No "Soccer" Competitions.

At a special meeting of representatives of clubs in the Queensland British Football Association held on Wednesday, to give consideration to the prospects of the ensuing season, the following motion was: : carried: "That all competition matches in the senior, first and second grades, be abandoned for the season of 1916 ; that no player of military age be allowed to play in the lower grades; and that this be a recommendation for consideration at the annual meeting."

The secretary (Mr Ross) informed the meeting that he had been communicating with Mr. Gibb, the association's representative in England';: in regard to getting in touch with any , Queensland soccer players, who may be lying in any of the hospitals in England, . wounded or ill, and Mr. Gibb had agreed to do so, Mr. Ross, invited clubs to for-ward the names of any player who; may be in hospital in England, and he would forward them on to Mr. Gibb.

George Duck reminisces (76)

Regarding the "soccer" football, travelling quite recently in a railway carriage with that one time most consistent exponent of British Association football namely, George Duck, of Dinmore. he informed me that he thought that the most popular football pastime in the Bundamba areas regaining some of its former renown, and, referring to the recent struggle between 'T Rats and 'T Rovers (from Blackstone), he said that it was delightful to witness the game.

"The young fellows of both sides," said he, "played with great vim, and all gave splendid expositions of the "'soccer rules?'" Then he indulged in references to the Charity Cup and the Challenge Cup contests of the past., especially the fine struggles that generally took place between the Rosebanks (of Brisbane) and the Bush Rats.

The members of both the combinations named never neglected training, and, with the correct knowledge, either side possessed of the fine points of the "British" game more than ordinary skill had to be brought to bear to "keep on top." The Bush Rats, of the old New Chum Colliery vicinity, were demons for training, and in the early days of the game down that way it was equal to an evening's good entertainment to see "T Rats undergoing their training exercises on a square bare patch carved out of the thickly bushed country. Logs around were placed as seats for the women to talk, and, when there was no moonlight camp-fires were made. and everything went along as merrily as the proverbial marriage bells. The Blackstone Rovers and the Bundamba Rangers were likewise hard workers in training operations in their respective "theatres of war," which tacts accounted for the splendid displays of football when ever conclusions were tried "go the front."

Welcome Home

On Saturday evening last an enthusiastic welcome home was held in the Alliance Hall, under the auspices of the Dinmore Patriotic Committee.

The hall was crowded, and a most enjoyable time was spent with dancing, the music for which was supplied by Miss Gladys Dawes while Mr J. T Campbell acted as the Chairman (Mr. W. Anderson) stated that they had met for the purpose of according a hearty welcome home to Sapper H Abbott and Private F. Nunn, and to welcome their English brides. He was sure he was voicing the feelings of all present when he said that they were delighted to see their guests here again, and trusted that they would have a happy and prosperous future.

Mr. Anderson introduced Mr. D. A. Gledson, M.L.A., and requested him to make a presentation to the returned men. Mr. Gledson congratulated the men on their return, and extended a welcome to their wives. On behalf of the residents he presented each of the returnees with a gold medal, suitably inscribed. As that would be the last welcome home function, he offered his congratulations to the committee, on the excellent way they had carried out these gatherings. He also praised the Ladies' Comforts Club, and said that he was sure that the soldiers would never forget the splendid work which they had done for them. A report dealing with the operations of the Patriotic Committee during the term of the war was presented by Mr. Anderson. This stated, inter alia, that during the war period the committee had held four concerts, 19 socials, and one coin evening. The total income was approximately £ 153. The expenditure included the following items: Presentations, £79; honour board, £14/5/-; donation to Anzac cottage, £5; while the sum of £55 was absorbed in miscellaneous expenses.

The number of enlistments from the area was 41 and of these four had paid the supreme sacrifice; ten were wounded, four gassed; 16 returned uninjured; one remained in England; one, a native of Dinmore, enlisted in another district; two were rejected, and three enlisted just prior to the termination of the war. Presentations were made to 38 men prior to leaving, and 32 upon their return, making a total of 70 presentations. It was the intention of the committee to hand over the honour board to the custody and keeping of the public. The committee, with others, undertook the erection of an Anzac cottage for the widow of a local soldier.

The Chairman referred to the good work done by the Ladies' Comforts Club, and, on behalf of the committee, thanked them for their services. Dainty refreshments were served by the Ladies' Comforts Club.

A Burns sent past from a long way out, Corinthians secured a free and Tedman sent to Lugton, but he misjudged and Stewart sent to T. Hainsworth. who sent to E. Rumble, but Ormiston relieved an awkward situation, Nicholls received and, when in a good position sent past. Play went to the visitors end, and Rats were awarded a free, and Johnstone cleared from a dangerous position. T. Hainsworth was penalised for offside.

The visitors went to Rats end and Langton and Craig passed to each other, and Craig was pulled up for offside when in a good position. Tedman secured and sent to Nicholls, who went for the goal on his own, taking a good shot. He scored a fine goal from well out, the ball beating Wade all the way. This score livened Rats who soon went to the visitors defence, and Johnstone saved close in from T Hainsworth. Rats were not to be denied, and were awarded a corner from a good angle. J. Hainsworth took a pass and equalised the scores for Rats: Both teams played good football and Harris was a tower of strength to the visitors, his kicking being a treat to watch. Halftime found the scores unaltered Rats 1 Corinthians, 1. Rats kicked off and T Hainsworth and J Hainsworth were penalised for offside Craig secured and gave to Burgess, but V. Rumble cleared. Craig was again prominent but spoiled by being offside Johnstone was called on to save from T Hainsworth but in clearing Warrell received and scored with a low fast shot much to the delight of their supporters. Corinthians lacked sting after this and when Rats came again T. Hainsworth scored number 3 for Rats. Harris and Johnstone were saving a lot for the Corinthians, but Rats forwards were persistent and were doing most of the attacking E Rumble and T Hainsworth both missed with an open goal, but made up for it later when Hainsworth secured No. 4. All interest had gone out of the game now, but the visitors battled gamely to the finish. Just before half time T Hainsworth again put the finishing touches in securing No. 5. Fulltime Rats 5 goals; Corinthians, 1 goal.

Comments on the Game. It was a pity that the visitors did not field their full team as they made a gallant effort up till half-time but Rats' was the dominating team in the second half and deserved their victory. Johnstone, Harris, Tedman and Nicholls were the prominent men for the visitors. Rats, on the whole, played good combined football, T. Hainsworth being very prominent.

Dispute over 1921 Ambulance Cup

A special meeting of the Ipswich and West Moreton British Football Association was held in the Memorial Hall last night to consider a dispute as to whether or not Bush Rats Football Club should have its name inscribed on the Ambulance Cup.

The cup has not been played for since 1921. Mr. R. C. Davidson (President) presided, and others present were Messrs. A. Harley, A. Gibb, A.W. Bugler, F. O. Allan, A. C. Allan, and B. Kemp (Secretary). A deputation of four was present from Blackstone Rovers' F.C., and Mr. J. Potts represented Bush Rats' F.C. The President said he was sorry the question had cropped up. Mr. N. Edwards (Blackstone Rovers) said he was a member of Blackstone Rovers team in the year the Ambulance Cup was played for.

They were to have met Bush Rats in the final, but, if he remembered rightly, Rats forfeited. Blackstone Rovers did not claim the Cup as they had not played for it, but they did not want Bush Rats to have their name inscribed on it, because they had not played for it. If anyone should have their name on the cup, Rovers should, because they turned out to play the final. Mr. A. C. Allan, who was Secretary of the West Moreton Football Association at that time, gave a detailed account of the case. He said that Blackstone Rovers were suspended late in July or early in August, 1921, but before the Ambulance Cup was drawn, the Q.F.A. in being approached by the West Moreton Association raised the suspension on condition that Rovers forfeited certain points in the "B" Grade competition. On September 3, Blackstone Rovers were to have met Bush Rats in the final, but the match did not take place. Up till the day of the match, he was secretary of the association, had received no communication from Rats, but he understood Rats had written to Rovers stating that, as they were to play Corinthians in the final of the Tristram Shield on the following Saturday, and they wanted to save their men, they would not turn out. The West Moreton Association suspended Bush Rats until such time as they gave an explanation of their action.

