

Blackstone Rovers

Blackstone Rovers was formed in 1886.

It was reported that Sergeant Frederick Wort(1863-1932) drill instructor for the Defence force introduced Soccer to Blackstone. Sergeant Frederick Wort would be the clubs captain and players were principally drawn from those who served in the “Old Volunteers”

The original Rovers ground was directly across the creek on Lewis Thomas's land on Blackstone Road next to the now Heritage listed Welsh Church and was donated by Lewis Thomas on the condition no games would be played on a Sunday. The ground is the oldest where Soccer has been played continuously. The Welsh influence on Blackstone Rovers would continue to today with the Blackstone Welsh United

Dragons (QCSA) playing on the ground after forming in 1970.


Blackstone was known as the district of Colliers and Choristers

Rovers played in Red and then from 1904 Black striped shirts with white shorts and black socks with red tops

. The war cry was “Play up Rovers” Andrew Hamilton became the first Secretary of Blackstone Rovers and was responsible for importing the first Black and Red Guernsey's from Scotland.

Tom Barker would become the first Ipswich player selected for Queensland. Tom was secretary of The Ipswich and West Moreton Football Association,

The Ipswich Shelley brothers were also selected but they were living and playing in Brisbane at the time but move to Ipswich in 1896. Rovers would win the first Ipswich trophy in The Ipswich and West Moreton Competition in 1891 defeating Silkstone in the Final

In 1895 some players went to Dinmore Bush Rats and in 1896 the Club did not compete and its players and officials eventually joined a new club Ipswich Rovers. Ipswich Rovers would win the QBFA Challenge Cup Final and Charity Cup that year. Ipswich Rovers would become Blackstone Rovers after 1900

In 1911 Rovers changed to Rugby Union returning to Soccer in 1912

Rovers were also nicknamed the “Boo Boos”

Rovers would win 30 trophies in all until the club merged with Bundamba Rangers in 1965 to form Coalstars

Blackstone Rovers would produce twenty five players who would play for Queensland and six for Australia

Jack(Toddy)Edwards, Les Halls,Redvers Kitching,Ron Hughes,Robert Lawrie,Don Leo, Alwyn Warren.

A number of Queensland and Australian players played for Rovers including Col Kitching, Shanks,Brian(Chooky)Vogler Richard James,Redvers Kitching who represented Australia.

Two of the of the most successful Blackstone teams were the 1926 side that won the Premiership/Tristram Shield,Ipswich Challenge Cup and Special Trophy.

The side included eleven home grown players with eight born in Blackstone and three in Dinmore.

The 1953 side that won four trophies Premiership/Tristram and Hilton Shield Winners,Ambulance Shield only losing to St Helens in the Cribb and Foote Cup

Notable families who played and were administrators for Blackstone were the Dobbie,,Hughes,Williams and Woolleys

In 1970 Blackstone Welsh United Dragons (QCSA) formed,Coalstars owned the ground and played matches there and when Sunday matches were played to the annoyance of church goers in the nearby Welsh Church some ex-Rovers players bought the ground and United Dragons was born. Eric Jones and Norm Rule were instrumental in the formation of the club

Unfortunately the Blackstone Rovers Clubhouse was destroyed by arsonists







Bily Williams, who is well known as treasurer and provider of the Booval Bowling Club, and who spent 50 years in various mines in the Ipswich district, recalled during the week that he had scored for the Blackstone team before the old Coolgardie shaft was put down at Blackstone, prior to 1893

He was only a schoolboy then, but he can remember games being played in the Coolgardie paddock before the mine was flooded. It was necessary to build a drain across the playing field, so the late Lewis Thomas cleared another site and gave it to the sporting bodies. It was necessary to shift five houses which were erected on the creek bank and two near the railway line. Today that ground is still known as the Blackstone oval and is used for Soccer fixtures

Total Trophies

Grand Finals were only played from 1959. Playoffs for Premiers(not Grand Final)occurred in 1919/23/25/30/31/33/38/48/49
 Premiers are team who finished first on points table. (Grand Final wins in Brackets)

Of the leading clubs if Grand Finals instead of Premiership is the measure Hollandia/Lions number reduces by 2 and Azzurri/Brisbane City increases by 5 Hellenic reduces by 4 and Latrobe by 2

Brisbane City/Brisbane Lions won the Phillips Cup a National Competition but also fielded teams in the Brisbane Competition. Only Brisbane Trophies counted

Pre season winners included. First and second round Cup competitions included but prior to 1941 these competitions did not exist

As an example Hollandia/Lions numbers include 10 of these trophies and Brisbane City 4

During split Brisbane Ipswich competitions trophies won in both leagues included

Ipswich Clubs also continued to compete for Ipswich Challenge Cup for some years during combined competition

Under "Other" Trophies are Charity/Queensland,Brisbane,Java,Moore,Telegraph,Cribb and Foote,Ambulance,Presidents,Hospital O'Callaghan Shields,Cantle Badges,Special Competition,Duce Shield,Craven Cup,Federation Cup







First ever Brisbane team to play at Blackstone

The Thistles formed to Blackstone on Saturday to play with the local team there. The game, which was the first that has been played at Blackstone by a Brisbane team, was an exceptionally fast one. There were a large number of spectators from Ipswich and the district.

