

Curriculum Overview - Topics:

Block: Jan-Apr 2025 Class: P3 Teacher: Mrs Woodcock

Literacy and English

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Writing: We are learning to understand some main features of a poem (verse, rhythm, rhyme) We will be learning to write our own poems using different structures to help us. (acrostic, rhyming and rhythm poems)

We are learning to write imaginative stories and include interesting characters and settings.

In all our writing task:

We will be learning to use capital letters, question marks and full stops in the correct place

We will be learning to use conjunctions to join sentences.

We will read our own work to check that our sentences make sense.

We will be learning to use letter patterns and spelling rules to help me spell.

Reading

We will be learning to read aloud with understanding and expression using our class reading books.

We will be learning to identify and discuss the use of adjectives and 'wow' words in stories and how they help to paint a picture of a character or setting.

Listening and Talking

We will be listening to a variety of Scottish poems and discussing which ones we like and why.

We will be learning to communicate clearly when reciting a poem out loud to the class (individually and in small groups.)

Numeracy and Maths

Numeracy

Circles/Rectangles-We will be learning to use mental and written strategies to subtract up to 50 and then 100 We will be learning to multiply by 2, 5 and 10.

Triangles and Squares – We will be learning to use mental and written strategies to subtract up to 100 We will be learning to multiply by 2, 5 and 10.

Maths (whole class)

Measure: I will be learning to estimate and use basic units of measurement (kg, metre, litre)

Data Handling: present data in a variety of ways using bar graphs and Venn diagrams.

The Rainforest Social studies

We will be learning to....

 investigate the climate in the Rainforest and how it affects the plants and animals.

Social Studies and Science

 understand how the plants and trees in the Rainforest influence the animals that live there.

Science

We will be learning to...

- understand the difference between living and non-living things and sort them into groups.
- explore examples of food chains and show how animals and plants depend on each other for food.
