As you know, last year thanks to your generosity The Friends were able to fund the repair of the Reginald Wade window in the Church at the cost of £2480, which considering that we had only been running for a year at that point, was quite remarkable and shows how important the church building is to the community in the village. However, it did take most of our funds and so with the lifting of lockdown, the Council has wasted no time in seeking ways to top them up again.

To kick things off, at the Church Fete we raffled a hamper containing a cream tea for two, complete with Pimm's. This raised £175 after the costs!

## BBQ on the Lawn – 14<sup>th</sup> August

Well, we could not have asked for better weather for our first event for over 18 months when we gathered on the Church Lawn on Saturday afternoon for the barbeque. The sun shone all afternoon as we emerged blinking from the gloom of lockdown. Around 40 people enjoyed a truly delicious range of barbecued fare, thanks to our chefs, Ryan and Jon Hopwood, and a very social, if slightly socially distanced, get together. We were also treated to a stunning display of aerobatics by the local dragonfly population who turned out in force.

As well as being a very enjoyable occasion, it also raised a grand total of £476 after costs which was beyond our expectations. A generous gift of an embroidered picture representing the church was auctioned for £50 and the raffle raised a splendid £150. Our thanks also to the PRS/PPL who granted us a free licence so we could provide background music.

## Continuing our informal series of stories of local life from our members, we are grateful to Gordon Fear for sharing his memories.

The Family Recollections of Annette Moore which appeared in the Friend's Spring Newsletter I found very interesting, as I was also born on New Road at Number 4! This was at my Grandparent's William and Annie Gunningham's house, way back in the 1930s. However, my childhood was spent on The Clyce (Clyce Road) Highbridge. I missed out on attending West Huntspill School until I was eleven years old, as I had to attend Highbridge Infants School.

Many of my childhood friends who lived on The Clyce also attended West Huntspill School, where the Headmaster at the time was a Mr L. A. Davey who was also the Organist and Choir Master at St Peter & All Hallows Church.



This is a photograph of the WH School's Football Team which was possibly taken in 1949 or 1950. I have just realised that included in the team were four boys from The Clyce and the Headmaster Mr L.A. Davey is pictured alongside his school's team. The other teachers at the school when I attended were Mr H.(Arthur) Holley, Miss Porter, Miss Phillips, Miss Cox and Mr C. Parish.

The School Dentist would visit the school maybe every six months or just once a year, and Mrs King at No9 New Road allowed her front room to be used as the Dental Surgery!

Most lunch breaks when at school I could visit my Gran at No4 New Road. My Gran's sister Mrs Mason (who was my Aunt Fann) lived at No7 and very often she would bring a wonderful freshly baked fruit cake for us all to enjoy. Both my Gran and her sister (my Aunt) were born in West Huntspill on Sloway Lane. The 1891 Census lists my Gran as aged 17 and my Aunt Fann as 13 years old.

I know Mr Syd(?) Washer at No6 and my Uncle Ern at No7 were firm friends, both were members of the Village Church's Choir and each Sunday morning they would walk to church and if the singing had gone well might pop into the Globe Hotel on their return home to refresh their vocal cords! Being careful to be home in time to carve the Sunday Roast!

I can also remember the Village cricket team playing their home fixtures at Mr Bill Palmer's Grove Farm, before moving to the War Memorial Ground on New Road possibly in the 1950s.

I expect there are others who remember the huge traffic jams on summer weekends, when traffic would be solid from Bridgwater to the Bristol side of Highbridge. Thank goodness the M5, when opened in the 1960s, sorted that problem.
