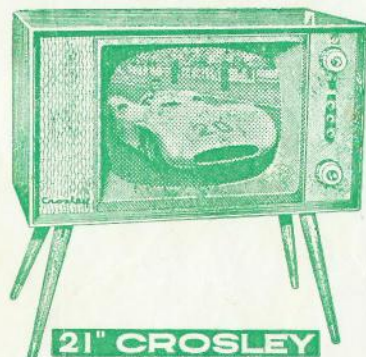

(Goalkeeper)

Having a safe line of defence is an asset to any side, and that is where Gordon comes in. Strongly built, he has a keen eye and a spring like a cat for the high balls.

Six feet two inches tall, Gordon will never play for Scotland. He was born in Farnham, Surrey, during his father's service with the Gordon Highlanders. The family came back to Scotland when he was three weeks old. He went to Tynecastle School, next door to Hearts' stadium at Tynecastle Park.

This season he was chosen for the Scotland Under 23 team, but had to be dropped when it was realised he had been born in England.

BOBBY KIRK (Full back)

"You can depend on Bobby Kirk arriving on the goal-line to cover up the crucial moment," a Hearts follower said of him to a friend. How true! Bobby has a cool head when danger is around. An Arniston lad, Bobby started his senior career with Dunfermline Athletic and thereafter moved across Fife to Kircaldy, where he suited Raith Rovers netter. Three years ago he crossed the Forth

JOHN LOUGH (Full back)

A young lad who has only made his niche in the first team since the advent of 1959. He is steady, reliable, cool.

GEORGE THOMSON (Half back)

George, who belongs to Edinburgh, came to the fore last season with a convincing record in a tournament in which every game was more or less a cup-tie. He has a sure defensive approach for the job. He was playing for Edinburgh City in Coronation year when Hearts were attracted to him. George was originally a left half, but the consistency of John Cumming denied him a place in this position. He played for Scotland Under 23 team in the left back position. Switched to right half when Hearts transferred captain David Mackay to Spurs for £A37,500; now Hearts fans say Thomson is even better than Mackay.

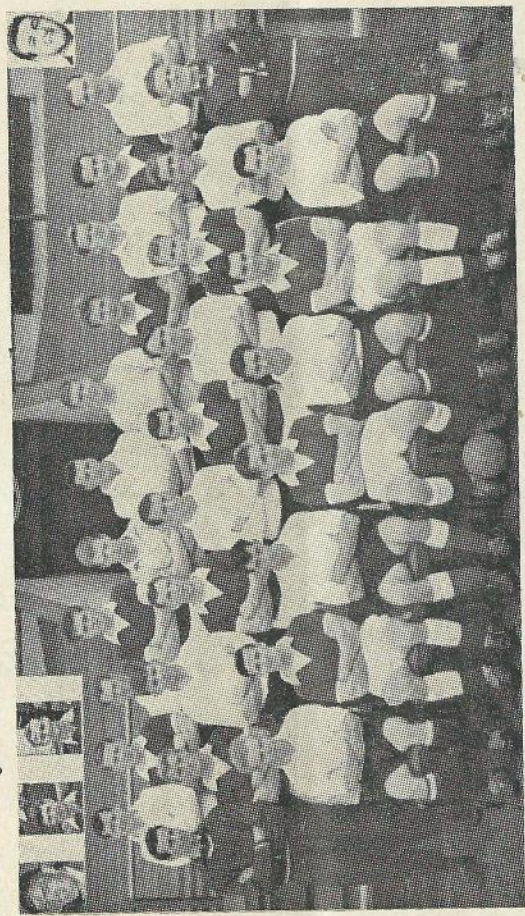

BILLY HIGGINS (Half back)

Billy was committed to Rangers before he went to Tynecastle. The Ibrox side signed Billy, on a provisional form, while he was playing with Dalkeith Thistle early in season 1956-57. Billy made a request for his registration to be cancelled so that he could concentrate on his studies in Edinburgh. Manager Scott Simon obliged, and not long afterwards Billy signed for Hearts.

