## Notes and Conditions for RoSET Awards

1. The Rotary Club of Sidcup Educational Trust (Charity No. 293030), known as RoSET, was set up in 1985 for the advancement of education in the Area referred to below. The Trustees consider Applications for Awards, in order to provide Financial Assistance to young persons to enable them to participate in specific activities of an educational nature, which will complement their academic development.
2. Applications should, wherever possible, be submitted by the Head of School, Youth Organization, Club or Employer and not the candidate's parent. Candidates seeking funds from several sources for a major project may apply themselves providing full sponsorship details with a confidential letter are submitted.
3. Candidates must normally be between 15 and 25 years of age. However, in exceptional cases, applicants will be considered outside this age range.
4. The Trust Deed requires that candidates should live, work or attend a place of education within the designated geographical area of the Rotary Club of Sidcup. However, the Trustees are willing to consider candidates who live and/or attend a place of education or work which is outside this designated geographical area. The Trustees have the absolute discretion in determining this condition as it is the basis on which the Trust was originally founded.
5. Confidential comments of the supporting or sponsoring person are of particular importance and must be supplied in all cases. The main objective of the scheme is to provide a challenge and experience for young people who might otherwise not have such an opportunity. The fact that the person is likely to benefit from a challenging course is unlikely, in itself, to be adequate justification unless it can be shown that there are additional factors to support the candidate's selection. These would include the financial, family and social circumstances of the candidate.
6. The Trustees reserve the right to refuse any application without giving reasons for their decision, which shall be deemed final.
7. Successful applicants will be expected to submit, after the event, a brief statement as to its success or otherwise and how they have benefited personally. If the event is cancelled or the applicant is unable to attend, a full refund of the bursary will be expected.