The Q.F.A. upheld the West Moreton Association's decision, but later, at the same meeting, reopened the question, as Rats were to play the final of the Tristram Shield on the 10th, and the Q.F.A. needed funds. The Q.F.A. decided that Rats meet Corinthians in the final of the Tristram Shield, and, in the event of Rats winning the competition, the trophy be withheld, pending the confirmation of the West Moreton's decision. Mr. John Potts, secretary of Bush Rats F.C., who was a member of the West Moreton executive in 1921, stated that Blackstone Rovers were suspended till the end of the season. Bush Rats met Bundamba Rangers at Bundamba, and officials from the Ambulance Centre attended with the Ambulance Cup and medals, which were to have been presented to the winners.

The cup was taken away by men not authorised by the West Moreton Association to do so. They held it, pending the lifting of Rovers suspension. Rovers' suspension was not lifted until a week before the season ended. The cup that Mr. Edwards mentioned was the Challenge Cup, and the match Rats forfeited was to Bundamba Rangers. The Ambulance Cup was never competed for after they defeated Bundamba Rangers. After further discussion, it was decided that Bush Rats won the Ambulance Cup in 1921.

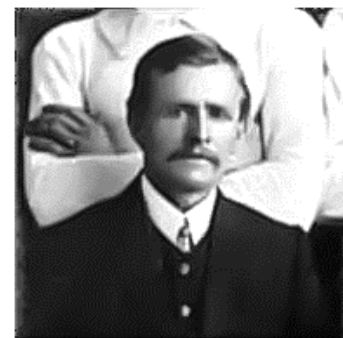

Tristram Shield Final (23rd September)

One of the most thrilling displays of soccer football seen at the Brisbane Cricket Ground this season, was witnessed on Saturday, afternoon in the tussle for the Tristram. Shield, between Bush Rats and Pineapple Rover's. It was the final match for the trophy, and, with both clubs represented with their best teams, the match sparkled with height moments. Not only was the football attractive and of a high standard, but both teams maintained a terrific pace, especially in the first half when one of the linesmen, after many spurts to keep up with the players as they travelled from one goal to the other, jokingly called to one of the confreres, on the line for a bicycle. The linesman, of course did not really want a bicycle; but it was his way of expressing the speed with which the game was being contested. Bush Rats on the whole deserved to win, although Pineapple Rovers, had they maintained their pro-interval form in the second half might

have drawn with their opponents. Bush Rats were leading by one goal to nil at the interval. The final score, was four to one in the Ipswich team's favour. Pineapple Rovers, unfortunately for themselves, were not so aggressive in the second, moiety as they were earlier in the game. They appeared to play a more or less defensive game, and Bush Rats pressed their advantage for all they were worth. The game was fast from the outset. First to one end and then to the other it travelled with lightning speed. Both sides were frequently within scoring distance, and each was frequently withstanding dangerous onslaughts on its goal. 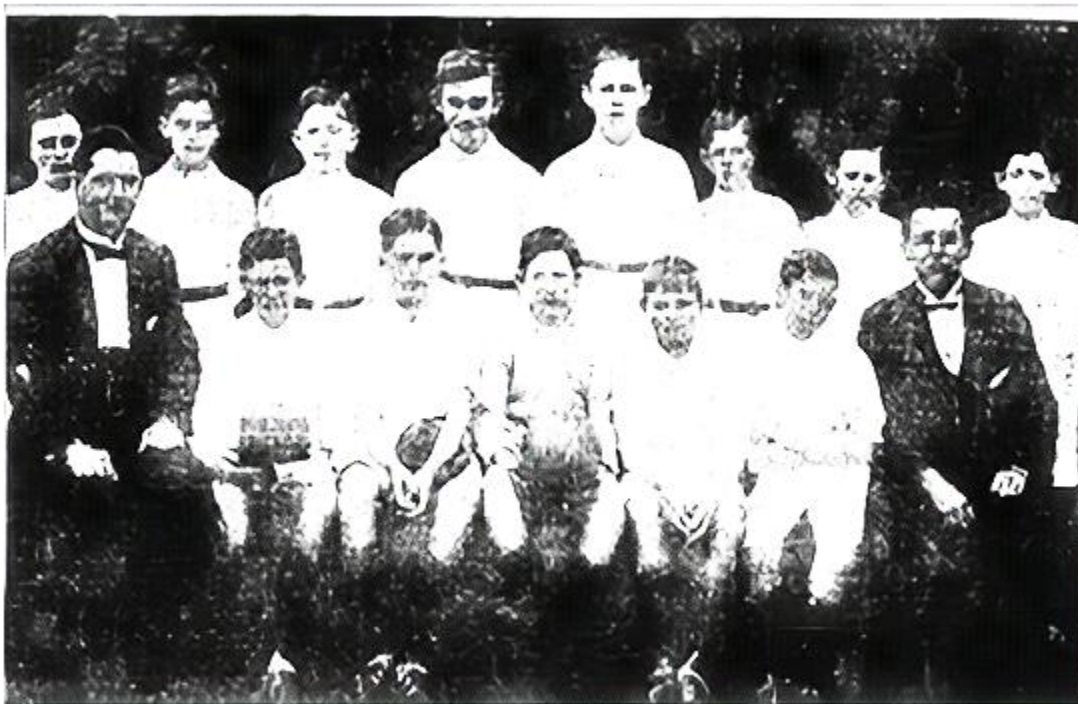

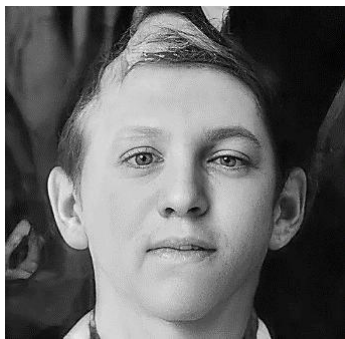

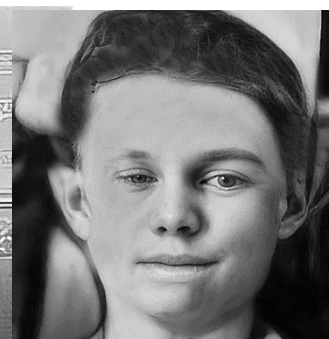

Competition changes

An important alteration in the rules regarding the premiership competition was proposed by Mr. J. Hildreth. It was as follows : "That at the expiration' of the series of fixtures ordered by the executive committee semi-final and .final rounds shall, .be played by the four leading teams in .-the senior A division. The leading team shall .play, the team finishing third .in the competition, and the team finishing second shall play the team finishing fourth in the competition as a semi-final round. Should it be that the team leading at the expiration of the series of fixtures ordered by the executive committee be defeated, either in the semi-final or final rounds "it shall . 'have tho right to challenge the winning team of the .final round, the team winning the challenge round to lie declared premiers for that year /should there 'be no challenge the the team winning the finial round, shall he the premiers for the year. " Mr. Hildreth argued that he was out to maintain interest in tho premiership competition to the last game.

The executive had already, approved of the proposal, Mr. Hutchison seconded the .motion. After discussion, the; motion was carried by 29 votes to 28. "V Mr. Hildreth then moved for the deletion from the rules, of the words : "At the conclusion' of "the senior competitions the two ' lower clubs of division A shall be graded in division B for the following season, and. tlie two leading teams in division B shall be graded In division A for tile following year." He contended that the executive should be the power to say what clubs should be in the first division, because a club which had qualified to remain in the division one season might through loss of players in the following season be of insufficient strength to justify its retention in that division. Mr. Hutchison seconded the motion, and several delegates spoke in opposition to it. Mr T W. Kendall (life member) said the object of the motion was to give the executive power to say at the commencement of a season which teams were the best for the first division, and he was sure the officials would' not' ' be lacking in their judgment in that regard The motion was carried -by 33 votes to 16