JIMMY MILNE (Half back)

Learnt his football in his native Arbroath, where he was told that football history began many years ago. Following a spell with the juveniles, Jimmy joined Brechin Victoria before he went to Gayfield Park with a senior ticket. But Jimmy did not fancy "B" Division football and he was given a free transfer in 1950. Watched by Hearts, Jimmy was signed, and last year was his most notable since he pulled a maroon jersey over his head. After Freddy Glidden was injured early in the new year, Jimmy played against Raith Rovers at Stark's Park in a vital league fixture and never lost his place until the close of the season. A workmanlike player and a strong defender who can stake a claim in preserving that low-scoring record against the side last season.

JIM FOTHERINGHAM (Centre half)

Hearts latest recruit. Signed from Arsenal for £6,000. Jim was reserve centre half for several Scottish representative teams. Twenty-five years old, Jim is expected to get a Scottish cap by the end of next season.

JOHN CUMMING (Half back)

As game a half back as ever stepped in to Tynecastle, whose play in Canada last season was a revelation to the "Exiles" who watched him. John came to Hearts in 1950 from Carlisle Rovers. His development was quick, and four years later he was "capped"

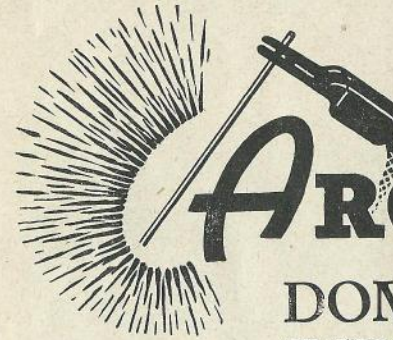

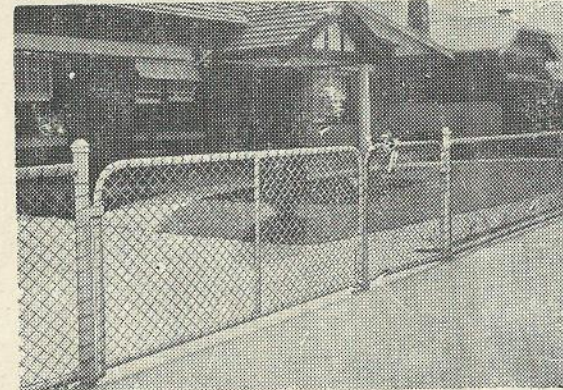

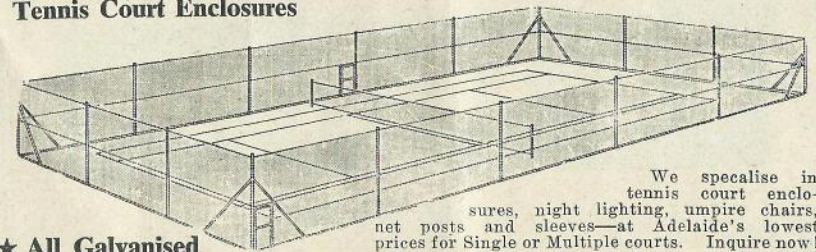

As soon as Bobby Blackwood was able to change from a khaki suit into a civvy suit after his National Service in Malaya, shortly after the Hearts started their training last season, he signified his intention of becoming a full-time player. Bobby had been playing top football out East and trainer Johnny Harvey soon got to work in making him tick over into a fast winger. He got down to ball control and when opportunity knocked at his door, he found himself with a regular place in the League side.

