David was born in Chevington, Suffolk, England and was a miner and a farmer and Rachel a midwife

They lived at 'Nunn's Paddock, Dinmore

They had eight sons Amos, George, Albert, Walter, David(Dick), Sydney, William, Arthur

The women seem to regard the football matches as occasions for homely gatherings, and every available log was lined with 'happy and smiling faces. It was likewise pleasing to again "rub shoulders" with those who have been stout defenders of the Bush Rats' laurels in many a hard-fought battle with metropolitan soccerites.


She leaves behind a numerous family, of whom all the sons are engaged in the coal-mining industry







Walter had two sons Howard, Frederick


Frederick and Howard played for Dinmore Bush Rats

Howard was in the 1923 Dinmore Bush Rats premiership team



Frederick had two sons play for Dinmore Bush Rats Thomas and Walter




and Victor played for Bundamba Rangers. represented Qld in 1933 and was a first division referee and a topline swimmer

Arnold played for Bundamba Rangers, Dinmore Bush Rats and St Helens


Victor's son was Gordon(Bunny) Gordon's grandfather was Jim Dobbie who played for Bundamba Rangers in 1895






