The affair was taken in hand by the following committee:—Messrs. W. J. Lynch (chairman), John Stafford, Mat. Bailey, T. Schofield, J. Lowe, A. Stewart, T. Burns, J. Tedman, sen., and J. Roberts, with Mr. J. Tedman, jun., as hon. secretary, and as everyone worked energetically towards making the function worthy of the traditions of Dinmore, the undertaking was a pronounced success. The catering was in the capable hands of Mr. Isaac Ham, and was faithfully carried out. The hall was tastefully decorated, and two long tables extended the whole length of the room. So numerous was the attendance that the accommodation was entirely inadequate, and two sittings had necessarily to take place before all were satisfied. Mr. W. J. 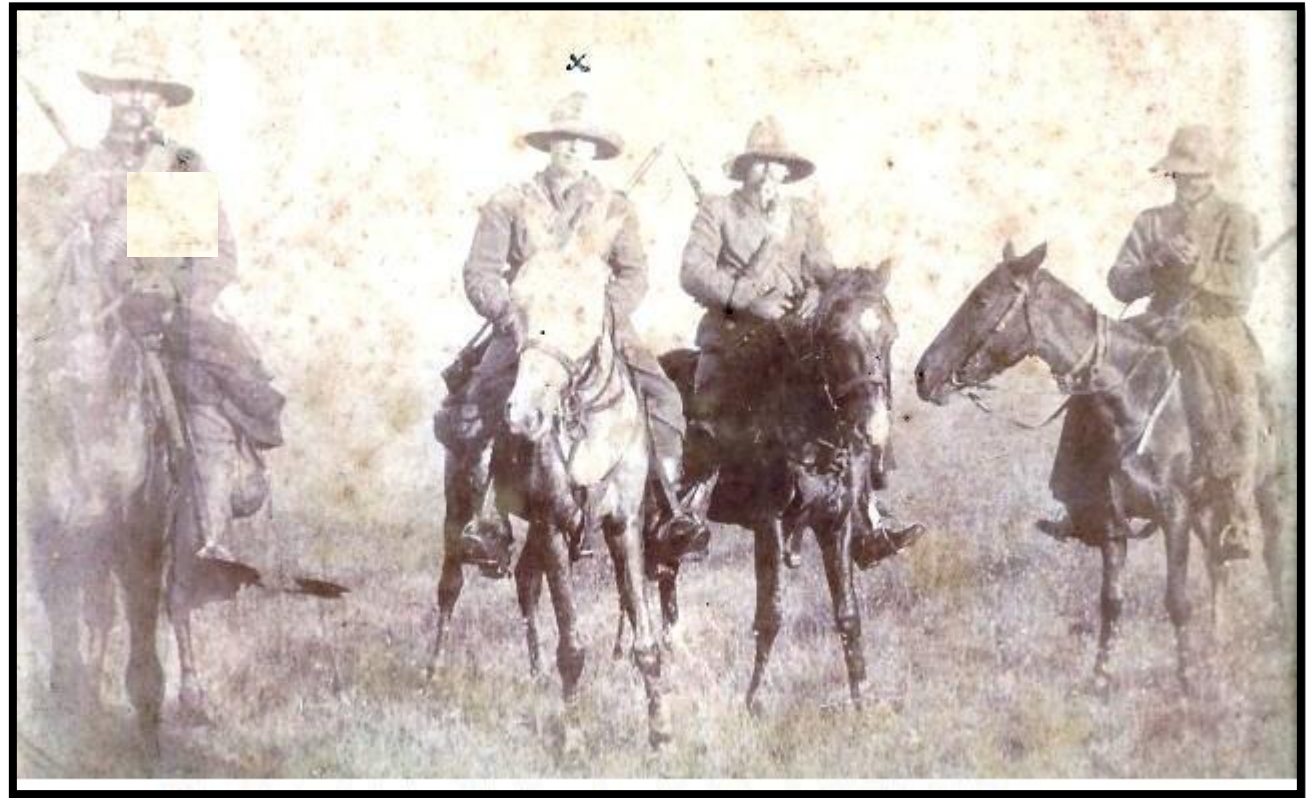

### **Football and War**

#### **No "Soccer" Competitions.**

**18<sup>th</sup> February** *Telegraph (Brisbane, Qld)*

*At a special meeting of representatives of clubs in the Queensland British Football Association held on Wednesday, to give consideration to the prospects of the ensuing season, the following motion was : carried: "That all competition matches in the senior, first and second grades, be abandoned for the season of 1916 ; that no player of military age be allowed to play in the lower grades; and that this be a recommendation for consideration at the annual meeting." The secretary (Mr Ross) informed the meeting that he had been communicating with Mr. Gibb, the association's representative in England'; in regard to getting in touch with any , Queensland soccer players, who may be lying in any of the hospitals in England, . wounded or ill, and Mr. Gibb had agreed to do so, Mr. Ross, invited clubs to forward the names of any player who; may be in hospital in England, and he would forward them on to Mr. Gibb.*