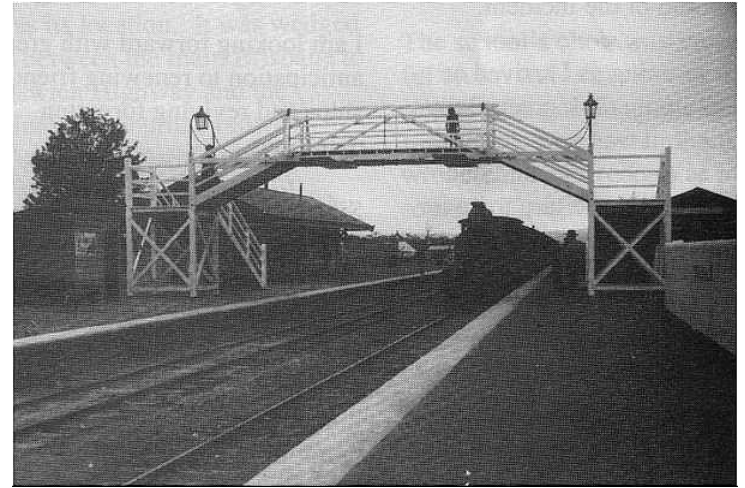

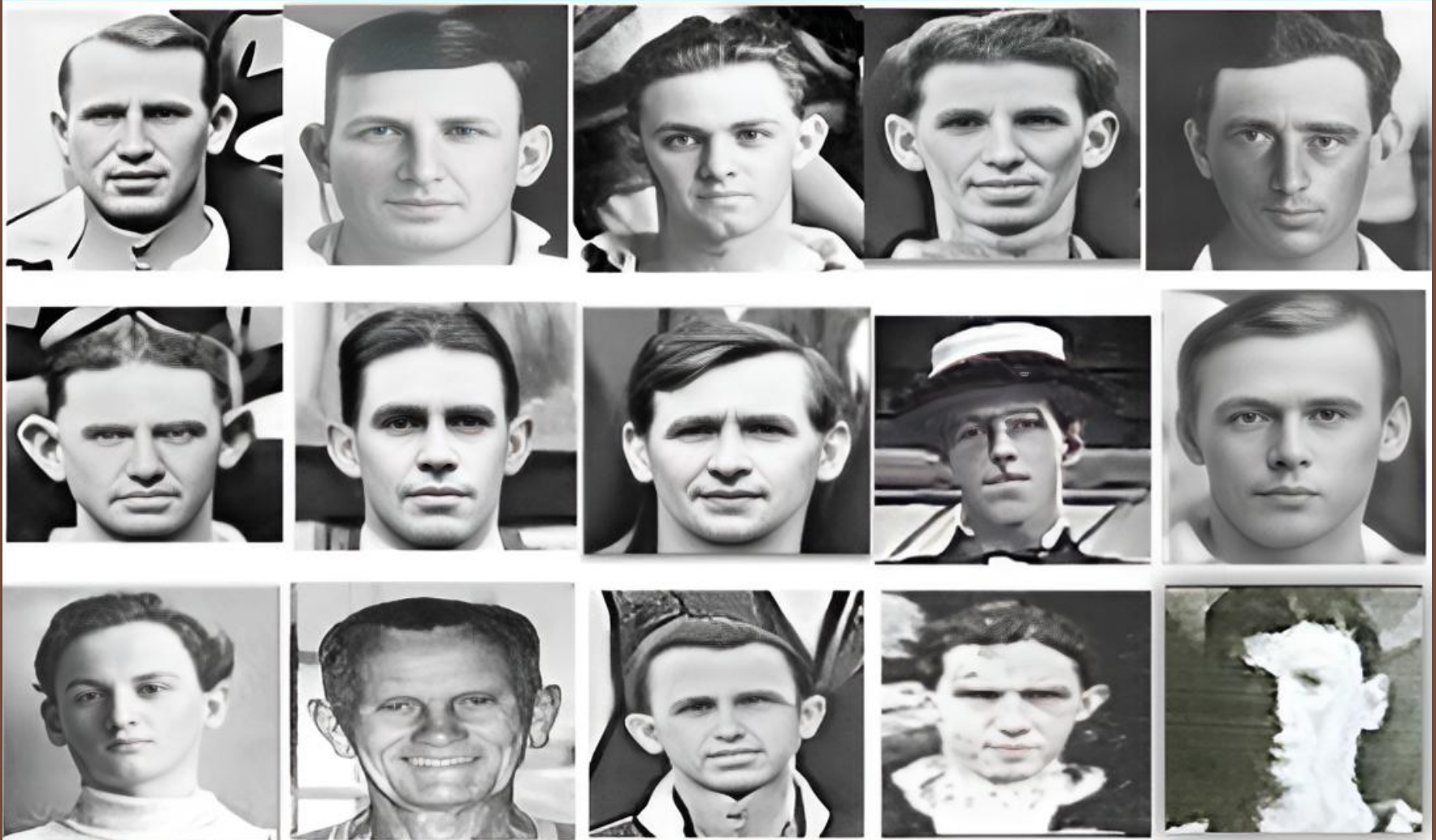

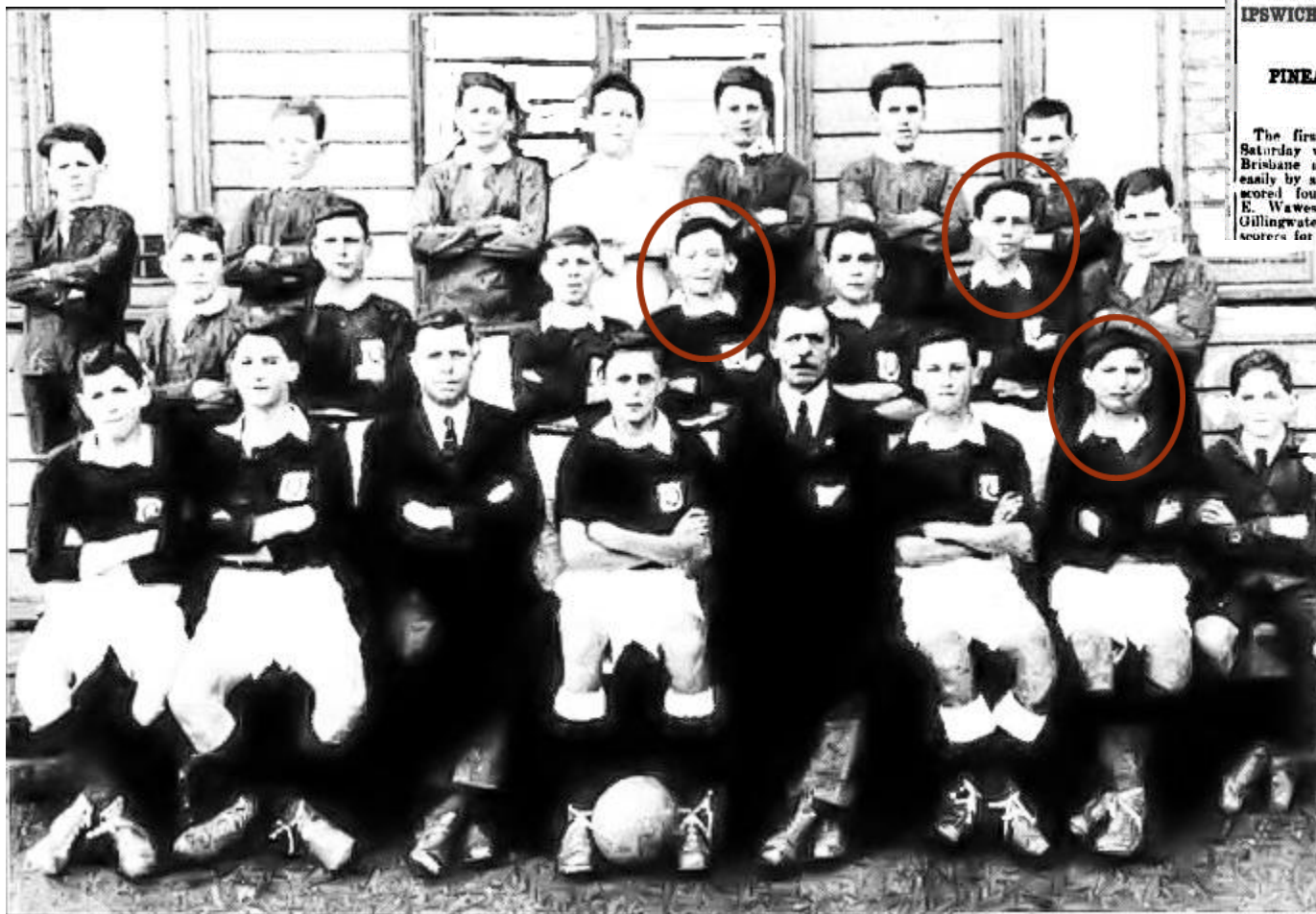

The semi-finals of the premiership competition were decided at the Brisbane Cricket Ground on Saturday afternoon, when Brisbane City met Thistles and "Bush Rats" played Bundamba. The players in the first fixture had to contend with a very strong wind, which was blowing down the field. The attendance was good. During the first game a very unfortunate incident occurred. A scuffle took place in front of the City goal and Brown was ordered off the field. In the second game another player, Dan Potts, was "ordered off", after a dispute with the referee.

