Match Report

Manchester, playing probably at half-pace, could have scored many more while Queensland certainly missed at least two "sitters." This was a good-natured encounter, made so by the intelligent attitude of both teams Manchester, very cleverly, refused to fight for every single ball as they would in a league match and thus gave the Queenslanders plenty of chances to get into the game.

This was most apparent in the midfield where Crerand and Stiles, two of the best tacklers in British soccer, played with obvious restraint, doing no more intercepting than absolutely necessary. Queensland, on the other hand, were determined to give the huge crowd value for their money and refused to retreat into a defensive formation. They often attacked and did so bravely, with up to seven players, fully understanding their role in this splendid exhibition game. They could have tightened their defence but they didn't bother; for this they deserve praise Manchester United seldom exerted themselves to get these goals - most came rather easily for them.

They were at their deadliest in their counter-attacks when either Aston or Best shot away on the wing, spreading the Queensland defence. In the Manchester defence the cool, steady young stopper, Sadler, stood out.

This versatile young fellow - equally at home at centre forward - showed what a modern stopper is like

. Both fullbacks are the modern, overlapping types; possessing extraordinary speed and steadiness, they often performed as wingers

. As we said earlier, Crerand and Stiles had little to do and were not really in their element

. During the entire 90 minutes the feared Stiles did not put in one of his legendary tackles, preferring to intercept the ball through intelligent positioning.

The star of the whole match can be found in the forward line; what George Best did was the pinnacle of football. His dazzling runs, cutting in and out past defenders were Matthews at his best; his shooting power was that of a young Garrincha. Short of putting him in iron shackles there was absolutely no way of stopping him. Charlton did not play his usual role as he seldom bothered to help out in defence.

If McMillan had been cooler, he could have scored two easy goals himself. and Dobinson should have given a penalty when Pattison was pulled back by the hand inside the box. (Minutes later the very sporting Bobby Charlton "equalised"; when Dobinson awarded a penalty against Queensland for hand-ball, he deliberately slammed the ball sky-high over the bar). Kelly made some spectacular saves and proved himself the equal of any goalkeeper in Sydney.

Of the fullbacks Catchpole stood out while midfield Hosie had the most useful game. McMillan was the pick of the forwards though Pattison and Monaghan also played well. Referee Dobinson goofed badly by not penalising Manchester in the Pattison case. Apart from that, he refereed a very clean match most competently.