- Dave Newlands born in 1868 arrives in Australia from Scotland
- Dave Newlands (27 December 1952 Queensland Times)

Dave was born at Bathgate, between Edinburgh and Glasgow, and came to Ipswich in 1889. He took up residence in Brisbane Road, Booval, and has remained in the Booval area ever since. After a few years with Blackstone Dave, John Lovell, Jacob Tapp, and Tom Barker went to the Dinmore Bridge and formed two teams. One team played at Nunn's Paddock, and the other was called Wallabies. Next year the teams amalgamated to become New Chum Bush Rats.


- Dave was in the 1891 Blackstone Rovers Premiership team and his son Merv represented Australia and son George Queensland
- Coal Baron Lewis Thomas built 'Brynhfyryd' at Blackstone Hill. Brynhfyryd was a three-storey building
- Lewis will become President of Blackstone Rovers
- William Pitcairn was born in Clackmannanshire, Scotland. William was a Scottish Junior International
- William founded and played for Raceview Royals. He was also a long standing club and Ipswich andzMoreton committee member coach and referee. William had three sons play soccer. John, Alan and William

Senior

- **(Blackstone and Bundanba vs Brisbane) 17th September 1889**

This was the first match between Brisbane and a combined Ipswich team. The match was in aid of the Ipswich Hospital and raised two pound ten shillings. The match did not include Dinmore teams and the first Ipswich representative match.



First Interstate match(Queensland 3 v New South Wales 1) 16 August 1890

19 August 1890 Telegraph (1)

Tom Barker and Ipswich brothers George and *Sam Shelley tour

The intercolonial football match, under 'British Association rules, and between New South Wales and Queensland attracted a fair sprinkling of spectators to the Sir Joseph Banks Ground's this afternoon. The weather was beautiful, and much interest was evinced in the contest, which from the outset was keenly contested.

The rival elevens were :

Queensland Goal, J. O. Bennett; backs, R. Blake and S. Shelley ; half-back J. Brown, J M' Cosh, W Collie forwards, W. Drehorn A Brown, G Shelley, D. Menzies, A Manson.

New South Wales Goal, Logan backs, D. Reid, T. Barrington, half backs, B. Pringle, W Kidd, J. Greig; forwards T M'cCreadie, J Connolly, A Miller, E Ferguson, and J Thompson

"There was no wind, so that no advantage was gained by winning the toss. New South Wales "kicked towards the northern goal, and were not long in gaining a goal, through the instrumentality of Ferguson Alter a brief interval Queensland made matters level Manson being the successful kicker. The game thence to half time was very even, and the scores when the whistle sounded were 1 goal each, Soon after starting again, Queensland carried the ball forward, and Brown evading Logan in goal, kicked the second goal .for Queensland, and after a number of unsuccessful shots Queensland again carried the ball forward, but Logan shaped in fine style. Once more the scene of battle was in Queensland territory, but the ball was again sent to the front of Now South Wales goal, when Logan ran out to save, but collided with Menzies and fell heavily, breaking his leg While Shelley, of Queensland, left in undisputed possession of the ball, placed the third goal to the credit of the Queenslanders. Tho unfortunate accident to young Logan caused the suspension of the play ten minutes before time, and the game terminated in a "victory 'for Queensland by 3 goals to 1 Menzies who was also injured in the collision with Logan, is believed to have some of his "ribs broken."

*J Inglis was selected and played in a game at Newcastle against the Northern District then returned to Brisbane. Another full back, Lamont, was on the wharf but failed to board the ship, leaving only two reserves Instead of three. While the team was on the ship the great maritime strike started. The ship made for Newcastle and delayed the arrival of the team to Friday morning instead of Thursday. The first inter State match was played on Saturday, the day following the arrival of the team, which left little time for practice or training. At the end of the tour due to Maritime strike the players had to find their own way back to Brisbane

- Blackstone Rovers win the Ipswich Challenge Cup their first title. (Blackstone Rovers 2 Silkstone 1)
- The Ipswich and West Moreton Football Association is formed

Tom Barker was chiefly responsible for the inauguration having convened the meeting for the purpose in July of 1891 with support from AJ. Stephenson, W Stafford and William Lynch and L ("Jack") Miller.