JIM MURRAY (Forward)

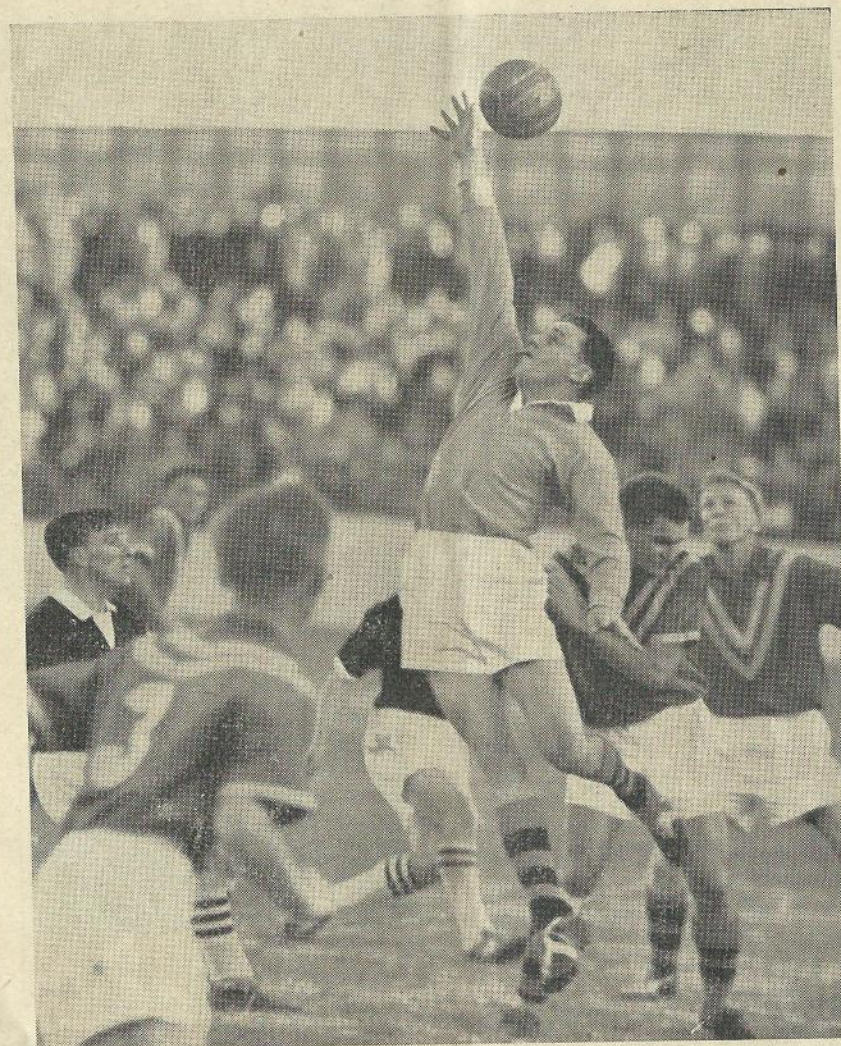

He is a good looking chap with tremendous enthusiasm for the Hearts. A strong shot and a beautiful header of the ball as his scoring record showed last season. As a schoolboy he represented Scotland against England.

WILLIE BAULD

Born in Edinburgh, Willie served juniordom with Musselburgh Athletic and Newtongrange Star before taking the Tynecastle ticket. With Alfie Con and Jimmy Wardhaugh as the inside men, this trio was recognised as Scotland's greatest inside trio. His brain conceives many movements that bear the stamp of class and he has played for Scotland on eleven occasions.

JIMMY WARDHAUGH

(Forward)

Not only does Jimmy Wardhaugh play football well, but he writes intelligently on the game also. When Davie Mackay was off for a spell injured last season, Jimmy acted as skipper and the team never lost a game. In fact in the last game of the season he got the all-important winning goal against Rangers; and what a goal! On any kind of ground he can hold the ball beautifully and his timing is perfect; he has all the secrets on smooth ball play. No Hearts player has ever scored more goals than he has in a season and it looks like being a record which will stand the test of time for many a long day (37 goals in League and Cup). His goal-scoring feats are an inspiration to his clubmates. He gained International honours with the A.T.C. for Britain in the Youth International series at Geneva in 1946 and in the same year signed for Hearts. He has played 14 times for Scotland, is married and has three children.

