

James Lindsay (1826-1889) and Robert Lindsay

James Lindsay (Senior) was born in Cockpin Bonnyrigg Scotland in 1825

The Braeside mine was opened in 1883 by sons James and Robert

The Lindsay Brothers formed Booval Enterprises F C

Lindsay Street, Bundamba is named after them

James sons were John, James, Robert and William

James and Robert were born in Musselburgh, Edinburgh, Scotland, and came to Ipswich on the "Indus" in 1872.

James and William were in the original Bundamba Rovers team that played the first ever match in Ipswich and in the 1891 Blackstone Rovers Premiership team

James was captain of Bundamba Rangers but died in 1898

William was also in the Blackstone Rovers (1891) and Bush Rats (1894/1895

Premiership teams He also played for Whitwood.

James and William represented Ipswich and James was Chairman of Delegates of the British Football Association

William Ford Lindsay son William was in the 1913 and 1922 Rangers Premiership team he also played for Ipswich City and St Helens and represented Ipswich

Son James who was a WW1 veteran played for St Helens, Dinmore Bush Rats and represented Ipswich

He was also Vice President of Bundamba Rangers in 1937

James son Ray played for St Helens
