And do not let your heart be glad when he stumbles;

18 Or the Lord will see it and be displeased,

And turn His anger away from him.

Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirs up strife,

But love covers all transgressions.

Proverbs 19:11 A man's discretion makes him slow to anger,

And it is his glory to overlook a transgression.

Proverbs 17:17 A friend loves at all times.

And a brother is born for adversity.

Friday Devotional: John 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

Chiastic construction in John chapter 10:

A 10:1–2 The true shepherd enters by the door.

B 10:3–5 The sheep recognize the shepherd's voice.

C 10:6 The figure of speech is misunderstood.

D 10:7–9 Jesus is the door of the sheep.

E 10:10 The thief comes to destroy; Jesus gives abundant life.

F 10:11–13 The Good Shepherd lays down His life for the sheep.

F 10:14–16: The Shepherd knows His sheep and brings others into one flock.

E 10:17–18: Jesus lays down His life willingly.

D 10:22–23: Jesus is in the temple during Hanukkah (symbolic of light and access).

C 10:24: The Jews demand a plain answer.

B 10:25–26: Unbelievers do not recognize His voice.

A 10:27–29: The sheep hear His voice and follow Him.

Wisdom in family relationships:

- Acquiring truth requires effort, sacrifice, and appreciation for value.
- Discernment in a world of information overload.
- Do not trade away (compromise) truth for temporary gain, popularity, convenience, fleeting desire.
- Maintain integrity over expediency.
- Marriage is divinely sanctioned institution. God's favor happens through marriage.
- A spouse is a blessing, not a burden. Happiness and fulfillment within marriage are gifts of God.
- God affirms marital sexuality (within monogamous, lifelong, marriage).
- Marriage is a covenant and a source of blessing
 - Intent: joy, life, fruitfulness.
- Choosing faithfulness is path to blessing and life. Choosing adultery is path of foolishness and destruction.
- Friendships are a ministry. Marriages are a ministry.
- Participate with God in what He wants to do.
- Relationship needs to be both deep and honest.
 - Honest feedback.
 - Accountability.
 - Constructive criticism.
 - Respect, acceptance.
 - Debate.
 - Goal is ministry: wiser, more capable, more effective in life and faith.
- Children are selfish ("me, my, mine!").
- Rod of Discipline = authority when there is need of correction.
 - Drive out foolishness to make room for wisdom.
- Parenting is a divine mandate.
 - Worst thing you can do to a selfish person is let them continue in their selfishness.
 - God disciplines those He loves (Hebrews 12:6). Parents discipline those they love.
- Train up: to dedicate, to initiate, or to narrow based on the age and stage of a child's life. It includes teaching, guidance, and discipline.
- Methodologies are geared specifically to the child.
- Way should go: truth of the Lord and wisdom for success in dealing with a complex world.
- Nor a 100% promise, but a proverb.
- God is your partner.
- Discern the child's nature (intelligence, temperament, personality).
- A Good person leaves an inheritance to both children and grandchildren.
- Cause and effect go across generations.
- Righteousness is a practical path demonstrated in right relationships with God and with others as much as possible.
- To pass on a heritage (financial, and spiritual) to our children and grandchildren, we need to be intentional.
- "Discipline of the Lord" is moral instruction, training, education, punishment, designed to be a formative process that shapes character.
- There is a causal link between love and correction.
- Correction is a sign of love, value, and affection.
- Correction has a purpose.
- For believers, correction (Hebrews 5:5-11) is a sign that we are children of God.

- Two people, two defining qualities, two outcomes.
- Meritocracy (Faith, faithfulness, wisdom, good character).
- God looks at the heart (1 Samuel 16:7)
- Justice eventually prevails.
- Character over privilege.
- The most valuable thing a parent can pass on to their children is a firm foundation of faith, wisdom, and character.
- Curse is to treat with dishonor, contempt, belittle or hold in low esteem.
- Violates fifth commandment (moral offense).
- Lamp: Life, prosperity, hope, guidance. Ruin happens at a time that is least desirable (darkness).
- Warning: link act of contempt to inevitable loss of divine blessing and a future without hope.
- Honoring parents is a divine command.
- A life of honoring others (beginning with one's parents) leads to a life of blessing, stability, and hope. Dishonoring leads to a loss of blessing and a bleak future.
- Listen is to hear and obey.
- Begot, ground of authority is that he gave you life.
- Despise is to scorn, look down on, disrespect.
 - Do not dismiss because of her age and increasing vulnerability.
- Command of God.
- Parent's are (flawed) representatives of God.
- God values the wisdom of the elderly.
- The elderly are a blessing not a burden.
- We need to actively honor; not just passive acceptance.
- A parent's joy is tied to the character of the child.
- Righteous and wise represent a life lived in accordance with the commands of God and His moral order.
- The child is to live so that their life becomes a source of joy for their parents.
- Reframe parenting: not just academics or careers, but children who are morally sound and wise.
- The hard work of raising a righteous child is worth it.

