A big effort is being put forward locally, to get the "soccer" football on the some strong footing in the Bundamba area as it was previously for many years in that district. Shades of Dinmore Bush Rats, Blackstone Rovers, and Bundamba Rangers! Where are the boys of those "soccer" contingents playing under the rules governed by the British Association Football? Shades of W. J. Lynch and John Potts (Dinmore), the genial "Ted" Morgan (Ipswich), "Jack" Gordon (Bundamba), and "Tom" Barker (the old horse), and Owen Jones (of Blackstone) been formed, and its prospects are also good.

## 1920-1942

In the twenties there were only four grades of soccer apart from school teams.

They were Junior Minor(Under 18) Junior(no age limit) Second and First division

The nineteen twenties will see Dinmore Bush Rats again the most successful club with ten trophies but by the end of the decade would be in decline and would not field a team in 1930

Their last premiership for twenty five years was in 1925.

That team had five players in the Queensland team

Bundamba Rangers won its first Brisbane Challenge Cup in 1922 led by the first Australian Captain Alec Gibb.

Alec Gibb will captain Australian on a tour of New Zealand with Clarrie Shenton Internationals Cliff Gedge and Mosie Burton are also in the 1923 team

In the twenties there was a Railway Workshops interworks competition involving eight teams

One mode of transport to games was by McKeen rail car special used to transport teams

In 1926 the Blackstone Rovers team won the Brisbane and Ipswich competition and the Tristram Shield and was arguably won of the best sides Ipswich produced with players including Internationals Les Halls and Jack(Toddy) Edwards along with Queensland representatives Roy Woolley, Jack Williams and James Clarkson

Bundamba Rangers would win in 1927 and 1928 with International William(Sally) Oliver captain and Russ Buchanan in the team.

In 1928 the first raid on Ipswich players commenced with Norman Park signing International Les Halls from Blackstone Rovers, James Henderson and James Kenny from St Helens and Queensland Representative Col Warrell from Dinmore Bush Rats

They would however return to Ipswich within a couple of months

By 1929 the Brisbane and Ipswich Federations were in dispute and would go separate ways for the 1930 competition

The dispute arose over a suspension until a 20 pound fine is paid was imposed on Dinmore Bush Rats, Bundamba Rangers and St Helens for forfeiting the semi finals

The games were all to be played at Woolloongabba with all proceeds going to Brisbane Clubs

The thirties was a success for Bundamba Rangers winning in 1931, 1936, 1937, 1938, 1939

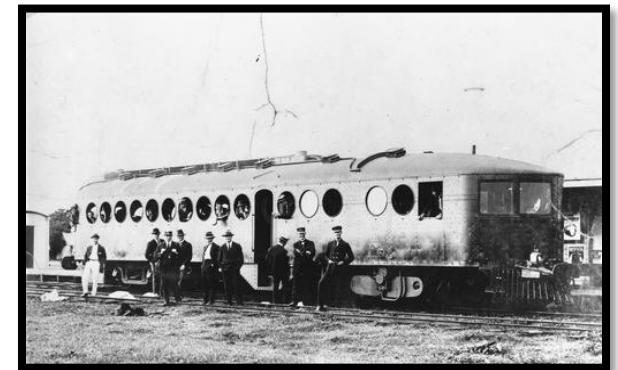
These sides included Internationals Redvers(Fat) Kitching, Mervyn Shanks, Dan Roderick, Lex Gibb and Richard James.

Three of these were in the combined competition which recommenced in 1937.

Blackstone Rovers would win their first premiership in fifteen years 1941 led by future Australian captain and

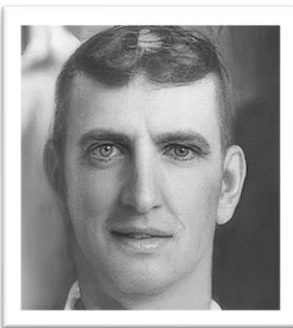

## Robert (Bob) Lawrie (1920-1989)

Robert represented Australia forty three times

Robert was selected in 1939 against Palestine at Right Half He was playing Played for Blackstone Rovers when selected

He represented Matches for Australia as follows

1941 (Chinese XI)

1949 (Hadjuk Split. Yugoslavia)

1950 (South Africa) gruelling 19 match, 86 day tour

1951 (England )

1953 (Chinese XI)

Bob captained Australia 27 times and was Australian team manager in 1959

Bob served in the RAAF in WW2 and spent time in England playing five games with London club Brentford.

