Principal's Report, Nicole DeWitt

Mending Matters is a mental health resource for our student that has been funded by The Cushman Foundation and WD-40. A GoFundMe account was developed to raise funds for Mending Matters services and has raised \$1000. Additionally, Ms. DeWitt will be a guest speaker at an upcoming Philanthropic Chicks of Scripps Ranch and will discuss Mending Matters with the hope of additional funding and getting the word out to the community.
