Recent Activities

Skittles at the Orchard 1st April

We advertised in advance that because of the special circumstances prevailing at the time (as now, sadly) the Council had suggested that the profits should be donated to the DEC Humanitarian Appeal for Ukraine.

This enjoyable evening raised £230 which was duly donated to the Ukraine Appeal. Special thanks must go to Mark for keeping us all in check and ensuring that the skittles competition ran smoothly.

Table Top sale in aid of Ukraine 7th May

The Church Social Committee organised a table top sale and invited people to take a table for a small fee which was to be donated to the Ukraine Appeal.

The Friends took a table selling donated items and chose to donate not only the fee, but also the takings to the Appeal. Our contribution amounted to £83.

In total, £660 was raised for the Appeal by the sale despite it being put together at short notice.

St Peter & All Hallows Church Summer Fete 2nd July

As usual, the Friends had a table with a raffle at the Fete. The prize was a lovely summer hamper with everything needed for Pimms and a cream tea.

The weather was disappointing to say the least, with heavy downpours at times, but the hardy people of West Huntspill still came out in numbers. The Church was open for teas and coffees and we were able to see the improvements to the facilities which will make it so much more useable for the community. A number of names were suggested for the new space and people were invited to vote for their favourites. In addition, suggestions were sought for the type of activities that people would like to see take place there (without detracting from the Balliol Hall of course).

The Fete raised a total profit of £924 which considering the weather was a great result. On top of this, the Friends raffle raised £78 for our funds, which will of course eventually go to the Church when our next project is identified.

Raven Mad?

If you spend any time in or around the churchyard, you soon become aware of the sights and sounds of the resident corvids (Rooks, Crows and Jackdaws) which nest in large numbers in the nearly trees - but can you tell the difference between them?

The Jackdaws are the easiest to recognise as they are considerably smaller than the other two and have a light grey neck. Rooks and Crows are similar in size, but the rook has feathery "plus four trousers" and a distinctive pale bill which has a bare grey base.

Corvids are intelligent and sociable birds, often known to mate for life and it is reported that adult family members without their own nests will assist family members in the feeding and raising of young.

We can certainly testify that they are extremely sociable. One of the treats of this time of year is to see the mass flights which often take place around the church area in the evenings coming up to sunset. The birds gather in the tree tops and on the top of the tower, calling and chattering amongst themselves until at some unseen signal they all take off with a "whoosh" of wings and wheel around the sky, sometimes literally hundreds of them.

From our vantage point with a good view of the church tower, we also frequently see the birds doing what can only be describes as playing by taking it in turns to balance on the weather vane and even on the top of the fluttering flag.

Are there Ravens here? I personally have never seen one in West Huntspill but there are reliable reports of Ravens nesting nearby, so it is possible. They are unmistakable on the ground, being much larger than Rooks or Crows standing at about 46cm tall (around 18 inches in old money) and with a wingspan of up to 1.5 m. It would be wonderful to see them here, so I live in hope.
