

# Curb, Gutter, Sidewalk Project Funding





- Initial investment of \$500k in FY 18/19
- \$100k annually thereafter
- Through FY 24/25, contributed \$1.1m (Hazardous Waste Revenue)



### Water Assistance







### Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Trust Fund → Hazardous **Waste Revenue**

- County secured ~\$10m from the state to build a WTP due to existing water supplies in Kettleman being contaminated with Arsenic
- County stepped in to provide ongoing funding on behalf of the District/Community
  County makes an annual contribution of \$150k into the Operations and Maintenance Trust Account used to fund operations and maintenance of the WTP – \$3m contribution over 20 years
  • With the FY 24/25 contribution, the County has
- invested \$1.85m
- Preparing for catastrophic events at the California Aqueduct that may impact the WTP, the County made an initial \$90k investment in FY 12/13. With interest, this account has grown to \$106k as of August 2025

### Misc. Water Assistance (Outside of WTP)

 County paid \$329k to front the purchase of additional water supplies for Kettleman City CSD from Mojave Water Agency - FY 21/22

### **ARPA Allocations**





- \$87,741 for the Kettleman City CSD Utility Arrear Payments to forgive outstanding residential utility bills
  \$371,500 for the Kettleman City Foundation

  \$20,000 for the Small Business Grant
  \$351,500 for facility repairs

  \$105k to the Mojave Water Agency to purchase 75 acre-feet of water for Kettleman City CSD





### Broadband

### **Project Overview**

- AT&T is launching a major broadband infrastructure project in Kings County.
- The focus is on expanding high-speed internet throughout Kettleman City.
- This includes using existing infrastructure and building new fiber lines where necessary.

### **Geographic Scope**

- The project isn't limited to just the city:
- South of Kettleman City near Highway 41 and Kettleman Station will also receive new fiber infrastructure.
- Fiber will be extended east of the city off Racine Avenue.
- Additional fiber will be laid southwest along Highway 41.


### **Project Timeline**

Construction is expected to begin Q1 of 2026
