In 1977 the Queensland Soccer Federation proposed a State League.

President of St Helens Terry Brown wanted to ensure an Ipswich team could enter.

He approached Booval Stars and Coalstars for support. Initially Coalstars declined but agreed to join the joint venture.

The joint venture commenced in 1978 with the State League starting in 1979 and continued until 1981 when Coalstars withdrew

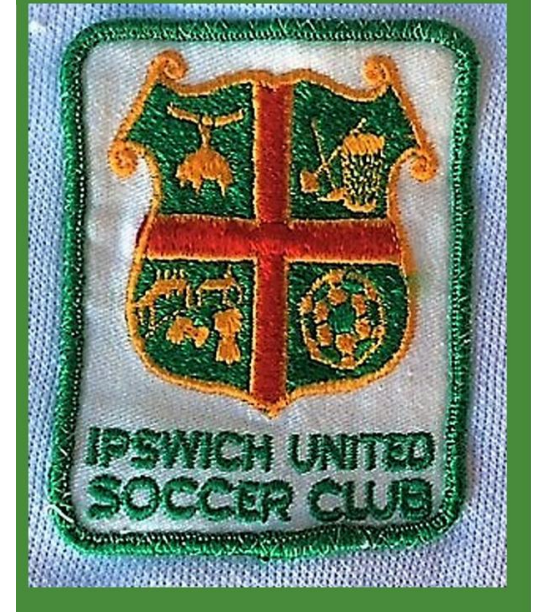
Ipswich United, however, continued from 1981 until 1989 when Ipswich United reverted to St. Helens.

Throughout this period they were successful in winning premierships, grand finals and Ampol Cups.

Initially they were under the coaching Ian Kesson then Alwyn Warren with Mat Carson arriving in 1981.

Jim Hermiston was coach in 1988 but resigned and Fred Robbins took over

As a result of Ipswich United's success individual player awards were achieved so the club was able to attract players. However, in 1988 the club was relegated after Mat Carson had left the club in 1987.

MOUNT GRAVATT ARE THE CUP FAVOURITES

Mount Gravatt are hot favourites to beat Ipswich United in the Ampol Cup final at Perry Park this Sunday.

That's if the opinions of the other 10 Premier League coaches not involved in the match are any indication.

Seven of the coaches believe the Hawks will win the Ampol trophy for the first time in their history. Three tip Ipswich.

And most agree there will be plenty of goals to entertain the spectators. The coaches were unanimous in tipping a tough, hard fought final.

Generally Mount Gravatt got the nod because the other coaches considered them the most consistent side this season. Many cited the experience in the Hawks line-up and named players like captain-coach Eric Thompson, striker Gary Bohan and midfielder

Craig Dickson as Mount Gravatt's match winners.

But throughout, the coaches who tipped the Hawks believed they were the best all-round side.

The three coaches who went for Ipswich United made their tips on the basis that, on their day, the club could produce brilliant football. They said their midfield was as good as any in the competition and had just as much experience as any other side.

It will be interesting to see which coaches are correct, but one thing that is for certain, the ingredients are there for one of the best, most exciting, hard fought finals in years.

Here's what each of the other 10 Premier League coaches thoughts

BOB BUTCHARD (Acacia Ridge) — **MOUNT GRAVATT**: "They are the most consistent all-round side in the league. They are particularly strong in the air and have experienced players who are still enthusiastic. They should take out everything this year. I think the final will see goals with a score of say 3-2 to Mount Gravatt".

RODDY MCKENZIE (Brisbane City) — **MOUNT GRAVATT**: "It will be a hard even match but Mount Gravatt are a much better put together side — workman like and well balanced. They don't give anything away even when they are struggling. I can see Mount Gravatt getting a lead and holding on to it. Maybe a 2-1 win."

SYD TUCKER (Easts) — **MOUNT GRAVATT**: "Mount Gravatt has more striking power. They take their chances better. Gary Bohan and Craig Dickson are the dangers while Eric Thompson is playing very well. I think they will win by the odd goal."

JIM BAYLISH (Grange Thistle) — **IPSWICH**: "The Ipswich midfield is slightly better and that will give them a winning edge. I think their forwards and defence are on a par but by controlling the centre of the park I think United will win."

IAIN KESSON (Lions) — **MOUNT GRAVATT**: "On consistency I have to go for Mount Gravatt. Ipswich could win if they played above themselves — and they can do it. For on their day Ipswich have a lot of flair. But Mount Gravatt are a grinding side that just keeps on going. And when you make a mistake, they nail you."

PETER DONOVAN for George Potter who was away (North Star) — **MOUNT GRAVATT**: "They are the stronger team. Ipswich have the names but some haven't fired this season. Without Ken Gordon I think they would be lost and I think Mount Gravatt can account for him."

COL THARENOU (Olympic) — **MT. GRAVATT**: "My heart says Ipswich but my head says Mount Gravatt. I would like to see Ipswich win but I think the Mount Gravatt side is just too good allround."

GEORGE STECKIW (Sunnyside) — **IPSWICH**: "They can play a lot smarter soccer than Mount Gravatt. They are much more technical and that will give them an edge."

TREVOR DAVIS (Taringa) — **MOUNT GRAVATT**: "The Mount Gravatt team is a combination of all the qualities needed to win a Cup Final. They have speed, skill and aggression. I think it will be a tight, low-scoring match—possible 2-1 to Mount Gravatt."

JOE BELLA (Valley Trident) — **IPSWICH**: "They are a more experienced side and better balanced. Both have strong defences so I can't see too many goals being scored. But Ipswich have the finishing power and they could win by one goal."

