This term we are learning to write poems with different structures and to write instructions. We will use appropriate vocabulary and remember to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops appropriately.  We are using our increasing knowledge of phonics and sight vocabulary to read and spell common words. We are developing our understanding of different letter blends to help us when reading and spelling unfamiliar words. Each week we will focus on a different letter blend. We are reading Oxford Reading Tree books alongside other phonics reading schemes to develop our reading skills and we are completing comprehension tasks to demonstrate our understanding. We are increasing our ability in reading with fluency, expression and understanding, and developing our skills in selecting relevant information and using it for a specific purpose.  We will continue practising forming our letters correctly in both upper case and lower case.			This term our topic is Enterprise. We will learn about people who help us. We will learn through our play about local shops and services in our daily lives. We will build on our knowledge and understanding from last terms topic Our Community. In our shared area we have a bank and a vets set up as part of our role play areas. How to Support Your Child's Learning at Home: Reading books will be sent home on a weekly basis. Please support your child by listening to them reading and discussing what is happening in the story. You can also support your child by reading to them as often as you can and talking about the stories, who are the characters, where is the story set, what is the plot, can you make predictions as to what might happen next? Spelling homework will be sent home when appropriate, the current focus just now is blends and for many of us focussing on common words.

Playing board games is a fantastic way for your child to practise their numeracy and counting skills whilst having fun together.

We are working to improve our mental ability to subtract numbers, within 10 initially and beyond as able. Regular short bursts of practice would help your child with this.

Discussing when you use money and encouraging your child to choose the correct money to pay for items when shopping will support them in developing their understanding and confidence when using money.