JOHN (IAN) CRAWFORD (Forward)

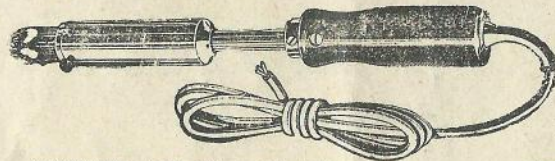

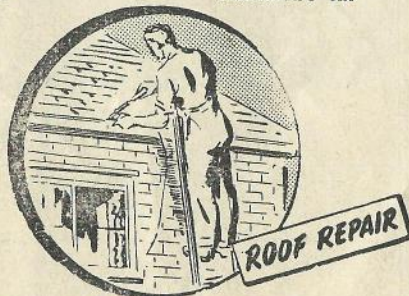

**Meet TOMMY WALKER—
the "Ace of Hearts"**

Tommy Walker, Secretary-Manager of Hearts of Midlothian—the man whom a generation of Scotsmen idolised as the perfect player.

This is no exaggeration, I am not speaking from hearsay. I belong to the generation who saw him play for Hearts and Scotland.

self up with a quite smile on his face and play on in the only manner he knew how—CLEANLY, and with every fibre of his being.

That is Tommy Walker, the soccer player and sportsman, the man who as a callow youth in his first international against England at Wembley was entrusted to take the penalty kick which would ensure victory for his country—need I say that the ball entered the back of the net like a rocket. That trust that the veteran Scots captain had in this young man was the same as the War Office had, when in 1944 (Tommy had by this time attained the rank of captain) he was asked to go to India and form a soccer team from the men in the Indian units with himself as player-coach-manager and tour all the units in the Middle and Far East. What a great morale booster this proved to be for the soccer-starved men of the "Forgotten Battalions".

After the war Tommy played for Chelsea for two years before being appointed Assistant Manager of Hearts on January 1, 1949 (the day after Hogmanay!). He became Manager in 1951.

That then is Tommy Walker—sportsman par excellence. Today you will watch him team; I'm sure you will see the Walker brand stamped all over it.

South Australia extends them a warm welcome.