IPSWICH United won the State Ampol Cup Soccer Grand Final at Perry Park yesterday by convincingly defeating Mt Gravatt 2-0.

Ipswich United, after absorbing the early Mt Gravatt pressure scored late in the first half and completely dominated the second half to run out easy winners.

Mt Gravatt, who offered so much early were worn down by the persistent Ipswich effort and if Mt Gravatt's teenage goalkeeper Stewart Woodruffe had not been in such good form the Ipswich winning margin could easily have been doubled.

Ipswich started off very nervously and this was evidenced by the early poor passing of the usually reliable Kev Coleman and Ian Lawrie.

While Mt Gravatt looked the better side early, young Ipswich fullback Dave Perrett was one of the best on the ground with a fine defensive display and he also found time to assist in attacking moves.

Mt Gravatt, after making several promising raids which the Ipswich defence scrambled away tested the Ipswich keeper John Bennett with a dipping drive from 30m by Archie Fraser which Bennett did well to save.

A fine sweeping move by Mt Gravatt from deep in their own half to the right opened the Ipswich United defence up. Midfielder Cameron Bell cracked a fine ground shot from 20m only to be denied a goal by the upright.

This was in the 26th minute of the game and this near miss stung Ipswich into action.

From this point on the Ipswich attack opened out and the \$4000 winner's cheque was never really in doubt.

Ipswich swept downfield immediately and forced a corner which let Alan Marszalek head past Woodruffe, but Chris Corcoran cleared off the goal line for another corner.

This time Wayne Warren won the ball and nodded to Marszalek who cracked a good left foot drive which

somehow Woodruffe saved with his legs.

Another corner also let Warren create for Ken Gordon, but his header went straight to Woodruffe.

Seven minutes from half time Ipswich broke the deadlock with a strong goal by hard running striker Ron Millman.

Billy Dann and Perrett played short from a throw in on the right flank and Perrett's early long cross gave Millman the chance and he placed his header wide of Woodruffe.

Ipswich United completely dominated the second half and Bennett was not tested. Ipswich United did not concede a corner.

Mt Gravatt's much vaunted attacking trio of Gary Bohan, Steve McNally and Craig Dickson were not allowed into the game by the quick tackling, solid Ipswich defence.

IPSWICH ARE CLUB CHAMPIONS

Ipswich United is the champion club of Queensland after staging a last round rally to snatch the inaugural title off Mount Gravatt.

The club championship was decided on the aggregate points totals of a club's Premier League, Premier Reserves and Premier Colts sides.

As winners, Ipswich United will collect \$1000 voucher towards next year's team insurance from Insurance Exchange of Australia Pty. Ltd. plus a set of 15 jerseys in club colours from Attack Sports Pty. Ltd.

Ipswich finished the year with 74 points over the three grades, two more points than Mount Gravatt and well ahead of Acacia Ridge (63 pts) and Grange Thistle (57 pts.)

But it was in the final round when Ipswich United took six points from Easts to Mount Gravatt's lone point at O'Callaghan Park that secured the title for the Ebbw Vale club. Ipswich United also won the Golden Circle

trophy as the best performed team in the second round while Mount Gravatt took the President's trophy for first round leaders.

UNITED SMASH CHAMPS

IPSWICH United striker Peter Vogler scored a second half hat-trick as United defeated New Caledonian club champions Le Frigate 8-1 at the Noumea International soccer stadium yesterday.

Vogler's pace and power in the second half were too much for the local side in very humid conditions.

A crowd of more than 6000 inside the stadium and at least 700 spectators outside the fences watched Ipswich United produce a fine display of attacking soccer.

Coach Matt Carson left captain Wayne Warren, midfielder Murray Kitching, defender Billy Dann and striker Vogler out of the starting team which defeated the New Caledonian national side 2-0 on Friday.

United goalkeeper Rod Mackenzie was also left out after he tore his ankle ligament in a bad fall before the game.

Into the team came goalkeeper Craig Reimers, defenders Glen Gibb and Neville O'Sullivan, midfielder Richard Barnard and striker Ken Gordon with long serving United player Randall McKeand named as captain.

Ipswich United did not have things their own way early in the match as the enthusiastic Le Frigate team displayed make two well timed defensive clearances that shamed the Ipswich United upstarts and conceded corners.

Le Frigate winger Theo Kanouli opened the scoring in the 11th minute.

Dynamic Ipswich United midfielder Bruce Penman, who had another strong match, equalised for Ipswich United midway through the first half by scoring a well deserved goal.

Ten minutes later full back Ian Lawrie made it 2-1 when he placed a left foot drive into the far corner of the goal after his 20m free kick rebounded from the defensive wall.

Ken Gordon chipped the ball past the Le Frigate goalkeeper for the third goal just prior to half time after Penman opened up the defence with a precise early pass.

Warren, Murray Kitching, Vogler and Billy Dann came on as second half replacements for Barnard, McKeand, Brett Kitching and Lawrie getting back onto the field in the last five minutes as a substitute.

Russell Beckwith made it 4-1 early in the second half with a brilliant left foot drive from 20m out after Vogler created the opening.

Vogler then scored his first two goals of his hat-trick.

The first was a strong volley from 15m which brought solid applause from the knowledgeable local crowd. The second came from a Murray Kitching intercept pass.

Neville O'Sullivan and Vogler set up Gordon for a tap in for the seventh goal before Vogler completed the rout after a good interchanging with Gordon five minutes from full time.