Robert was offered a trail with Tottenham Hotspur but declined

After the war in 1946 he played with Whyalla and 1947 in Sydney with Leichhardt-Annandale. before going back to South Australia playing for Sturt in 1948

He returned to Ipswich in 1949 as Captain Coach of Bundamba Rangers

### Career

Robert started out as a right winger before becoming a half back and played only one season as a junior before making his senior debut

Selected for Ipswich, Qld, Australia in his first year in Senior football and awarded “Colts Blue of the Year in 1939”

Represented Qld 22 times and coached the team in 1954 Represented Ipswich 17 times

Played for Qld in every year from 1939 - 1955 when available

Captain of the 1941 Blackstone Premiership team at 21 years of age

Selected for South Australia in 1946 and New South Wales in 1947

Member of the 1949/1954 Bundamba Rangers Tristram Shield winners and the 1955 and 1957 Bundamba Rangers Premiers

Telegraph Colt of the Year 1939

Telegraph Sportsman of the Year in 1950

Coached Bulimba Rangers in 1952

(Bundamba Rangers did not make an offer to retain Bob as the club did not want to set a precedent as no player had ever been paid)

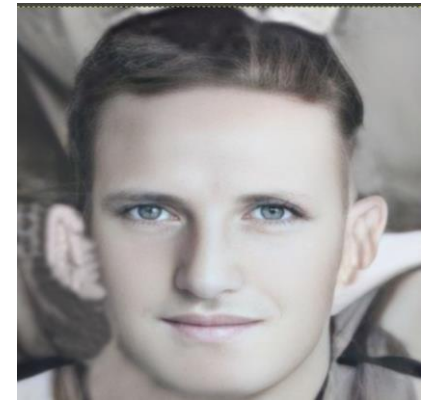
Leading goalscorer in the 1957 Premiership

## Alec Gibb (1888-1976)

### Alec represented Australia fourteen times

Alec Gibb was Captain of first 1922 Australian team that toured New Zealand

Born in Ireland, moved to Scotland, Alec migrated to Australia in 1911

He played with Bundamba Athletics in 1912 winning a premiership and then Bundamba Rangers

In 1914 he played for Dinmore Bush Rats and in 1916 for St Helens and in 1925 Ipswich City.

Alec played Right half and was captain of the 1922 Bundamba Rangers Premiership team

In 1923 he became Captain/Coach of South Brisbane Scottish

From 1913 to 1924 (with the exception of the war years) he played in every Ipswich and

Queensland team and played 16 times for Ipswich and 21 times for Queensland

In the 1922 series in New Zealand Alex was captain and again against New Zealand in Australia

Alec won two medals presented for the best Australian player in both series.

- In a report of a match in New Zealand

*Age (Melbourne, Vic. : 1854 - 1954), Monday 26 June 1922 (10)*

*About 15,000 people attended the soccer game between Australia and New Zealand.*

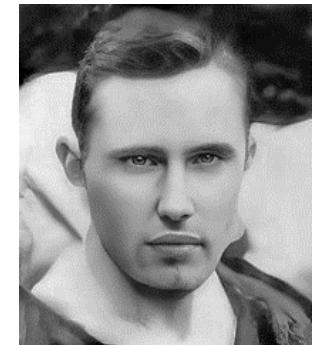
*It ended in a draw 1 goal each. The match was "willing" and no fewer than five men were temporarily knocked out*

In 1970 Alec at the age of 82 attended the Qld Auckland match in Brisbane and donated a Trophy for the Best and Fairest Auckland player to reciprocate his 1922 Medal

Alec was offered the captaincy of the Australian team against the Chinese XI in 1923 but could not accept for business reasons



1922



Alec continued his association with the game, when he retired as an Ipswich, Queensland and Australian selector and was also President of the local Association from 1926 until 1940.

