## Fabulous Kitchings' well never runs dry

When there comes a beating for soccer last Sunday when a stopped Kitching's well never runs dry.

Many readers are familiar with the name of Kitching in connection with Queensland and Australian soccer, through the appearances over the past few years of Col. and Spencer, the footballing cousins now playing with Hellenic and Azzurri respectively.

However, considerably few realize the great part played by this family in Australian soccer through years gone by.

"I first came to Australia in 1927 and became associated with Queensland soccer in 1928, not throughout the intervening years. I cannot recall a time when there has not been a Kitching in a State team.

At least three of them have gained Australian selection in more than one occasion.

Tal. (P.P.C.) Kitching was the first to represent Australia, and of course Col. and his cousin Spencer have represented Australia on numerous occasions.

Although Col. (Hellenic) and Spencer (Azzurri) are now playing with Brisbane clubs, they still live and work in the Jewish area, where they learned their football.

At school and as leaders they learned their football.

Two generations of the Kitching family have been playing soccer in Queensland.

The understanding existing between them made them a most public and successful public.

Col. in particular was a great public man, and his name was a great asset to the soccer of his youth coming from a family of soccer players.

His name, like other football, was very young, and when he was a real power in the Bundamba team.

Double honors

He won a couple of years with a NSW club and gained State selection for NSW, equalling the record

of Bob Lennie and Chris Higgins both of whom represented two States.

Lennie played for South Australia and Higgins for NSW while all three played for Australia.

Spencer returned to the code and to Bundamba, but later joined Azzurri, when that team started its own football campaign, which took them into the country where they have remained ever since.

Col. played with Bundamba, St. Helens and Blackstone before joining Hellenic, when that club wanted to add to become such a power in Queensland soccer.

Last season, Col. was out of action for several weeks, and dropped back in the spring, but in the closing stages of the season, appeared to have completely regained his first form.

Yet another Kitching known to most of us is Graham, Hellenic's inside right.

One day he was in the line-up to rest advantageously a real peach-thrower.

I observed him some years ago in the best I have seen in my 20 years association with soccer in Brisbane and Australia.

There have been times when he has just simply not got on with his team's play.

His inactivity is the only thing that is holding him back from reaching his height.

"Fat's" feat

Redvers "Fat" Kitching is a generally known, skilled Australian selection at the time when NSW, particularly dominated such selections, and was fully worth his place.

"Fat" the most of the family, was an outside left.

The only actual defender I remember among the Kitching family was Jack, who played for Bundamba and Blackstone as a full back and a goalkeeper.

Between those days and now, we have had such well known Kitchings in our State soccer as Buller, a great forward of the leading team, who was a full back and a goalkeeper, and a real tall player, nicknamed "Tommy", and with him we had Doug Kitching.

Then there was Jack, a half back.

Although Graham has not reached the heights of his brother Col., he has gained in his own right a reputation in who showed great promise and while quite a young man he was chosen as center forward, for Ipswich against Brisbane.

He created a big impression with his efforts in the Brisbane, which kept him out of the game for some time.

On his return, he joined Merton Rovers for a short time, but returned to Brisbane and it was not until his last season that he appeared to fit into his team's play.

The family settled in Maryborough

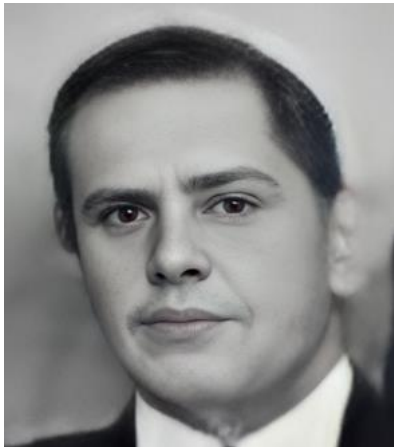

### Sports Gossip.

One of the early stalwarts of Queensland Soccer, Mr. J. Kitching is still to be found encouraging local talent in the West Moreton district. As a youngster "Old Joe," as he is known to Soccer fans, came to Maryborough from Rosewell, in Midlothian, Scotland. Later he became a member of the famous Howard Rovers, which kept footballer-immigrants in touch



with the game. In 1898 he moved to Bundamba, and played with the Rangers till the cessation of the game during the war. When the round ball code was resumed in 1919 he again played for Rangers, but later gave way to allow younger players to have their chance. He has two sons playing with Ipswich teams. One keeps goal for Rosebells, the present leader of the B senior, and the other plays for Blackstone Rovers, junior minor. His nephew, Jack Kitching, represented in the half back line against Brisbane last Monday.

## Joseph Jnr (1872-1932)

Joseph played for Howard Rovers from 1895-1897

Joseph Jnr played for Bundamba Rangers from 1898 and was captain.

He also played for Royals, Reliance and Blackstone Rovers and represented Ipswich six times from 1903-1912. Joe played until he was 49

He also played for Latrobe in 1940 and moved to Ayr as Captain/Coach in 1952

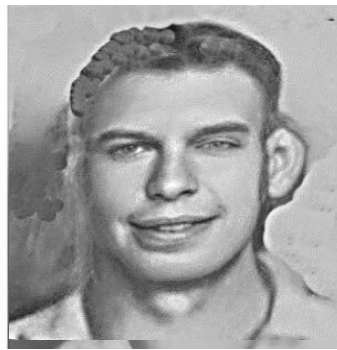