Fast and brilliant play ensued, in which Button and Teasdale were conspicuous and the Rats' goal was in jeopardy for several seconds, Hughes managing to punch out. L. Worrell set "Tommy" Hainsworth going, and the ball was passed to Rumble, who tested Miller with a shot. Rats again attacked and Potts and Routledge came into collision. The same referee reported five members of the City team for abuse and ungentlemanly on the field and in the dressing room.

The five members in question, are to appear on Monday next A resolution was carried to the effect that J. Potts, secretary of the Bush Rats P.C and Ballam, a member of the Brisbane City P.C. be disallowed admission to the Brisbane Cricket Ground, and further, that, O. Potts be asked to show cause why he should not- be suspended from his club for his ungentlemanly conduct to the Q-F.A. officials..

Tristram Shield Final (5th September)

According to an authority on Soccer who witnessed the match, it was a great game, and for sheer football skill Rats deserved the palm. The forwards, capably led by that master pivot, Tommy Hainsworth, played like men inspired, and when on the move always conjured up visions of goals. Jack Potts was, perhaps, the cleverest of the quintette, and on his play thoroughly earned the decision of Messrs. McNaughton and C. McNaughton, of the Thistle Club, as being the best player on Rats side, for which he was awarded a gold medal. With Arty Williams, he combined in many pretty moves on the left wing which often brought danger to Rovers citadel. When Rovers opened their account, about 52 minutes after the kick off, Rats thought it wise to reconstruct their intermediate line. Mick Burns filled his accustomed position in the back division. Len Warrell went into the centre and Vern. Rumble filled the role of left half, with Jack Williams on the right. The move had the desired effect.

When next they got on the move Pineapples found themselves up against a solid proposition, and time and again were repelled by the tenacious halves, whose tackling was very deadly. The intermediate trio acquitted themselves with credit and had a big share in Rats great victory. The backs defended stoutly. Bush Rats Reunion

Players of 34 years ago meet present day exponents

In the Alliance Hall, Dinmore, on Saturday night there was a happy gathering of Soccerite's. It was the first reunion of past and present members held by the Bush Rats F.C., which, for 34 years, has upheld the prestige of West Moreton in the Soccer world and has made Its name respected by every other club in Southern Queensland.

It was in 1890 that the Bush Rats F.C. first came into being. In those days there were no playing pitches, but the dense scrub did not present 13 stout-hearted lovers of football from playing their favourite game. They set to work with a will, and many a time the moon was well up before they ceased their labours.. Eventually they cleared a patch big enough to play on and it was the proud boast of those original "Bush Rats that they never suffered defeat. during four seasons on the home ground. When the work of clearing the three grounds was completed, the question cropped .up. 'What 'shall we call the team?' "according to Mr Bailey one 'night this happy band of enthusiasts knocked off for a smoke. It was a dark night and as they sat around the fire one of them, Bill Hansell suggested that as they were like a lot of bush rats why not call the club that name and they did so and ever since then, during 34 seasons, the name of the Bush Rats has been respected by all exponents of Soccer in Southern Queensland.

Bush Rats is not the oldest club in the West Moreton, though it has the oldest consecutive record Blackstone had been playing a season or two before the Bush Rate P.C. came in to existence Blackstone has had a chequered career and several times the club has become defunct only to rise again

.In 1891 the first competition was constituted and the competing teams were Bus Rats, Blackstone, Silkstone, Call backs Whitwood, Bundanba and Dinmore. In 1893

Brisbane instituted a premiership competition and invited West Moreton teams to enter.. Bush Rats and Blackstone accordingly affiliated with Brisbane making six teams. The Brisbane combinations being Rosebanks, Normans, Athletics and Alloa (South Brisbane). Rosebanks won that year but the following season Normans: became champions, Bah Rats winning the Premiership in 1895. Bush Rats were represented in those days, by John Besgrove (goal); Matt Bailey and George Duck (full backs); William Jeffrey, John Jeffrey and R. Campbell (half backs) Joe Skellern, Joe Jeffrey, Billy Duck, Dave Franklin and William Bailey (forwards) Alexander Stewart was included in the team which won the in Premiership in 1895. of those original Bush Rats, three- 'Messer Matt Bailey, Joe Skellern and J Campbell were present at the reunion whilst Alex. Stewart, who is now President of the club, occupied the chair

It was a memorable feast. And was characterised by that spirit of comradeship which has been with the Bush Rats F.C. came up for the occasion, and the game of Soccer.

There was a big crowd to watch the fun. A Rugby League ball was used, and what the game lacked in science was more than counterbalance by the fun created. The toast list at night was interspersed with song and recitations in keeping with the occasion, and altogether it was of the most successful local gatherings held this year. For this happy state of affairs too which credit can be given to Mr. J Potts, the clubs hard working secretary. For 10 years he has held the position taking over the reins of his brother John who also had: been secretary for many years and has carried out his duties diligently. As someone remarked at the dinner; 'Without Joe Potts Bush Rats F.C. would not be in the happy position it is in today,' and, certainly, the club never, had a more enthusiastic official and supporter. He was well supported in making arrangements by a capable committee, comprising the president (Mr. A Stewart), patron (Mr. A. Hudson) had Messrs. V. Rumble, T. Coogan, J. Skellern, E. Dawes, Randolph, and A Stewart, jun. One of the features of the dinner was the excellent manner in which it was served by the ladies. The lady helpers were- Mesdames Burns. Rumble. Nunn. Bailey, Stewart, Fish and Potts. and Misses Nunn, Black. Hardy. Hudson. and Esme Nunn.

All the speeches were spiced with plenty of humour, and every toast was musically honoured. "The King was the first toast. The president paid a tribute to the late Dean Horan. who, he said, for 25 or 30 years had been the club's patron, and had shown , himself to be a really fine gentleman. He had thought a lot of the Bush Rats, added Mr. Stewart, and often watched them play. The company then stood in silence, with bowed heads, as a tribute to the memory of the departed Dean. Mr. Stewart submitted "Our Guests," coupling the name of Mr. A Jackson, the referee, He extended a hearty welcome to the guests, and expressed the opinion that football had fallen somewhat "flat" this season. They had had visits from the New Zealanders, Chinese, and Canadians, but they had not been shown anything extraordinary by them. An English team would probably be coming out next season. and then they would see Soccer as it should be played. "We play it too fast," said Mr. Stewart, "We do not play with enough science, and that is what is wanted. In conclusion he advised senior players to start training early they had a good team but there were too slow in starting last season Mr Jackson replied. He said he was interested in what Mr Stewart had said about the progress of the game. There were many people of the same opinion, but he was inclined to disagree with Mr. Stewart Soccer was making progress, he said and it may one day become the most popular game in the country(See Over)

A great deal of Interest in the game in Queensland had been created by the Bush Rats Club. In Brisbane they were an attraction in the football world, and he assured them that had Mr. Ashworth been present he would have, expressed something of what he (Mr. Jackson) was saying. The Bush Rats team was a very old Soccer combination, but it was certainly as formidable today as in the old days, and he hoped they would continue to play the game as they had played it, especially recently. Bush Rats first congratulated Pineapple Rovers on winning the premiership, and he hoped that such a sportsmanlike spirit as that would always be evidenced in the games. He again thanked them for the hearty welcome they had given him. Mr. Roddy Budd made a big hit with a couple of humorous songs. In his address, the patron of the Bush Rate F.C. (Mr. A. Hudson) said the Queensland Football Association had had a hard time, but had done its best to satisfy all the teams. Mr. C. Searle (assistant secretary of the Q.F.A. responded on behalf of the Q.P.'A. He congratulated the Bush Rats on the splendid manner in which they had persevered, ending the season by making Pineapple Rovers play the hardest game of their careers, In the beginning of the season it looked as though the Pineapple Rovers and Thistles would fight it out for the premiership, but he was pleased that two West Moreton clubs had put up such a splendid performance. It spoke volumes for the quality of Ipswich football..Mr. Joe Potts submitted the toast of "The Original Bush Rats F.C." 'From what he had heard from his brother who had held the position of secretary. which he now filled, he said he was satisfied that the original Bush Rats must have been a great combination; when he heard that the game today was not played as well as it was in those days he realised they must have played "some" football. Mr. M. Bailey one of the original Bush Rats team, replied, and was given an ovation. He said that in the early days, everybody used to attend the matches. Mr. Bailey told several interesting anecdotes. He did not think the game too fast today but they wanted to combine more. In conclusion, he said Soccer was making progress in Queensland. At this stage, Mr. M. Bailey presented medals and other trophies to the players, and gave the Tristram Shield, which Rats won this year, into the custody of the president, Mr. A. Stewart.

