Something many local dog owners can relate to!

Nose to Trail will also be offering an incredible and unique new service, service training for veterinary care procedures (ear drops, eye drops, muzzle training etc) by a Registered Veterinary Nurse in the client's homes.

Rachel told us “being able to expand and take on more staff allows Nose to Trail to support even more dogs in the local area and keep up with the ever growing demand for behavioural support”

“during the pandemic the number of dogs being owned in the UK increased dramatically and sadly many of these dogs did not get the early training and life experiences they needed. This has resulted in clinical animal behaviourists like myself having an increased case load. Having a team of experienced trainers to implement my behaviour modification plans on the ground, face to face with clients will help us, to help more local dogs!
