How to Support Your Child's Learning at Home:

<u>Reading</u> - Please discuss the story and ask your child to share what has happened so far. At this stage it is helpful to look at and talk about the pictures. If they come across a new word, please encourage them to write it in their reading diary and then ask them to discover its meaning (perhaps through a dictionary or by you putting the word in a different context).

<u>Spelling</u> - Weekly spelling will be given out on a Monday and is to be returned on Friday. The spelling list will consist of a spelling pattern or common words and these will have been taught in class. More detail about the homework spelling activities will be given at the beginning of each term.

Maths/Numeracy - Homework will be given as required to support and consolidate the work in class. Tasks may include oral work with an adult, a written task or playing a game.