Those who received medals were: J.Williams (who also received a' pair of sleeve links for being the best player in the last match of the season), W. Burns, E. Rumble, L. Warrell, E. Nunn, Jack Potts, T. Hainsworth, A. Hawkins, J. Smith, D. Potts, P. Pedley and W. Warrell. E; Nunn was also presented with a handsome gold medal shaped like .the map 'of Australia, for gaining his International cap. It was stated that any member of the Bush Rats football club who was chosen for Australia would receive a medal.

When he received the Tristram Shield, Mr. Stewart smilingly remarked that he hoped Latrobe's would win it next year. Mr. Balneaves contributed a song and banjo items, which delighted his bearers. Mr. E. Dawes proposed the toast of the "Vice Presidents," Mr. D.A. Gledson. M.L.A., responded. He said that he landed in Australia in 1885. and on the boat which he came out in were several footballers. They mostly played with Bundamba Rangers. Jack Ward, the goalie, could punch the ball nearly the whole length of the field. He recalled the wonderful control Davy Franklin had over the ball and said it was no use going in for a kicking competition. Soccer has never had a chance in Queensland, he said because there had never been good coaches to train the players. Mr. Gledson proposed the toast of Oihe "Bush Rats Football Club' and Mr. S. Skellern suitably replied, after which Mr. J. Ray gave a capital item.

"Latrobe's Football Club and Kindred Clubs was submitted by Mr T Hainsworth, and responded to by Mr. E. Rigby, of the Latrobe's Football Club. Mr S Skellern following with a couple o fetchy songs. Mr. J. Ray proposed "The Secretary of-Bush Rats:', " Bush Rats, he said, were fortunate in having such an efficient secretary. Mr. Joe Potts replied and Mr J Ray contributed another fine item. The toasts of the Ladies, the Chair man and the Press were also honoured

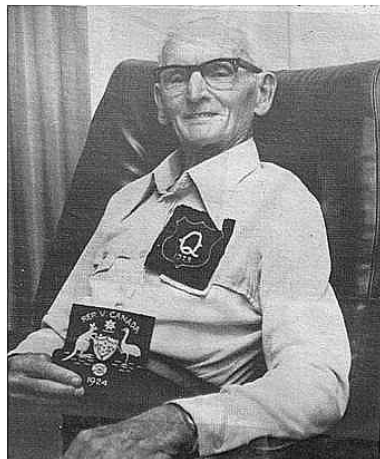

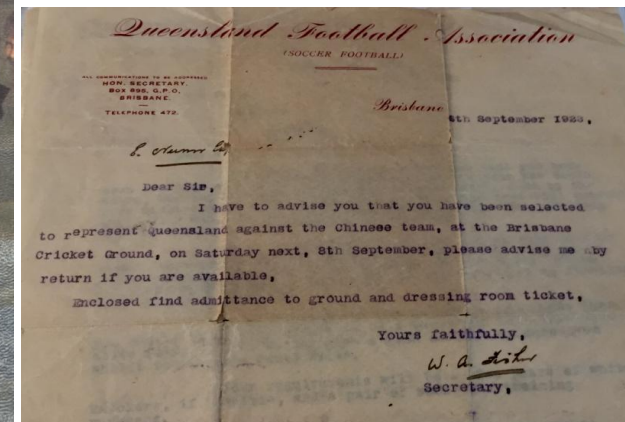

Premiership decider Bush Rats 1 vs Bundamba Rangers 1 (31st July)

Soccer. Honours for Rats Rangers make 1-1 draw. Thrilling game at Dinmore

One of the most momentous matches of the season, because on it hung the fate of the West Moreton premiership, the meeting between Bush Rats and Bundamba Rangers, at Dinmore, on Saturday, proved an epic struggle. A win for Rangers would have meant a replay with their opponents for the championship, whilst Rats only needed to draw to win the honour. Bush Rats succeeded in their objective, the game ending in a draw of 1-1. For all time though Rangers will argue that they really won.

When the game was but 10 minutes old, Oliver sent in a shot which Gedge tipped against the cross bar. The ball rebounded into the goal, but the custodian managed to scoop it out, and it is claimed that the ball went over the line before he touched it. However, Referee Tapp thought otherwise, and allowed play to continue. Play was commenced at a great pace, which was maintained till the end. It was rugged football. Science went to the winds. Goals were what counted more, and when a Bush Rat was seen to dally with the ball near his own 'citadel,' in order to out-manoeuvre an opponent, - a colleague called out, 'Cut out the English stuff, Billy.' With much in the balance, players became nervous, Rangers suffering more than Bush Rats, and consequently miskicking and faulty shooting were frequent; Both sets of forwards were at a discount, the defence on either side dominating throughout.

Most remarkable of all was the excellent play of "Arty" Williams Rats right half he never gave the opposing left wing an inch of rope, always being able to intercept well-meant passes. Edwards was given a feast of the ball, both by Williams and Warrell. Billy Burns, too, rose to the occasion, and gave, perhaps, his finest display of the season. Kicking soundly and cleanly, he was instrumental in repulsing many Rangers attacks, and did a lot to make up for his partner Mick. Jack Routledge was of immense value in the Rangers' defence. He kicked with his accustomed power, and was very reliable. Percy Jarvis was another who rendered yeoman service to Rangers. Sammy Teasdale did splendidly against a man faster than himself and who was given a goodly share of the ball. The trophies donated by the Bush Rate FC. for the best players on their side were won by 'Fatty' Williams and Jack Potts. Mr. Alec Gibb was the judge.

Rangers broke away, and the forwards slipped tho ball about nicely. inside the penalty area, Pedley parted to Mc Dowall, who worked towards the right for position as he was about to shoot he was charged unfairly and the referee promptly awarded a penalty Jarvis, took the kick, and, though Gedge made a valiant effort to save, he failed. to prevent the ball entering the net. On the resumption. Rats went away with a will, but Routledge relieved. They were persistent in their endeavours, however. and Potts engineered a fine opening for Rodgers who failed to turn it to good account.

The goal which gave Rats the premiership was scored shortly afterwards. Potts received near the centre line, and made a bee line for goal as hard as he could go. He ran straight for 20 yards, then wheeled over to the left to round Routledge Lindsay should have cleared, but the flying forward got past, and scored with an oblique shot. It was a' great goal. Half time arrived shortly afterwards. The second half opened at a fast pace Rangers assumed the aggressive, and Oliver was a little too high with a drive from 30 yards out.

The centre forward made another attempt shortly afterwards, but again missed. Edwards was a trouble some thorn in the side of Rangers defence, and the situation looked black when he dropped over a beautiful corner, Kitching cleverly clearing. The right winger then attempted a solo dash but was stopped by Routledge.

Thrice In quick Succession Smith was called upon to save. Rangers came again, and McDowall made a clever Individual effort but could not finish. Rats retaliated, and gained a corner, which Jarvis cleared. It was an exciting moment for Rangers when Potts received about six yards from goal and had only Smith to beat, but the ball flashed over the bar. The game ended with the scores still 1-1.