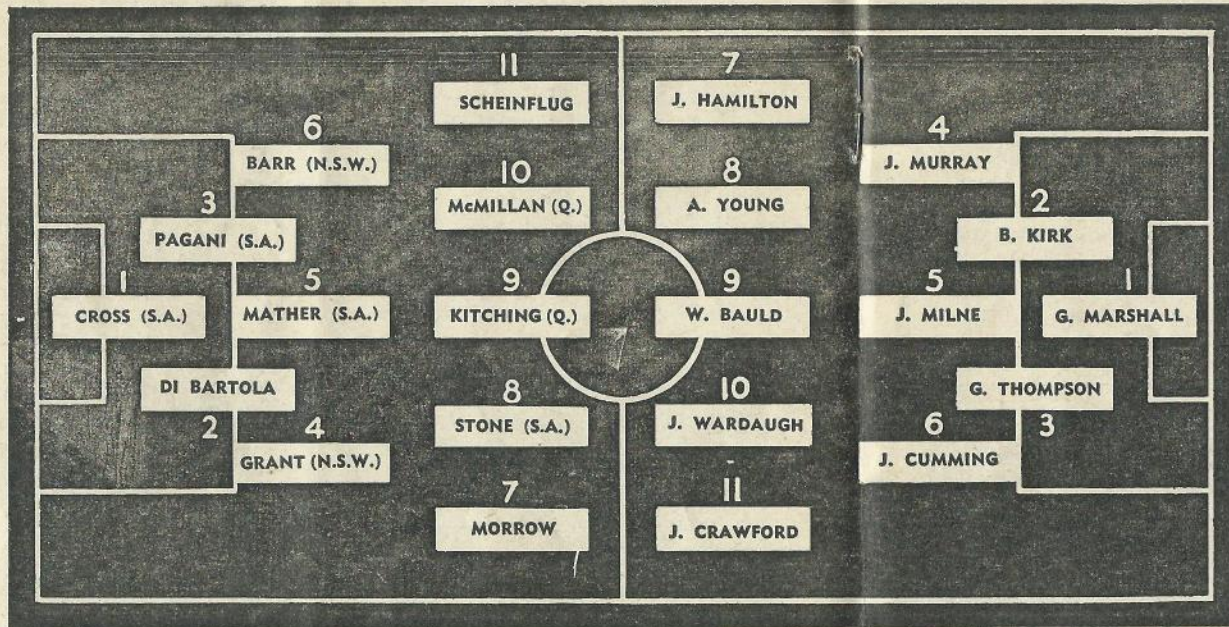

Hearts 13 v. Manitoba 2.

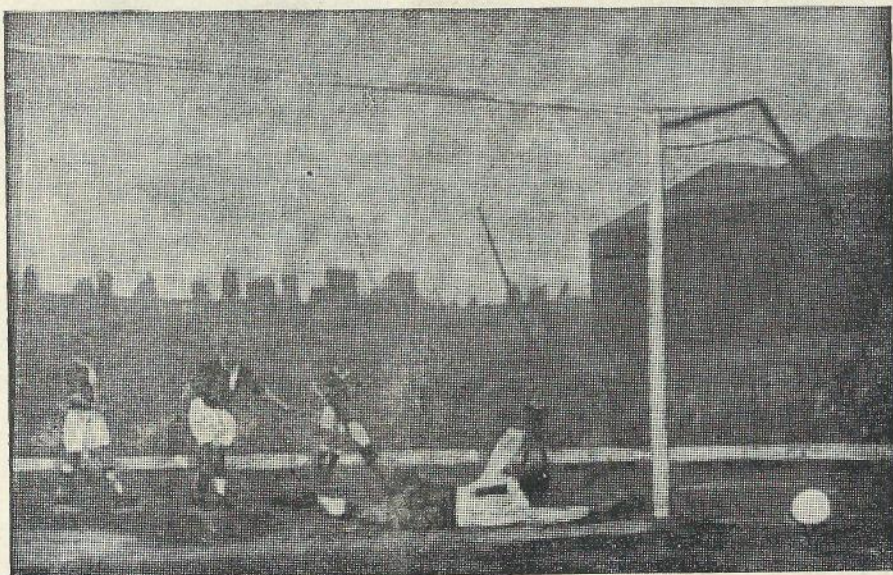
Hearts 4 v. British Columbia 1.

Comparisons in soccer results are seldom a true reflection of standards, but as both the Australian and Canadian Soccer Associations were formed in the early 1920's, we may have a yardstick here to measure our progress as compared to Canada's. In the five matches against the State teams so far played in Australia, Hearts have scored 29 goals for with 6 against, giving a goal average of 4.8 as against the 9.2 in Canada. If those figures mean anything, then Australia would appear to be forging ahead. It would be interesting if a test could be arranged between the two countries.

E. GROSS, Budapest goalkeeper, will be playing in his first representative game, but has always given the impression that the bigger the occasion the better he plays. Gross is very agile and has been outstanding in S.A. for the past two years.

C. DI BARTOLO and **F. PAGANI** should blend well together as both play for Juventus and have been the S.A. State team's full backs for the past two years.

K. GRANT has been prominent with the West Wallsend Club in N.S.W. for several years and is recognised as one of the best wing halves in the Newcastle area.

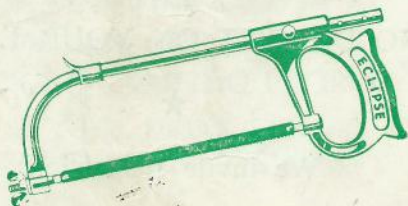
