**Principal's Report, Matt Lawson**

Matt reported the Day 1 campus re-opening went really well. His biggest worry was drop off and pick up, but staff and campus police helped that go smoothly. It was an exciting day. Biggest issue of the day was the lagging technology for teachers and students – it was a district wide problem. Approximately 40% of students went back to school. Matt is fairly certain that's a similar percentage to other high schools. The plan is to reassess requests for onsite/hybrid vs remote school in 2 weeks. Matt is keeping an informal 'wait list' if/when he hears from parents about wanting to switch to onsite/hybrid. Details re 2021 graduation will be released on Wednesday morning, 4/13, after SDUSD Board Meeting on Tuesday evening.

**Treasurer's Report, Chris Brookes**

According to Chris, we have \$40k cash on hand in the operating account as of March 31. That number doesn't include endowment changes because that documentation arrives later. Income to date is \$77k while expenses have been low this year. Chris is working on a draft budget for the 2021-2022 school year and anticipates having it available to be approved at the May meeting.

Suzanne made a motion to approve the financials through March 2021; Chris seconded the motion. The motion was carried.

**Auditor's Report, Carolyn Coglianese**

Unfortunately Carolyn won't have the report ready until our May meeting.

**Pledge Drive, Juliana Conzemius**

Juliana reported she's slowed down on Pledge Drive communications due to the upcoming TOTR. To date, \$16,156 has been raised via PayPal. The total, when including corporate donations, is \$27K.