Readmission of the Ipswich Soccer Clubs

The terms of the settlement for the readmission of the Ipswich Soccer Clubs, Bundanba. Blackstone, and Bush Rats, were approved by a special general meeting of the Queensland Football Association, tonight, by 17 votes to eight Mr. Stair (Shafston Rovers) moved that the agreement in the Secretary's report be accepted, with the exception of Clause 5, which provided that Ipswich Clubs should all be placed on the same footing in regard to the payment of 30/ towards the train fares of Brisbane clubs travelling to Ipswich. Mr. J. Clark (Dinmore) seconded the motion. Mr J Robertson (Wynnum) moved as an amendment that the recommendation of the Management Committee be accepted. Mr A Cornelius (Pineapple Rovers) seconded the amendment, which was carried by 17 votes to eight A further amendment that the recommendation of the management committee be accepted with the addition of the words, "If they so desire." to Clause 4, which provided that the West Moreton Clubs be exempt from the Tristram Shield fixtures, was carried. Mr. A. Stephenson's motion that the Referees' Union should have representation on the management committee was rejected. His Honour (Mr. Chief Justice Blair. was elected Patron of the Association, and the Mayor of Brisbane (Ald. W A Jolly), and Mr. T. McWilliam were appointed vice-Patrons. It was decided that privileges be granted to senior clubs to bring first grade junior players under their control

Those who go to the Brisbane Cricket Ground on Saturday will be able to get their first glimpse of the way the new off-side rule works in premiership fixtures. The general opinion seems to be that footer will be speeded up, and that there will be more goals. It will be interesting to see how a team like Thistle, which relies more on science than speed, will be effected by this acceleration in the game. Mr. A. F. Jackson (Chairman of the management committee, and ex Australian referee) expects "surprises galore" on Saturday, "One naturally expects sensations from clubs like Bush Rats and Pineapple Rovers under the speeding up process of the new off side law," he said yesterday. 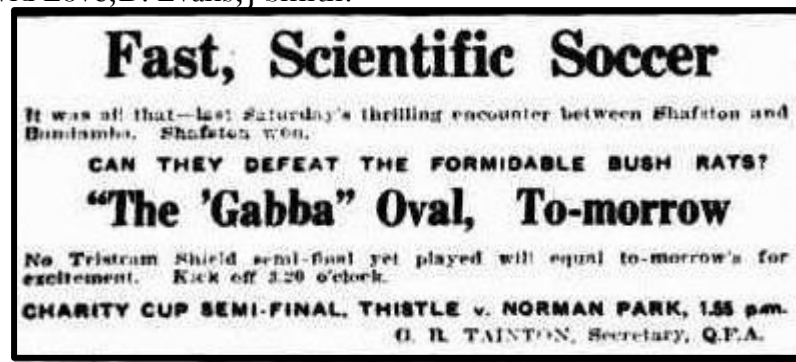

Cumberford won the toss, and had the wind in his favour in the first half. although the sun was a handicap against the Thistle team. The game opened at a solid pace, and both goals were soon menaced. After three minutes the Rats attacked strongly, and, in trying to clear, Perotte was knocked out. Whilst he was on the ground, the Rats made a big effort to shoot into the unguarded goal, and would have succeeded, had not Park headed out from under the bar. As the time drew near Thistle came within an ace of equalising on more than one occasion. It was one of the hardest struggles of the season. Final Bush Rats 2 Thistles 1

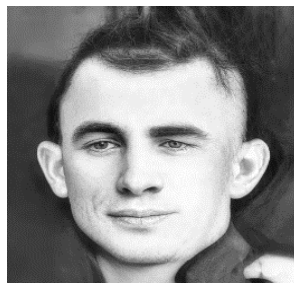

Annual meeting

Dinmore Bush Rats Football (Soccer) Club held its annual meeting in the Alliance Hall. Dinmore, last night.

J Maxwell and J. G. McIlwraith. After discussion regarding the management of Soccer football for 1929 it was unanimously decided that the club should nominate Mr. G. f. Tainton for the position of Secretary of the Brisbane and District Association.

The Secretary gave an outline of what was proposed for the coming year players to receive 5 / for a win and 2 / 6 for draw for all Premiership and Tristram Shield matches, and an allowance per week for injured players. At the close of the meeting a hearty vote of thanks to the Chairman and to the officers of the club was proposed and carried by acclamation.

Bush Rats withdraw(Decline of Bush Rats)

A largely attended delegate meeting of the Ipswich and West Moreton District Football Association was held last night in the Soldiers' Memorial Hall. under the chairmanship of Mr. A. Gibb.

Members reported that Bush Rats, one of the oldest clubs in Queensland, had been passing through a difficult period, and the position had arisen that through lack of available senior players the club would have to be reduced to fielding a junior team. The withdrawal of Bush Rate would mean that the association would have .eight teams in senior football, providing for four games each Saturday. Mr. H. Herald (President of Thistles) expressed keen regret that the Bush Rats were withdrawing from senior football for this year. Bush Rats had a worthy tradition, and an honoured name in the football world in Queensland. The Chairman added his regrets. He highly esteemed the club, against which he had played. 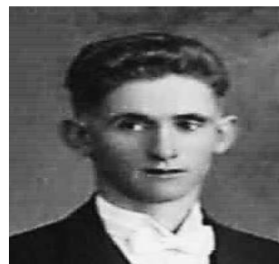

Bush Rats' Forfeits

(By "Inside Left.") The action or rather inaction of the Bush Rats' Soccer Club over the last two weeks has been causing concern, not only to the local British Football Association, but to players of other clubs, and even to Soccer followers. Bush Rats is an old-established combination and should be familiar with all the rules of the game and of fixture engagements.

On June 2 Bush Rats were drawn to play Bundamba. When the time came for the commencement of the game, Bush Rats had only five men on the field, and the game was abandoned. It is learnt on good authority that no official report was made on the incident. The association officially was not aware that the forfeiture had occurred.

The Fixture Committee was a little uncertain in drawing up the fixtures for last Saturday.. It had no intimation of the intention of Bush Rats,. The committee delayed the draw as long as possible, expecting some official notification but none came. Bush Rats were drawn to play against Booval Stars in last Saturday's fixture matches, but it is understood that, on Saturday morning, or probably on Friday, word was sent from them to their opponents to the effect that they would be forfeiting the game. Bush Rats accordingly put in no appearance, and the match went on a forfeit to Stars.

The club should know that it must furnish notice to the association of intention to forfeit, so that it can be recorded officially, but the club has failed to comply with that rule. The association held a meeting on Monday night, and amongst other things discussed the attitude adopted by Bush Rats. Fixtures for the following Saturday are generally drawn up on Monday nights, but this week the association considered that Bush Rats could be given a chance during the week to intimate officially their intentions.

Not long after the commencement of the season their junior team withdrew from the competition, it is believed for the purpose of augmenting the senior team. Apparently that move also has had negative results, and the Bush Rats find themselves unable to find sufficient members to constitute a teams. If that is the real case, then the least thing that the club. can do is to notify the association. The association is holding another, meeting tonight, when members expect to receive some word from Bush Rats

Junior Association formed

**Dinmore Bush Rats John Maxwell appointed first President
(J Maxwell would be President until 1946)**



Mr. Maxwell has been an energetic supporter of junior Soccer In the Ipswich district for many years. having been connected with all movements for the advancement of this section of the game. He has been Chairman of junior committees, and, has represented the younger player. at all delegate meetings In Brisbane. For eight or nine years he was Secretary of the Bush Rats, and for the past 12 years has been a member of the executive of the senior association.

Last night the control of junior Soccer in the Ipswich district was vested in a newly-formed junior association, Mr. J. Maxwell, Dinmore, who for many years has been associated with junior football, was appointed the first President.

The object of forming the new body was in order that a properly constituted junior association might affiliate with the recently formed Queensland Junior Football Association to organise junior football throughout the State. The Chairman, explaining the proposal. thought it would assist the game tremendously provided they gave the project their wholehearted support. He was pleased with the attendance, and appealed to all delegates for their lively interest In the scheme, of which he invited a thorough examination. He said Mr. Maxwell had represented the Junior clubs at the Queensland Association meetings. There would be a Queensland cup for competition, and probably teams would visit the district from the North and South. It was entirely in the hands to members to make a success of the scheme. Mr. T. Smith recalled that a Junior association had been in existence about nine years ago. Mr. Maxwell reported on his activities in connection with the formation of the Queensland Soccer Junior Association.