William Kennedy is the first President The Ipswich and West Moreton Football Association lasts until 1940

- Ipswich and West Moreton withdrew from the Brisbane Competition after becoming discontented with their treatment by the QBFA
- Ipswich Challenge Cup commences and will survive until 1936


The Trophy was played for to determine the Champion team of Ipswich

When the split between Brisbane and Ipswich was resolved for the 1937 season the trophy was no longer contested.

In the absence of the President, Mr. Lovell occupied the chair, and there was a fair attendance of members. The election of officers was postponed for one month. The secretary read the balance-sheet, which showed that the club had a credit balance of £3 16s., and it was unanimously adopted. The meeting then adjourned.

Soccer enthusiasts will learn with regret of the passing of Mr. William Henry Jones, perhaps better known as "Bill Harry," who, in his day, was a renowned exponent of the game. The late Mr. Jones, who was 58 years of age, played with Blackstone Rovers over 30 years ago, and later assisted the Callbacks. He was considered one of the cleverest half backs in the West Moreton district, but he also could figure with credit in practically any position. Several times he represented Ipswich against Brisbane. As a player, Mr. Jones left behind a great reputation, but he will also be remembered as one of those who founded the present Bush Rats F.C. Until four months ago, when ill-health compelled his retirement, he was an enthusiastic follower of the code. Amongst those present at the interment were members of his old team, the Callbacks.







Queensland British Association Challenge Cup Final

Rovers vs Normans

These teams met in the Queen's Park on Saturday to decide which should be the holder of the Challenge Cup for the next twelve months. This match was rendered necessary by the fact that in the competition both clubs had obtained an equal number of points. The match evoked considerable interest, and there were about 1,000 spectators present. G. Shelly captained the Rovers, and J. Finlayson the Normans. From the start it was seen that the Rovers had the superior team. The Normans were the first to become dangerous, but with little delay the Rovers cleared their lines, and they in turn attacked the Normans' goal. Hero a corner was awarded, which was nicely kicked by Shelley, and enabled his brother to score. No sooner kicked off than the Rovers again pressed, and a bad piece of play by the Norman backs, nearly lost a goal to their side, but the ball was got away and Dreghorn put in a nice run, and passed to Anderson who shot and scored. The game up to this point had been pretty even, but the Rovers warming up, completely run through their opponents, and scored three goals in quick succession, and at half-time the score stood, Rovers 4 goals, Normans 1 goal. The game was very slow in the second half. Each side scored a goal, so that the final result was Rovers 6 goals, Normans 2 goals. For the winners, Thurstan, Barker, and the brothers Shelley played best; J. Finlayson, Blake, and Jack were the pick of the Normans. Mr J. Fowler acted as referee.

Brisbane Charity Cup won by the Ipswich Rovers

Ipswich Rovers playing under British Association rules, are to be congratulated on the great feat they have achieved—that of winning both the Challenge and Charity Cups. They played off the final tie for the latter on the Association ground at Bowen Park last Saturday, their opponents being the Rosebanks. The following were the players:—Rovers: In goal, T. Morris; full-backs, C. Marsh and I. Pryee; half-backs, R. Gee, A. Hamilton, and J. Gambling; forwards-right wing, Norman Clowes and George Shelley; centre, Sam. Shelley; left wing, J. and G. Marsh. Rosebanks: In goal, M'Coy; full-backs, T. and A. Inglis; half-backs, M'Intosh, Brown, and C. Hawker; forwards-right wing, Joe Skellern and W. Inglis; centre, J. Inglis; left wing, R. and B. Galt. A very exciting game resulted in a win for the visitors by 3 goals to 2. With the wind at their backs in the first half, the Rovers had all the best of the game—in fact, it was only on rare occasions during this period that the Rosebanks' citadel was not in a state of siege. After about twenty minutes' hard play Sam Shelley drew first blood for the Rovers. Another ten minutes had gone by when Joe Marsh sent the sphere between the sticks, and about ten minutes before the whistle sounded for the usual spell George Marsh scored the third goal for the Bovers. Just prior to halftime, the Rosebanks broke away with a rush, the ball was taken right up to the Bovers' goal, and J. Inglis sent it through. Rovers, 3 goals; Rosebanks, 1. With the wind in their favour in the second half the Rosebanks persistently attacked the Rovers' territory. But the latter's defence was good, and though their opponents were continually down on them for about half-an-hour they only got another goal, this being secured by J. Inglis a minute or two after the kick-off. When the Rosebanks were so pressing in their attentions the Rover captain, George Shelley, very wisely brought his brother Sam back to the rear division. Towards the end of the game the Rovers again assumed the aggressive, and when time was called they were giving their opponents all they could do to hold their own. All the winners strove hard to gain the coveted cup, the two Shelleys being about the cream of the team; while the losers, too, made a big bid for victory. Mr. T. Jenkinson was referee, and Messrs. A. Rankin and J. Fowler linesmen. News of the success of the Rovers was first received in Blackstone by pigeon post, Messrs. Jacob and William Tapp despatching birds from the ground when each goal was scored and at halftime and full time. The Rovers deserve congratulation on their success. They began the season badly; but, once they started on their career of wins, they went on with an unbroken record. They were only beaten on the playing-field once (by the Normans), and have won ten games, scoring, we believe, 40 goals against 16 to the credit of opponents. And this is only the first year of the Rover's existence.

