and devotion to duty in the attack on Hindenburg Line South of Reincourt on 11th April, 1917. He brought in wounded over ground swept by enemy Machine guns and controlled by enemy snipers who showed no respect to Stretcher Bearers and it was entirely due to the noble efforts of the stretcher bearers that over fifty of our wounded were brought back to our lines a distance of a half mile. He was noticed for gallant work at Pozieres in August, 1916

George and his father and brothers were the proprietors of the Gilson Brick and Pipeworks at Ebbw Vale