Ipswich delegates to the meeting which formed this new body were Messrs. W. Burton and T. Smith, with himself, Brisbane also Having three representatives. Mr. T. Conway was informed that the junior body would not be under the jurisdiction of the senior body, but the latter would expect affiliation. Mr. Conway, seconded by Mr. T. C. Johnston, moved that a junior association, to be styled the Ipswich and West Moreton Junior Football Association, be formed. The Chairman explained in reply to a question that the new body would be able to send three representatives to the Queensland Junior Association, and two from the latter body would be appointed to the Queensland Soccer Council..

After a short debate the motion was carried unanimously, and the Chairman congratulated the junior players on their decision. In New South Wales the movement was strong, and, as an illustration, the church league had 110 teams playing. The association would have full control of junior football. Mr. J. Maxwell was elected president. Mr. Gibb thought the meeting had made a wise selection, and under his guidance he did not doubt that the association would prosper.

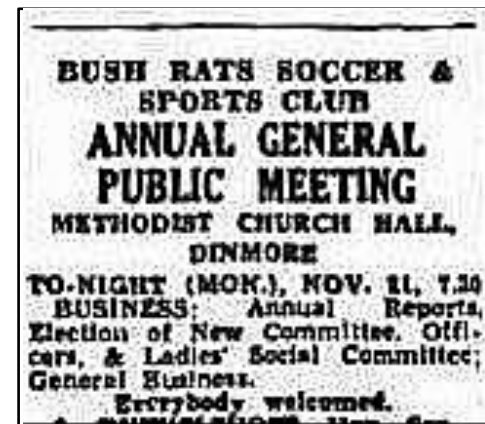

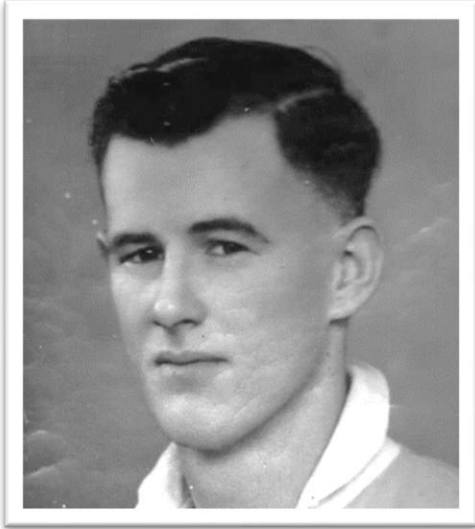

Bush Rats Clinch Premiership Title

Enthusiastic supporters mobbed the Dinmore team, and chaired the victors off the ground

Dinmore Bush Rats gave a magnificent display of solid, defensive football in their 1-nil victory over St. Helens at Dinmore on Saturday. Virtually two men short in the second half, the Rats put the premiership issue beyond doubt, and capped a series of good efforts with their best performance of the year

. Feature of the game was the work of the Dinmore hacks, of whom L. Verrall in the half position was the star. Gavioli, as goalkeeper, performed with his customary brilliance. These two defenders were the mainstays in the solid front which St. Helens forwards found impassable. In Bush Rats forward line. A. Verrall made the most of opportunities presented to him. Early in the game the Dinmore side received a setback when right winger. Morris, took a knock, which caused a recurrence of a knee injury sustained the previous Saturday. Morris was badly handicapped, and limped through the rest of the match. Another stroke of bad luck for Bush Rats came soon after the start of the second half, when McKeand fell heavily, and was carried from the field. - and was later taken to hospital and admitted, suffering from concussion.

Players took the field and, with officials, stood in silence for a minute as a mark of respect to the late Mr. P. Hickey. A former keen supporter of Bush Rats.

Heavy showers which fell early soon had the ball heavy and greasy, and made the ground slippery. tush Rats took the offensive from the outset, and within the first five minutes, from a free awarded to Rats, Morris forced a corner. but the shot was cleared by taints' defenders. Another corner to the Dinmore side seconds later was cleared by Hill, and sent upfield by right-back Jones. After about 10 minutes' play, Saints swung into the attack. A clearance from Gavioli was returned from well out by G. Sander. The ball had plenty of pace, but the shot went wide of the posts.

The only goal of the match came about five minutes later. from a free awarded to Rats. the half-back, L Verrall, kicked the ball right Into the goalie's arms. Williams tumbled the greasy ball, and Rats centre-forward. White, made no mistake about putting it away. Missed Saints came bark strongly and pressed the attack, but the Dinmore defenders were too strong. Good work by L Verrall, supporting Gavioll, saved what looked like a sure goal, when the Dinmore back cleared from right on the goal line. At this stage Saints lost a golden opportunity to equalise. when they were awarded a penalty kick. The kick was taken by R. Hill. but his shot went wide of the right upright. Gavioll performed brilliantly as keeper for Rats. and his saves and clearances were a major factor in his team's victory. With about 15 minutes left in the first half. Saints left winger. Hainsworth, made several attempts to pierce the defence of the opposition, but Gavioli was always too alert. A corner from Nunn was punched out by the Dinmore keeper, and the halftime whistle blew with Rats leading 1- 0 (see over)

Play resumed in the second half with Saints on the attack. and a cross from Hainsworth to Pitcairn was headed over he bar. St. Helens were concentrating on a leftwing attack, but the Rats defenders stood the test.

Ten minutes later play switched to the other end as Miller carried the ball past several Saints' players, and passed to his left winger, whose kick went close, but was well saved by Williams. Bush Ruts suffered a severe setback about this time, when McKeand took a hard knock. and was carried from the field. With one man short, and their right-winger, Morris, hardly able to run. Rats were battling gamely to keep the opposing forwards away from the goalmouth. With about 10 minutes to go. Hainsworth cut through nicely. but his shot went wide of the mark. A corner taken by Nunn was headed out by a Dinmore back, and a few minutes later a corner from Hainsworth was well cleared. The full-time whistle went with Rats the match and premiersip winners. Bundamba Rangers centre-forward Colin Kitching ended the Soccer season with five goals to clinch the O'Callaghan Shield final for his side against Dinmore Bush Rats after 30 minutes extra time. The teams turned 2-all at the end of the first 90 minutes. Kitching's tally this season is 60 goals, seven ahead of Australian centre forward, Gordon Nunn.

There was more steadiness about Bundamba's play which built up its advantage. Although Rangers deserved to win on the general trend of play, it was not until the last quarter of an hour that they could clinch victory, as there was always plenty of fight in Dinmore. Dinmore's defensive strength again centred on Merv Peck and Les Verrall, with R Dobinson showing flashes of brilliant goalkeeping. The "old firm" of Dave Morris and Maurice Dawes in Bush Rats' forward line was again a dangerous striking force. An outstanding display for Bundamba was given by left half Ron Jones. There was also rock-life strength in the defence of Merv Newlands and Norm Rule. Spencer Kitching played a star role at inside-right for Rangers, and his combination with outside-right Gordon Anderson. was a big factor In Rangers success. Rangers opened the scoring after 20 minutes when All Gibb slipped the ball through to Spencer Kitching, who gave to Colin Kitching.

The centre took an easy ground shot which trickled through Dobinsson's fingers into the net. It was bad luck for Dinmore who had been doing well against Rangers attacks. Bundamba was having more of the play, but flourishes by Dinmore often had Bundamba in trouble. A minute after the start of the last 15 minutes, Kitching scored to put Rangers ahead 3-2, and in the closing stages of the game. he scored twice, to give Bundamba a 5-2 victory.

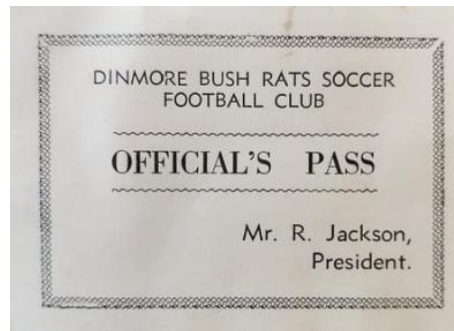
Dick Jackson returns

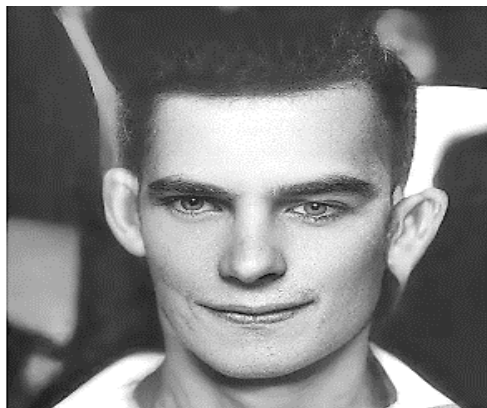

At that stage, however. right winger Morrie Dawes who made a comeback to Soccer after the season had started, scored the equaliser.

