

Booval Stars

Booval Stars formed in 1894 founded by David Newlands who was born in Lithgow Scotland in 1861

Booval Stars played near St Johns church Booval and later on Gedge's Paddock near Dudlieigh st. amd then Alexanders st and on a ground now Booval Fair Shopping Centre and at "Stafford Estate. Stafford's Estate was on the land of the late William Stafford of the Ipswich and West Moreton British Football Association the current Stafford Rd, Booval, though also near Booval Station on Brisbane Rd, The club later bought 4 hectares in Cole st Booval for their ground in 1930 the first game being played in April 1931

They were Junior Premiers in 1902/1906/1909 Junior minor premiers in 1901/1909. and Brooks Shield winners in 1907/08/09 The club folded during the first World War by reappeared in 1920 only to fold gain until 1928

Booval Stars won the 1935 Ipswich and West Moreton Premiership/Special Competition and the 1936 Challenge Cup and 1938 Tristram Shield. The club folded again during the second world war in 1942.

In 1945 the council wanted to sell the grounds to recover unpaid rent. A Benefactor paid the debt and the club reappeared in 1946 only to be relegated.

In 1950 Booval Swifts bought the Cole St ground. The club reverted to a Junior club and played on the Bundamba Rangers ground and became a Senior club again again in 1956 and again in 1970 but folded in 1986.

In those years they played on the Blackstone and Dinmore Bush Rats grounds.

sixties and seventies, Reg was a Vice President of the Queensland State

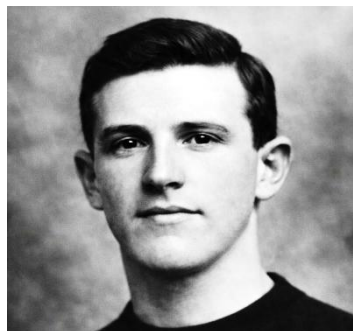
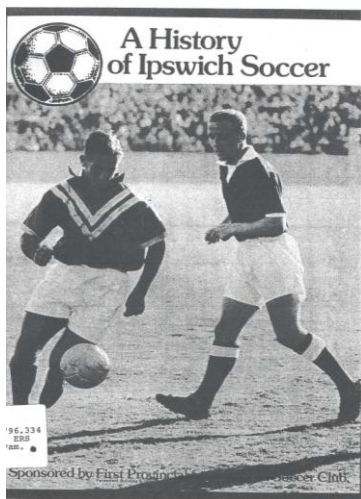

Extraordinary sports record of Mr F Elson

To gain international selection in one code of sport is a worthy enough achievement for anyone, but to reach international status in another, and to be offered first class posting in still another is indeed extraordinary. Such is the versatile record of Mr. Fred Elson, of Blackstone. He was selected as a Welsh Rugby Union forward in 1911, but was unable to line out at Cardiff with the side because his amateur standing had been upset by his playing professional Soccer. In 1910, Fred was a reserve for the Welsh Rugby Union side against Scotland. He was a Welsh international rink hockey centre-half, and a Soccer full-back. who may have risen to top flight ranking in the round ball game if his first love had not been for Union. Fred's club Union was played with Peny Craig, Rhondda Valley, where the colliers were tough and where cauliflower ears were the badges of the big men In the pack. With Fred in Peny Craig's forwards was Bob Jenkins, of Booval. Fred's playing weight in those days was about 139 stone. It was Soccer which claimed the versatile Welshman's attention first. He played full-back for Porth for seven years, and "Fatty" Wedlock, international Soccer star, offered him a game with Bristol. In 1910-11 he played rink hockey for Wales, football being played In the daytime and hockey at night. His club rink hockey team was Forth All Blues. When he came to Blackstone from Wales, Fred played Rugby League with the Blackstone Club and West Ends. In 1915 he was a member of the West End team, which won a premiership. After the final League game for the season he transferred to the Blackstone Soccer side, played the last few-games of the season with them, and saw them win their premiership, two premiership sides in different codes in one season

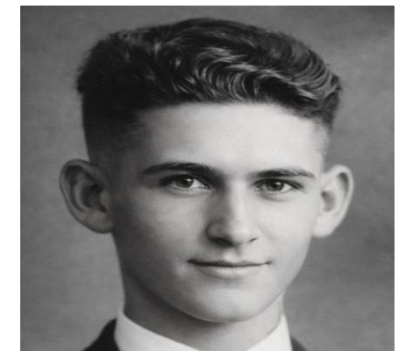

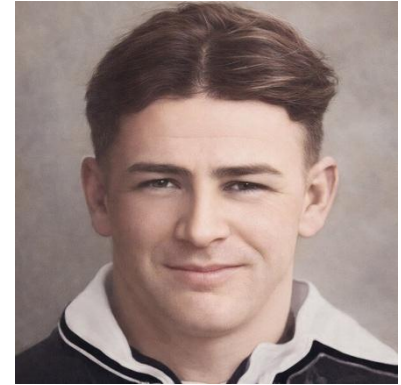

**James Donaldson has one of the most scarred right legs in Ipswich. Behind one of those scars is a story of perseverance in circumstances which, by ordinary standards, should have stopped him from playing Soccer, much less win international honours. When Jimmy was a boy he damaged a shin, and spent months having pieces of bone taken away in the Ipswich General Hospital.*

He wore a bandage and a special pad over his injured leg all the time he played Soccer. Jim pulled out of Soccer in 1946 when a piece of pit timber struck the already heavily scarred right leg. He went out of the game at his top.

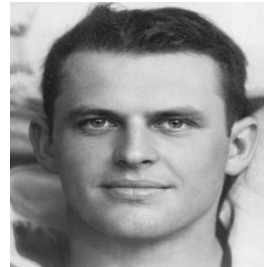
