HOW YOU CAN HELP WITH WRITING REPORTS

Functional Reports should always be factual and should not include personal conclusions, opinions or reflections. Factual reports should not contain phrases such as "I think....", "My opinion is....." etc.

- Help your child to find information for their reports e.g. in a library, from the internet.
- Encourage your child to write in their own words
 they should not copy directly from books.
- Encourage your child to plan what they are going to write about. Discuss the best order with them.
- * Encourage your child to proof read their writing carefully.
- * Use plenty of praise and encouragement.
- * Make writing fun. Write some reports together!