Alec was on the Queensland Football Association Executive and was Patron of the Ipswich and West Moreton Junior Committee and also wrote for the Queensland times

During the war years Alec was President of the Ipswich Soccer Patriotic organisation that raised funds for the war effort

Alec played centre forward for Bundamba Rangers (old boys) against Latrobe at the age of 59 in 1947

Alec was the first of five from the Gibb family to represent for either Ipswich, Qld or Australia.

The others were Alf, Allan, Lex and Lex (Buddy).

Alec worked for 25 years at Cribb and Foote before retiring in 1954

In retirement Alec played bowls and became secretary of Booval Bowls Club

In 2020 the Gibb-Masters Cup was named for matches between Qld and NSW

\* Alec was inducted in to the Soccer Hall of Fame in 2000

## Clarence Shenton (1901-1934)

### Clarrie represented Australia eleven times

Clarrie was selected in first Australian team to New Zealand in 1922

Born in Nambour he lived in Ebbw Vale Ipswich and was a natural sportsman

Clarrie played for Ipswich Grammar and was selected in the Ipswich Shoolboy team in 1914

H played for Bundamba after leaving school before moving to Wynnum in 1918 with his father who was a Methodist priest

He played a season of Rugby with the Gordon Club in 1919 and a season of Australian Rules as Wynnum did not have a soccer Club

When Wynnum Soccer Club was formed in 1921 he joined and he made such an impression at Wynnum in their inaugural season that he was selected in the first ever Australian side to tour New Zealand at centre half. He turned 21 on the tour

Clarrie represented Queensland seven times from 1922-1924

He played for Wynnum from 1921-1924 and Thisle in 1925 (Vice Captain)

His football career was short-lived and he settled with tennis as his sport of choice where he became President of the Ipswich Tennis Association and the clubhouse was named in his honour (Shenton House)

Clarrie was a partner in Walker and Shenton who were Stationers and Sports goods retailers

He was a member of the Ipswich Rotary Club and President of the Ipswich Grammar Old Boys Association, and a trustee of the Ellenborough Street Methodist Church

He was also the Patron of several cricket clubs

Sadly Clarrie died in 1934 at the age 34. A life lost too early

His brother Maurice who played for Bundamba Rangers died in 1940 age 36

Both proceeded their father William who died in 1944

## Jack (Toddy) Edwards (1900-1981)

Toddy represented Australia three times

Toddy Edwards was selected in 1924 against Canada in Australia at Outside Right. (Green and Gold worn for the first time)

He was subsequently advised another player would play, but eventually played after an uproar and the team refusing to play.

Toddy was playing for Blackstone Rovers when selected

*Before the big match started it was reported that the Australian players took decided objection to Edwards being dropped for Mitchell.*

*They adopted their attitude on the principle that once a player was selected he should play. It was stated that the team would not go on without Edwards*

*and the officials were at once confronted with a delicate situation. Conferences took place, and it was finally resolved by the Australian executive, by nine votes to two, that Edwards should play. The news of the dispute caused something of a sensation and was the cause of free and outspoken comment. The Press were informed that Edwards refused to stand down in favour of Mitchell. The voting shows that this action was officially endorsed'*

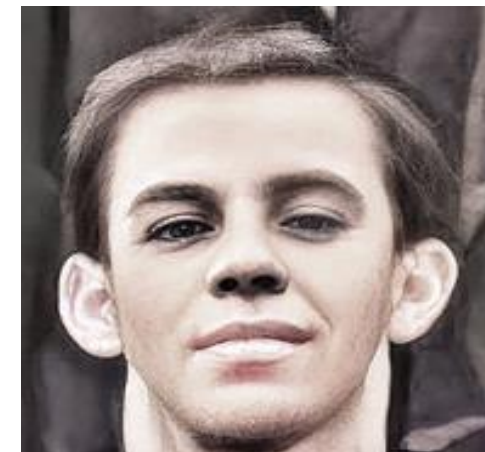
