



AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S SOCCER ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

- The Australian Championship is open to teams representing State Associations which are affiliated with the AWSA.
- All players taking part in this tournament must be registered as players with Associations affiliated to the State Association they represent.
- This tournament adopts the Laws of the Game as contained in the Referees'
 Chart and Players Guide to the Laws of the Game (current edition) as
 published by the Football Association (England) and as modified by these
 playing rules.
- 4. A size 5 ball shall be used in all games.
- Duration of game shall be 2 x 35 minute halves, half time no less than 5 minutes, no more than 10 minutes. Injury time may be allowed at the referee's discretion.
- 5. Teams will consist of no more than 18 players and 4 officials.
- 7. Three substitutes may be used at any time during the game,
- Should a team bring 18 players to the Championship then they will be allowed to list 7 reserves on the team sheet — only 3 of whom may be used in any one game.
- Each participating State Association is required, wherever possible, to have a second strip in case of colour clash.
- Should there be a colour clash then the AWAY team will be required to change their strip.
- 11. Points shall be awarded on the following basis Win (2), Draw (1), Loss (0).
- Each team shall play each other team once, and the team with the highest points shall be declared the Champions.
- 13. In the event of teams being equal on points at the end of the Championship then goal difference will decide the order of finish. If goal difference is the same, then the team with most wins will be placed higher in the Championship table. Should the number of wins be equal then the team which has scored the most goals will be placed higher. If goals scored are equal, they will be joint placegetters.
- If for any reason a State reports that it cannot field a team on a certain day during the tournament, then the opposing team shall be awarded 2 goals and 2 points.
- Neutral referees shall be used wherever possible. All State Associations will be invited to nominate a referee.
- Trophies and medals for winners and runners-up are to be supplied by the AWSA. Perpetual trophies remain the property of the AWSA.
- Players shirt numbers are to remain constant throughout the tournament.
 Any alterations to the printed program must be notified to the organisers prior to the first game.
