AT A Special Meeting of the Committees of Redbank-Dinmore and St. Helens last Wednesday week, it was decided that subject to Federation approval, that the two would amalgamate to form a new club to be known as St. Helens United.

This move, following upon the amalgamation two years ago of Blackstone Rovers and Bundamba Rangers to form Coulters would leave Ipswich with only two teams.

The secretary of the proposed new club, Mr. E. J. Wainman, told Soccer News that he thought that this was the best thing that has happened to Ipswich soccer for years. 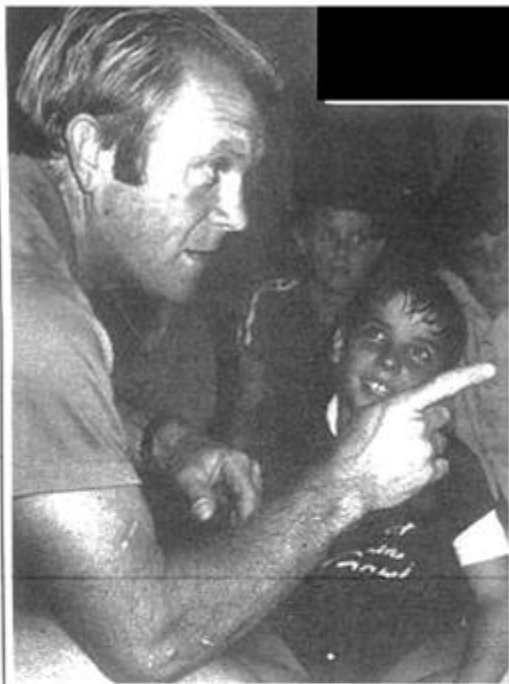

EBBW VALE RECREATION GROUND.

Some months ago the Ebbw Vale Progress Association proposed to the Moreton Shire Council that steps be taken to acquire the present recreation ground on the southern side of the railway station, for public purposes. Negotiations were at once entered into by the council, with the owners (Messrs Stafford Bros), who, through Mr. W. B. Darker, stated their terms. These have been accepted by the council, and it is expected that the necessary formalities will shortly be complied with, and the reserve formally accepted by the council on behalf of the people of that district. Speaking at the bridge-opening function at Ebbw Vale last Saturday afternoon, the chairman of the council (Mr. H. L. Jones) stated he wanted to see soccer posts and nets, a good turf wicket, tennis courts and even a bowling green on the ground. This would entail financial obligations on those interested in the ground, and it would mean more work for the progress association. He wanted everyone to do their bit in connection with the matter, and he could assure them if they did so, the council would do what it could, because that body recognised that it was an ideal spot for a recreation ground. "We want to make the place a thing of beauty and a joy to posterity" he added.
