With the continuation of lockdown a high degree of uncertainty about when it will be wise (and permitted) to hold social events it is difficult to bring you news. However, we were keen to keep in contact and to issue the newsletter to our members and so we are grateful to Annette Moore for allowing us to share her recollections of family life in West Huntspill in years gone by.

Recollections of a local family

My Mother, Phyllis Irene Braund, later Hooper, always spoke with affection of West Huntspill. She was born in 1920 at 5, New Road, the youngest of nine children of Alice and Edward Braund. Edward worked as a Fireman on the Somerset and Dorset Railway. Three of Mum's siblings went to Canada when Mum was only 8 years old.

Mum went to school at Huntspill School where Mr. Darcy was Headmaster. She spoke often of the social life in the village, going to dancing and parties at the Balliol Hall and Summer Garden Parties at the Pizey's Big House and at the Church. At bluebell time a group would cycle to Loxley Wood to pick some flowers

I visited New Road often until my Grandmother died, aged 80, when I was 7 years old. I have a record of the people who lived there:-

Mum and Dad married at St Peter & All Hallows in 1931 and their four children were all christened there. Her brother Arch was a member of the choir and is in a photograph of the choir. (He later went to Nigeria to construct the Railway.) Arch is buried in the Churchyard, as are my grandparents.

My husband Bob and I joined the Friends of Huntspill Church (we were no's 1 and 2!). We loved visiting the Church and attending the Fetes and Flower and Vegetable Shows and the other social occasions such as the Skittles Evening! We hope to continue to support the Friends when we are allowed to meet again.