Keen interest was evinced in the decision of the British Association football match between the Rangers and Rovers, for the badges presented by Mr. W. Haskings, licensee of the Race-horse Hotel, Bundamba

The following were the teams :

Rovers (black-and-red) - W. Follett (goal-keeper) G. Law and W. L. (backs) R Jones, F. A. Perry (half-backs) and W Halls, G. Taylor, J. Follett, D. Halls, and A. Shelton (forwards).

Rangers (light blue)-A. Harrison(goal-keeper) T. Hauck and O Watkins(backs) A Shanks, J Kitchen, Molloy (half-backs); T Kennedy, G Bullock J.W.Taylor, S. Bullock, and F. Shanks (forwards).

The Rovers kicked off, and immediately-afterwards the Rangers were hard pressed. They defended skilfully, however, and a few minutes afterwards, the ball was sent flying in the direction of their opponents' goal. The- Rangers forwards took up the attack, which eventually resulted in a goal' being kicked by G. Bullock--Rangers 1, Rovers nil. The ball in play again, it seemed as if the. loss of a goal had infused new life into the Rovers. Previous tactical methods on the part ofthe Rovers' forwards the leather was sent slowly, but surely, in the direction of the Rangers' goal. The "lightblues' " defence, however, was sound. The Rovers continued to force, and after about five minutes, a weakness in the Rangers' line of defence was availed of by J. Follett, who shot the ball between the two posts with remarkable celerity-Rangers 1, Rovers 1. On the resumption of play, the Rangers made a valiant attempt to secure another goal, but it was checkmated by some smart work on the part of their opononents' goal-keeper. Even -play followed, the ball moving up and down the field, and each team defending and then attacking. The "red-and-blacks then became agreeessive and very soon D. Halls recordod another goal--Rovers 2. Rangers 1. The half-time whistle blew not long afterwards with the scores unchanged. The second half opened with a more hopeful outlook for an exciting game. The play of both teams sparkled with brilliancy, and there was not laggerd on either side. Though the individual mem-hers of the Rangers' team played in a praiseworthy manner, yet the team, as a whole, seemed to be outclassed in the matter of combination. The forwards of both teams exhibited remarkablefeats with respect to passing. Even play ruled for some time. At about 18 minutes ,before full time, the Rangersbecame very aggressive, and as the result of some very neat play, obtained what appeared to be a goal, but which, in reality, was not a goal, as the referee's whistle sounded before the ball was kicked. The Rangers were not satisfied with the decision of the referee and left the field.

The spectators,for the most part, were as concerned as the players, and the scene was one of great excitement


They were delivered in May, 1913. Originally seating capacity was 75; this was later reduced to 69, 55 in the main section and 14 in the 'smoker'. Although popular on the United States Union Pacific and Southern Railroads, the McKeen Cars failed to meet QR's expectations. All five units were written off between 1929 and 1931 and broken up soon after at the Ipswich workshops.

