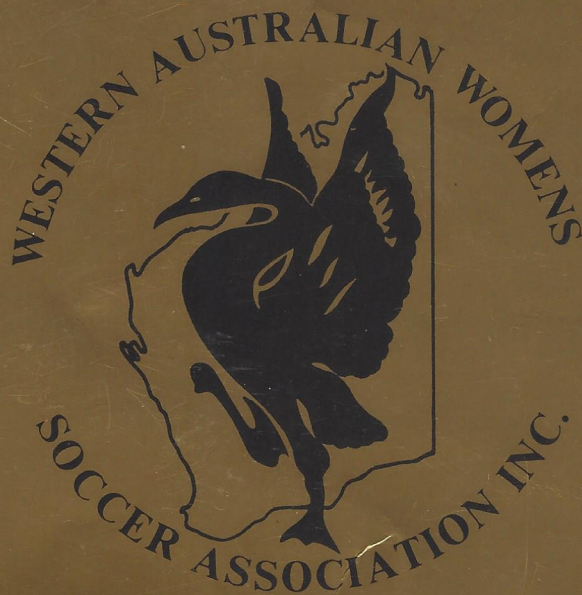


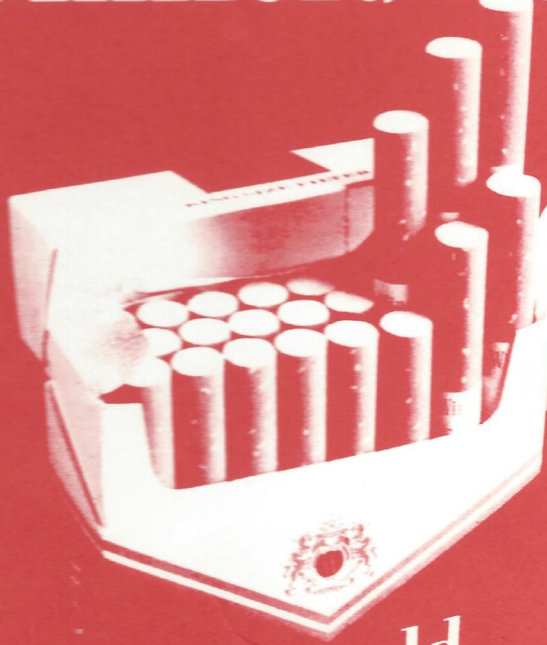

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S SOCCER ASSOCIATION

CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

1. The Australian Women's Soccer Championship is open to teams representing State Associations which are affiliated with the Australian Women's Soccer Association.
2. All players taking part in this tournament must be registered as players with Associations affiliated to the State Association they represent.
3. 18 players only are permitted to participate in this tournament from each recognised State Association.
4. F.I.F.A. rules will apply - with the exceptions listed in these rules.
5. 3 substitutes may be used at any time during the game.
6. A size 5 ball shall be used in all games. Balls supplied by the Home State.
7. This tournament adopts the laws of the game as contained in the Referees' Chart and Players Guide to the Laws of the Game - current edition - as published by the Football Association - England - and as modified by these playing rules.
8. Each participating State Association is required, wherever possible, to have a second strip in case of colour clash.
9. Names of players shall be sent to the Secretary of the A.W.S.A. prior to the tournament. Names of Coach and Manager/ess and other officials should also be included, plus team colours and alternate colours. These details should also be sent to the organisers of the tournament.
10. Duration of game - 2 x 35 minute halves, half time no less than 5 minutes, no more than 10 minutes.
11. Points; 2 points for a win. 1 point for a draw. No points for a loss. In the event of teams being equal, goal difference will decide. If goal difference is the same, then the teams with most wins will be the winners; should the number of wins be equal then the team which has scored the most goals will be the winners; if goals scored equal, they will be joint holders.
12. If for any reason a State reports that it cannot field a team on a certain day during the tournament, then the opposing team shall be awarded 2 goals and 2 points.
13. Each State competing in the tournament shall be liable for their own travel, food and accommodation costs. The Home State shall be liable for all running costs of the tournament, and their own team costs. A perpetual trophy remains. The Home State shall also be liable for field accessories.
14. The 4th/5th day of the tournament shall be a 'rest-day', at the discretion of the Home State.
15. Neutral referees shall be used wherever possible; therefore selected State Associations will be invited to nominate and travel with a referee, who will be a member of the referees' panel for each Championship.
16. Trophies for winners and runners-up are to be supplied by the A.W.S.A.
17. Players shirt numbers to be in accordance with printed programme throughout the tournament.
18. Should a team bring 18 players to the Championships then they will be allowed to list 7 reserves on the team sheet - only 3 of whom may be used in any one game. (see rule 5).

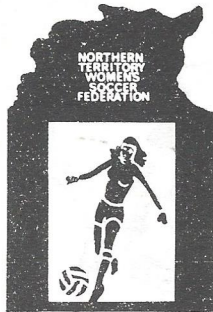

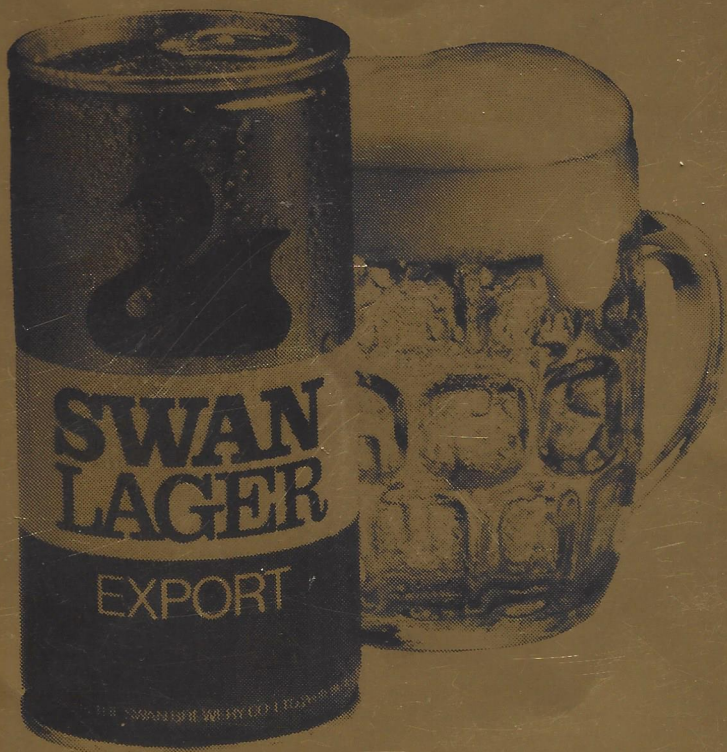
