

How You Can Help Listening and Talking

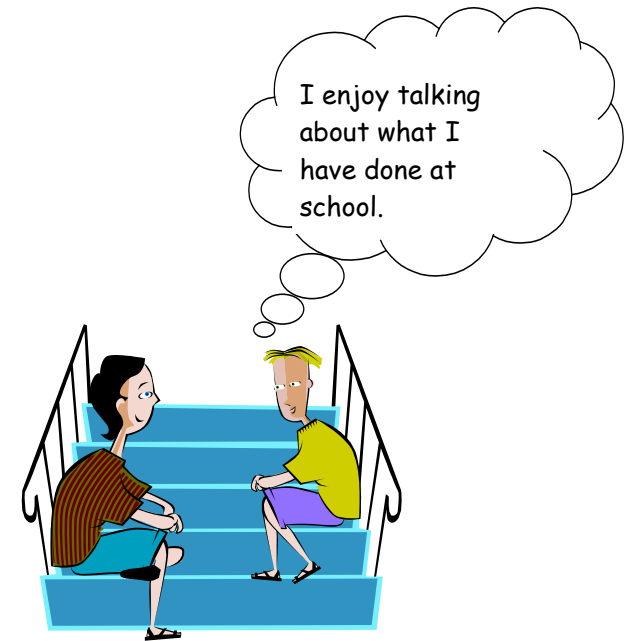
What Listening and Talking means

More ideas to support Listening and Talking

- * Listen to and talk about poems.
- * Involve your child in making choices.
- * Discuss reasons for making choices.
- * Involve your child in conversations.
- * Encourage your child to talk about an interest or hobby.
- * Give plenty of praise and encouragement.
