We work collaboratively with organizations that serve Millbrae and its people.

- *Where* senior citizens participate in programs that provide fellowship and enjoyment to the quality of their life;
- *Where* youth are involved in community projects that promote pride and provide needed improvements, helping them to understand the importance of their part in the community;
- *Where* community organizations work cooperatively to support programs in education and training, leveraging resources to maximize community impact for the benefit of all;
- *Where* the Millbrae community embraces and celebrates its diversity through wide participation and civic engagement by residents and businesses;

• *Where* a strongly spirited community of youth, adults and seniors can unite their talents and resources to expand services and programs and to develop capital improvement projects needed for the implementation of programs.

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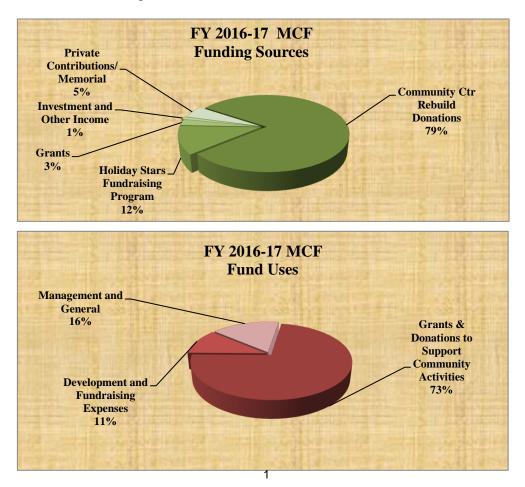
HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2016-17 FISCAL YEAR

The Millbrae Community Foundation (the MCF) is a 501(c) 3 nonprofit organization. Its mission is to raise money for and give grants to support projects and programs for youth, adults and seniors. Since its establishment in May 1996, the Millbrae Community Foundation (the MCF) has awarded grant monies to fund many projects and programs that provide valuable amenities and benefits to Millbrae residents.

During FY 2016-17 the MCF raised \$76,480 in contributions. The MCF received \$61,368 for the Community Center Rebuild project, \$9,105 from the annual Holiday Stars fundraising, \$3,757 from private donations, \$2,000 from PG&E and United Airline grants, and \$250 for the Millbrae Community Youth Center programs.

This year the MCF granted \$2,500 to LiveMoves for the summer programs for homeless children, \$1,500 to MCTV for the documentary project via interviewing long-time residents to capture their memories of Millbrae, \$3,000 to Millbrae Historical Society for paving its new Carriage House driveway with permeable pavers, and \$1,000 to Peninsula Chinese Business Association for the Lunar New Year Celebration Banquet program costs. The MCF distributed \$1,060 of holiday gift cards to the needy families and donated \$350 toward the purchase of Millbrae youth baseball shirts. The MCF awarded scholarships to Frank Perez of Mills High and Janette Barrantis of Capuchino High for their remarkable participation in community services. The two awardees received \$1,000 each in scholarship.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2015-16 FISCAL YEAR (Continued)

More than a year ago on March 21, 2016 the Millbrae Community Center was destroyed by fire. Two teenage boys were arrested for starting the fire along an exterior wall of the Center. The blaze spread quickly and eventually the building roof collapsed. It took the firefighters four hours to distinguish the blaze.

The Millbrae Community Center had been a community hub for decades, where residents had gathered for everything, from child-care services, youth programs, to classes for adults and senior citizens. After the fire, the Community Center and the Central Park could no longer be used for the various community programs and services. With great cooperation from the community, the City's Recreation staff was able to quickly make necessary arrangements and to relocate for over 100 classes, contractors, and room rentals to other facilities.

The community leaders and businesses have stepped up in fundraising activates for the Community Center Rebuild project. The MCF raised \$61,368 during the year from residents, local and regional businesses for the project. Of which \$30,000 was donated by a San Jose based company, the Republic Urban. The Company's CEO/President Michael Van Every indicated that this grant was intented to help ease the pain of the temporary loss of the Center and its programs, to pay for the resources necessary to keep progrmas functioning, and to inspire business leaders throughout the region to contribute in order to bring the Center back to the community as soon as possible. The MCF has commited \$20,000 in matching fund for the Community Center Rebuild project.

On July 26. 2017 Millbrae Mayor Reuben Holober announced that the City of Millbrae and its insurance providers have agreed on a fair settlement amount related to the loss of the Center. Through the settlement, the City of Millbrae will receive \$6,194,501 to replace the Millbrae Community Center. According to the insurance policy, the maximum amount that will be authorized and paid is set at \$4,400,429 until the building is replaced. The remaining amount of \$1,794,072 will be paid when the new Center building is completed and has received its occupancy permit from the City. Mayor Holober indicated that a preferred project concept plan will be in place in six months and building of the Center will be on its way in 12 months. He commended everyone who had worked on this project and thanked the community for their support and patience through it all.

This October, a temporary community Center will open in the City Hall parking lot, which will provide needed space for recreation programs and staff. This temporary Center was paid for in part with a \$250,000 grant from the County of San Mateo's Measurer K Community enhancement program.

The Contributions-in Kind for legal and accounting services amounted to \$4,430 for the year.

Millbrae Community Foundation Notes to Financial Statements

Millbrae Community Foundation was established in May 1996. The purpose of the Foundation is to expand services and programs for youth, adults and seniors, and to secure funds for capital improvement projects that will assist with the implementation of these programs and services. Millbrae Community Foundation is a non-profit 501.C.3 organization and is seeking public support for community programs.

During 2016-17 fiscal year the MCF received \$76,480 in contributions, of which \$61,368 was for the Community Center Rebuild project. This year the MCF awarded \$8,000 in grants distribution, \$2,000 in scholarships to Mills and Capuchino high schools students, and \$1,410 in community support programs.
