OUR MISSION

We are a nonprofit volunteer organization which fundraises for and issues grants to individuals and organizations that create, enhance, or sustain positive change in our community.

OVERVIEW

HIGHLIGHTS OF FISCAL YEAR 2021-22

The Millbrae Community Foundation (MCF) is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. Its mission is to fundraise for and issue grants to individuals and organizations that create, enhance, or sustain positive change in the community. Since its establishment in May 1996, the MCF has awarded grants to fund many projects and programs that provide valuable amenities and benefits to Millbrae residents. MCF has been a vital partner in the restoration of the Millbrae Recreation Center (MRC) project, in addition to its other grants. MCF collected and managed the contributions to the Millbrae Recreation Center restoration project, in addition to MCF projects.

In FY 2021-22 the MCF raised \$24,730 in contributions for MCF projects: \$14,205 from the annual Holiday Stars program and \$8,025 from private donations. The MCF received \$2,500 as its Annual Fee for management of the MRC Restoration Funds.

In turn, the MCF distributed \$8,000 in grants, \$12,000 in scholarships, and \$1,800 toward the holiday gift card program. Grants were distributed as follows: \$5,000 to MCTV to sponsor production of six episodes of the *In the Kitchen* documentary series; \$1,000 to the Mills High School Boba Bots Robotics Club to help the students to build their own robot for the FIRST Robotics Competition and learn technical and leadership skills while working on the project as a team; \$2,000 to the Millbrae Historical Society to fund the design, fabrication, and installation of two interpretive sign panels at the top of Hillcrest Boulevard near the entrance to Sawyer Camp Trail in Millbrae. The two signs will provide educational information about the native Ohlone people who lived in the area for over 5000 years and the historic sighting of San Francisco Bay by the Portola Expedition in 1769. The MCF awarded four post-secondary scholarships in the amount of \$3,000 each, to Jan Soo Jun and Litzy Velasquez from Mills High School and Adrienne Chen and Samantha Paschner from Capuchino High School. The MCF distributed gift cards of \$100 each to 18 local families in need during the holiday season.

HIGHLIGHTS OF FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 (Continued)

Six years ago the old Millbrae Recreation Center was destroyed by fire on July 21, 2016. This year, Millbrae residents were able to celebrate the opening of their new \$28 million Recreation Center with joy on June 11. The new 24,000 square-foot building is fully operational now. It includes a senior lounge, a fitness and wellness studio, two preschool classrooms, an art center, a teen/youth game room, large and small flexible classrooms, a large community room, and multiple social gathering areas. The Center now offers a wide range of educational and recreational programs to youth, adults, and seniors for the community to use and enjoy.

While the City had made good efforts in securing \$28.4 million in funds for construction of the building, an additional funding of \$1,75 million was needed for the purchase of furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FF&E), including electrical systems, such as security, audio visual, phone and data systems, and public art and landscaping. The Millbrae Community Foundation is proud to be a major partner in fundraising for the rebuilding of the Recreation Center. This year the MCF collected and managed \$273,102 for the FF&E Fund that was donated by the community donors for this project. The cumulative total for the FF&E fundraising campaign collected by MCF is \$378,170 as of June 30, 2022. In addition, the City received State and County grants to fill the funding gap. Donors were recognized on a commemorative Donor Wall installed at the Recreation Center. The Fund is still open for on-going contributions to provide for needed FF&E, landscaping, and public art at the Millbrae Recreation Center.

Millbrae community leaders also initiated efforts to engage civic organizations, service clubs, the business community, and residents in the fundraising campaign. The MRC Fundraising Committee was formed a year ago with MCF Board member Janet Fogarty serving as the Committee Chair. MCF Board member Joe Teresi was also actively involved in the Committee's fundraising activities. At the MCF Board meeting on July 13, 2022, Janet Fogarty reported that "the effort was successful in many ways in addition to raising money, in that the program raised the visibility of MCF in the community, it built connections with many different community groups in town, and brought MCF many more contributors to add to our connections. And it helped to build the sense of community in the very broadest sense." Joe Teresi reported that a substantial amount of donations were raised by the Committee during the year for the FF&E Fund.

The MCF's In-Kind Contributions for pro bono legal and accounting services amounted to \$6,375 for the year.

Millbrae Community Foundation was established in May 1996. It's mission is to fundraise for and issue grants to individuals and organizations that create, enhance, or sustain positive change in the community.

During 2021-22 fiscal year the MCF received \$24,730 in Contributions: \$14,205 from the annual Holiday Stars program, \$8,025 from private donations. The MCF received \$2,500 as its Annual Fee for management of the Millbrae Recreation Center Restoration Funds. In turn, the MCF distributed \$8,000 in grants, \$12,000 in scholarships to Mills and Capuchino High Schools students, and \$1,800 toward the holiday gift card program.