Wisdom in Relationship Repair: Why?

- Perverse: twisted, devious, obstinate in evil.
- Slanderer can be true, but a bad report.
 - Is it true, necessary, kind (edification is the goal).
- Takeaways:
 - Protect relationships
 - Be an encourager, not a gossiper.
 - If you hear gossip, rebuke the source, and refuse to pass it on.
 - Say a quick prayer for the person.
 - Reflect on a strained relationship, then take a meaningful step towards restoration.
- Hot-tempered is quick to anger
- Stirs up strife is intentional or reckless provocation.
- Self-control is a mark of wisdom.
- Patience de-escalates conflicts and promotes reconciliation.
- Takeaways:
 - We are called to be peacemakers.
 - For a recent conflict, offer a listening ear.
 - Exercise patience before responding.

• Wisdom in Relationship Repair: What?

- To despise is to hold in contempt.
- Silence is to exercise restraint to prevent harmful speech.
- Talebearer spreads confidential information.

- Conceals a matter is not hiding sin, it is keeping private matters private. This demonstrates faithfulness and loyalty.
- Takeaways:
 - In this digital age, demonstrate restraint.
 - Guard confidences.
- Overlook an offense rather than reveal it.
- Takeaways:
 - Choose to address conflicts privately (Matthew 18:15).
 - In today's hyper-connected world, this is a call for forgiveness, and to exercise love by keeping no record of wrongs.
 - Forgive as Jesus forgives.
 - Build bridges instead of walls.
- Words have power of life and death.
- Rash speech is destructive. Wise speech is healing.
- Takeaways:
 - Exercise discernment with social media.
 - Are my words building up or tearing down?
 - How can I respond with gentleness and wisdom?
- Words can evoke calmness or provocation.
- Takeaways:
 - In a polarized culture, we need to demonstrate the civility of Jesus.
 - Words are like water. Gentle streams soothe. Torrents destroy.
 - When frustrated, respond with gentle words.
 - Defuse anger with grace.
- Prohibition against false testimony or retribution.
- Baseless accusations harm community and dishonor God.
- Takeaways:
 - Speak the truth.
 - Getting even..., doesn't.
- Tangible immediate provision for a need.
- Trust God's judgment.
- Takeaways:
 - Use demonstrable kindness to transform relationships.
 - Find a need and meet it.
 - Pray for someone who seems like an enemy.
- Honest correction is better than manipulative flattery.
- Truthfulness is more important than temporary discomfort.
- Takeaways:
 - In today's click value-sensitivity that drives people-pleasing activity, establish trust (you care) and speak the truth with love, courageously.
 - Am I open to such wounds?
- Within community of faith, by mature believers, with gentleness.
- Requires sensitivity, self-awareness and humility.
- Restoration is a Christian duty.
- Takeaways:
 - Restore with compassion and empathy.
 - Exercise gentleness, guard against pride.
 - Use private gentle restoration (rather than social media shaming blast).
- Warning against gaining pleasure from other's misfortune.
- Prohibits personal gloating. Gloating usurps God's role in judging.

- Takeaways:
 - Promote empathy and mercy.
 - Pray for their redemption.
 - Pray for someone who has wronged you.
- Highlights internal attitudes show up in external actions.
- Hatred leads to conflicts, quarrels, divisions, contention, discord.
- Selfless Love chooses forgiveness and reconciliation over retaliation.
- Takeaways:
 - Choose forgiveness over grudges.
 - Promote peace rather than division.
 - Address conflict constructively.
 - Break the cycle. Be a peacemaker.
- Slow to anger, forgiveness, are God qualities.
- Wisdom exercises emotional self-control.
- Conflicts are inevitable. Anger does not have to be.
- Takeaways:
 - Image of God should reflect the character of God.
 - Culture is quick offense and cancel.
 - Believers need to swim against this current.
 - Scroll past inflammatory comments.
 - Respond with questions rather than accusations.
 - See offenses against you through the eyes of the mercy of the Lord.

Wisdom in Relationship Repair: How?

- Highlights internal attitudes show up in external actions.
- Hatred leads to conflicts, quarrels, divisions, contention, discord.
- Selfless Love chooses forgiveness and reconciliation over retaliation.
- Takeaways:
 - Choose forgiveness over grudges.
 - Promote peace rather than division.
 - Address conflict constructively.
 - Break the cycle. Be a peacemaker.
- True friends and family loyalty are marked by steadfast love and reliability, especially in challenging times.
- Untrue friends, and disloyal family... don't!
- Takeaways:
 - Social media fosters shallow relationships.
 - Shoulder the burdens of others in trying times.
 - Offer practical help.
 - Call someone you know who is facing adversity to let them know that you are there for them.
- God equates our hate, judgment with original sin.
- Jesus as a Sacrificial Servant (Isaiah 53 Who bore God's vengeance, Philippians 2).
- We can stop acting as Lords.
- Reflecting the image of God in relationships requires the power of God.
- Become the peacemaker that Jesus has called you to be.
