”
- **Use comparisons carefully.** When children ask “How big is God?” or “Where did He come from?”, remind them that God made everything — He had no beginning.
- **Focus on God's character.** Emphasize that God's unchanging goodness means we can always trust Him.
- **Connect it to prayer.** When praying, point out one of God's attributes — “Thank You that You are powerful and never change.”

3. Questions to Discuss

- “What does it mean that God is a Spirit?”
- “Why is it good that God never changes?”
- “How does it make you feel to know God is everywhere?”
- “Which part of God's character (power, goodness, love, truth) do you want to thank Him for today?”

4. Activities

- **Attribute Cards:** Write each word (Power, Wisdom, Goodness, etc.) on cards. Each day, pick one to talk about with a verse that shows it.
- **Memory Verse:** Learn *John 4:24* together — it's short and simple for children.
- **Comparison Game:** Have your child name things that *change* (weather, people, toys) — then explain that God never changes!
- **Draw God's Greatness:** Let your child draw symbols for each attribute (light for holiness, heart for goodness, crown for power, etc.).

5. Practical Application

- **Trust:** Because God never changes, we can always rely on Him even when life changes.
- **Worship:** Knowing God's greatness should make us want to worship and obey Him.
- **Comfort:** When children feel afraid or uncertain, remind them, “God is always with you and He never changes.”

6. Family Prayer Example

“God, You are great and good. Thank You that You never change and are always with us. Help us to trust You, worship You, and remember that You are the one true God. Amen.”
