He was in the 1981 NSL Cup Final winners and won premierships with Brisbane Lions in the State League scoring in the 1987 final


John played twelve times for Qld and represented Ipswich and also coached Taringa Rovers, Coalstars and Ipswich

Andrew played for Dinmore Bush Rats, Brisbane Lions, Olympic and Coalstars


He scored the winning goal in the 1983(Olympic))1986 (Coalstars) Grand Final. Coalstars also won the Ampol Cup in 1986 and 1987



It is expected that Ian will get a chance to play for his State later this month when the touring Manchester United team will be in Australia.

QUEENSLAND Minister for Local Government, Mr. Ken Nixon, had more than one anxiety on his mind when he visited New Zealand recently.