Tristram Shield Final

Bush Rats nil vs Bundamba Rangers 4 (11 September)

Playing splendid Soccer-probably the best display of the code this season-Bundamba Rangers on Saturday won the Tristram Shield for 1954 by defeating Dinmore Bush Rats 4 goals to nil.

From the kickoff whistle the pattern of Rangers trap was clear. It was a combination of speed, grand round passing, and positional play. Premiers Dinmore were hardly in the picture, but they always were full of light and went down defiantly, but confused by Rangers tactics. The display by Bundamba was the type that had knocked team after team out early in the season, but for some inexplicable reason, eluded them as the premiership competition wore on. Captain Bob. Lawrie naturally was very pleased at Rangers winning so convincingly their first major trophy since 1949. but his deepest satisfaction came from the knowledge that his side had taken the shield by an exhibition of Soccer as it should be played.

Probably no team in Queensland could have stood against Rangers the way they played on Saturday. Goalkeeper. full-backs. half-backs and forwards. nor one man in the Bundamba side could be faulted as they worked as a machine.

Rangers were so fast that Rats were hardly able to get a clean pass away. Lawrie was the outstanding player on the field. both for the way he knocked out Rats attacks and then became an attacking centre half but, more particularly for his tactics that had been so cleverly planned, and put into operation. Rangers led by 1-nil at half time, but were a much more superior side than that score would indicate. They missed a number of easy chances and struck Dinmore goalkeeper Des. Wishart again in great form.

At one stage of the first half, Rangers were peppering the Dinmore goal and only Wishart stood in their way. Rangers had had a wind advantage in the first half and there were some who thought that they would never have been able to keep up the pace of the first 45 minutes in the second session. They were wrong, because the Light Blues were just as penetrative.

They scored another three goals and missed a few more. Dinmore's best attacking play came late in the second half when they were unlucky not to have scored. It was during those assaults that Bundamba goalkeeper Wal "Spots") Mitchell really had to take a prominent, and very capable. part in the game.

Apart from winning the shield, probably the most satisfactory feature of the game from Rangers point of view was the way in which their centre forward Colin Kitching struck form. He scored three smart goals. He did miss others from easy range, but it can be said that at last he has regained the form which had been missing for so long this season. Reformation (As described by Scott Morrison)

I started this journey about 13yrs ago. I would go past the field during my regular visits to the tip and stop in front of the field for a while, dreaming about what could be. At that stage my playing days had ended but I was wanting to give something back to the community that I grew up in. The State Government closed Dinmore school, the scout association closed the Dinmore/Riverview scout group and the soccer club was non-existent. I couldn't do anything about the school and the scouts but I could rebuild this club. I contacted Trevor Nardi, the sitting councillor for that division at that time to find out who was the current contact for the club. Trevor put me in contact with Lloyd Verrall and we met to discuss the club.

I had met Lloyd many times prior to this meeting. My mother was the club secretary back in the early 90's and Lloyd often visited our house to talk about the club. Lloyd and I met at the club and sat in one of the dugouts for hours one Saturday afternoon. I remember this because my legs were almost maroon with sunburn, I don't sunburn easy hence why I remember this meeting so clearly. We spoke about where the club has been and what was happening at that present time. Basically, the club existed on paper only. The clubhouse was forever being broken into so they removed the stairs so the kids couldn't get into it. Most of the break ins were just to do damage, there was nothing left to steal. Energex condemned the building so there was no electricity. Underneath the clubhouse had people sleeping in it but it was open to the elements. Needles were all over the floor and it was basically a no-go zone. He told me that they kept up the maintenance on the field themselves by coming down with their own push mowers and mowing it as best they could. The canteen block had been torn apart and someone had been sleeping in it.

Taking all of this on board I still wanted to get the club going again.

In 2009 I was at work and I saw in the Queensland Times that the Dinmore Bushrats clubhouse was burned to the ground overnight. Lloyd was quoted saying in the newspaper that the club had "Had it". (Lloyd passed away in 2012) I still had my plan to kick start the club but it was going to have to be without a clubhouse. I know that he (Lloyd) is watching over the club though, and I'm not saying that he's wandering around the field down there but there have been times that I have been there by myself marking the lines and I swear that someone is watching me, making sure the lines are straight and double marked.

So I ran a title search on the field to see who the asset belonged to and it came up with the Public Trustee. I then contacted them to speak to them about my plan to reignite the club and I wanted the field back. Unfortunately, I was too late the transfer was already well underway for the asset to be placed in the name of the Ipswich Knights & West Moreton Darts Club. I registered complaints with the Public Trustee and the State Government Ombudsman as we are the rightful owner of the land. I had a phone call from the Manager of the Ombudsman's office to advise that although sympathetic the decision to gift the land was law and I was unsuccessful. (see over)

The next step was to form a committee and register the club as an incorporated body. Once this was finalised I could look at negotiating use of the field for our club. The new owners finally came back with a no so it was on to Ipswich City Council to arrange the use of a field. Originally we were granted use of a flood lit field at Riverview State School which was leased from the Education Department by Ipswich City Council. The field is amazing, flat, a hill for spectators and lights. The trouble is there is no access to the field except through the school which would have made night games impossible. So I sat down again with Council and I was asked that if I had the choice of playing at Riverview School or our old field on Riverview Rd which would I want. Hands down I said Riverview Rd.

A return to our spiritual home, the field where so many players before us played. And we got it. The Council tabled a deal to the owners and now we have a seasonal arrangement to play there. Now we had a field, we needed a football association. Ipswich City Council went above and beyond in helping me along this journey. If it wasn't for past councillors Kerry Silver & David Morrison and Bryce Hines from ICC this would never have got off the ground.

I contacted Football Brisbane to register the club and get us back where we belong, on the field. Our application was rejected as we didn't have a ready to go field and Riverview School was not an option because they didn't want clubs playing out of schools. They told me to try Queensland Christian Soccer Association, so I did and I'm glad I did, they have been fantastic.

We received the formal green light from Council to use Riverview Rd on or about the 31st January 2018. We started advertising for players through Riverview School and Facebook and booked 2 sign on days in February. We were behind the 8 ball straight away as all other clubs in the area had already commenced sign on days but we had to make this work, we had to prove that we were the real deal and can do this. Over the 2 sign on days and a mountain of advertising we managed 23 players to form Under 6 & Under 11 teams, we were back.

That first season back was rough. We were regularly being beaten 15-0 in the under 11's and the field wasn't available for play until round 5. When we finally got to play on our home field there were no amenities just port-a-loos, a shed that didn't lock, a canteen set up under a gazebo and a big dirt line up the middle of the field from where the trench for the power cable to the darts clubhouse had sunk. But we were back and people were talking about us again. The second season back we jumped to 83 players making up U/6,7,8,11,12 and RugRats (3-5yo). The field was looking great and the toilet block was rebuilt and ready. The shed could be locked so that meant we didn't have to store all of the clubs goals ect at our homes but the canteen is still under a gazebo. We were awarded grants to buy new equipment for the club and we were awarded the organisation of the year at the Ipswich Sports Awards. 2020 was a crazy year with covid but we held our own as a club and didn't really lose any players from the previous year, but didn't gain any.

We worked hard to ensure that we were compliant with Government requirements. The association proposed a shortened 10-week competition which was great for us because we needed continuity. It would have been hard to rebuild the club from scratch again if we had to sit out a season. 2020 also saw us pick up our first on-field trophy as one of our Under 12 teams finished the season runners-up. Not a bad effort for an old yet new club. 2021 is looking very promising with approx 80 players already registered including our first senior team in many years.

We can't change the recent past, but we can learn from the mistakes made. We will continue to promote this club and stick to our business plan to ensure this club is around for many years to come. It has been nothing short of a slog getting this far, and I nearly gave up many times, but I'm so glad that I didn't. There was brick wall after brick wall but I had to remain positive and optimistic. The future is looking bright for us. People love an underdog and we are building this from nothing but a name.

Onwards and Upwards for the Mighty Dinmore Bush Rats.