Before the big match started it was reported that the Australian players took decided objection to Edwards being dropped for Mitchell. They adopted their attitude on the principle that once a player was selected he should play. It was stated that the team would not go on without Edwards and the officials were at once confronted with a delicate situation. Conferences took place, and it was finally resolved by the Australian executive, by nine votes to two, that Edwards should play. The news of the dispute caused something of a sensation and was the cause of free and outspoken comment. The Press were informed that Edwards refused to stand down in favour of Mitchell. The voting shows that this action was officially endorsed'

Toddy was again selected for Australia in 1927 for matches against Chinese XI and Bohemians (Czechoslovakia)

Jacob Tapp (1856) (See separate slide)

Jacob Tapp (1856-1928) and Louis (1930)

Jacob and Louise arrived in Australia from England on the “Westerall”

Sons were Jacob, Robert, Thomas, Robert Dauhgter Levia

Jacob Senior played in the first ever Blackstone Rovers team in 1886. He also played for Callbacks and later was a referee

In 1894 Jacob's homing pigeons brought the result of a match in Brisbane back to Blackstone

The first time a result was known in Ipswich immediately after the match

Sons Jake (-1956) and Robert played for Blackstone Rovers and were in the 1904 Challenge Cup winning team

Son Thomas (1893-1918) played for Booval Stars, Dinmore Bush Rats and Bundamba Rangers

Thomas served in WW1 but was killed in France in 1918

Son Robert(1890-1944) played for Bundamba Rangers and was in the 1914 Premiership team. He also represented Ipswich in 1909

Levia married John Duck and Son Thomas who was a WW2 Veteran played for Blackstone Rovers.

Roberts's son Jake (1913-1971) Jake was a member of Bundamba School premiership team 1926 played for Rustlers and Blackstone Rovers and was in the 1934 Dinmore Wanderers Premiership team and played seventeen times for Ipswich and for Queensland in 1935. Jake was a committee member of Bundamba Rangers and a trainer and selector for Wattles FC. Jake signed for Granville in Sydney in 1936 but returned to Ipswich in 1937



ROVERS' RECORD

Soccer's most unobtrusive official is Bert Dobbie, quiet, hard-working secretary for "ace" team of the season to date, Blackstone Rovers. For the past 15 seasons he has been the man behind the gun of what has proved to be a buttress club to Soccer's vicissitudes over the years.

No secretary in the code's ambit to-day has seen his club go to the top of the tree with the brilliance that won premiership and Tristram Shield honors for Rovers in 1926, and then fade to insignificance, only to return to stardom 14 years later.

As a player, Bert was solid enough to hold a place in the half-back line when those former Queensland stars, Les. Halls, "Fatty" Williams, "Bunny" Nunn, Vic. Hamilton, and the inimitable "Toddy" Edwards played their way into maroon jerseys, leaving club mates Roy Woolley, Johnny Woolley, Fred Poulton, "Poona" Edwards, Jack Clarkson, and "Craddy" Evans to bellow themselves hoarse as the Maroons dusted the visiting Cornstalks of 1926 for 5-4 and 2-0 wins. Five men in the State team! And what a five!

To-day the club's might rests on the brightest bunch of youngsters assembled in the one club. Cracking pace, naive manoeuvre, and the true never-say-die spirit, has left them the only undefeated team of the season so far.

Brightest young star is Bob Lawrie, team pivot, who isn't old enough yet to get the key to the front door from dad—the club's president—but who capped schoolboy honors with Queensland representation as a junior and senior before winning International spurs as right half for Australia against the team from Palestine last season.

"Fat" Kitching, Ipswich rep. for nine seasons, three times State and Australian rep. last season, provides the headpiece that sets in motion those former school and junior stars, Jack Trevis, Frank Woolley, Merv. Haswell, George Williams, Jim Rush, Tom Duck, Vince Campbell, Cec. Evans and John Bruce who, between them, have chalked up 19 goals while the four opposing teams have mustered only eight. That's a tally for any team to crow about.



BLACKSTONE TO STAGE WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

Women's Soccer football, so popular in Brisbane for a time in the early 20's, is being revived in the Ipswich district. Both Blackstone Rovers and Bundamba Rangers have formed teams which will begin playing at Blackstone on Friday night September 25. The match will be played on Rover's ground in Thomas Street, Blackstone, under floodlight. [Blackstone is one of the few football clubs in Queensland which owns the freehold of its own ground. Floodlight equipment was installed several years ago.] Women players including wives, sisters, and finances of well-known Ipswich Soccer men, have been in strict training each Thursday night the last four weeks for the big event. She is the daughter of a Bundamba club committeeman, Bill Dixon, and has starred as a sprinter in local athletic events.

Other Bundamba players will include Agnes Batching wife of a former First Division player, Cedric latching, and Irene Powell, an Ipswich shop assistant. Both live in Brisbane Road, Bundamba. In Blackstone's XX Shirley Hughes, sister of well-known Blackstone players, Bon and Col Hughes, will be striving hard to uphold the family's high reputation in local Soccer. Among other Blackstone players will be East Street (Ipswich) residents, Maureen Leo, wife of Donald Leo, Australia's goalkeeper in the Second Test against the Chinese, and Doreen Woolley, wife of another senior player, Errol Woolley.
