

# How You Can Help Listening and Talking

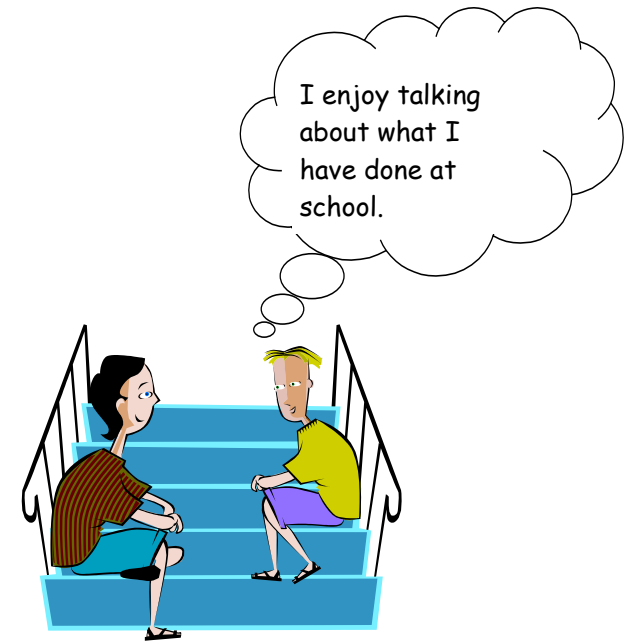
## What Listening and Talking means

Listening and Talking activities encourage skills which mean all children will be able to talk about what has happened during the day. They will listen to and follow simple instructions and be able to pass on simple messages.

## More ideas to support Listening and Talking

- \* Play sound games.
- \* Give children simple instructions to follow.
- \* Sing and repeat Nursery Rhymes together.
- \* Talk about what you are doing at that moment.
- \* Encourage your child to speak clearly.
- \* Give plenty of praise and encouragement.
