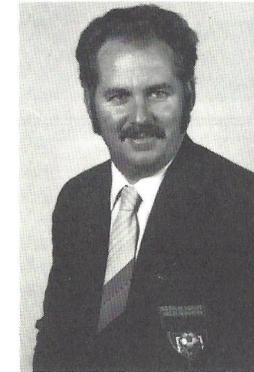

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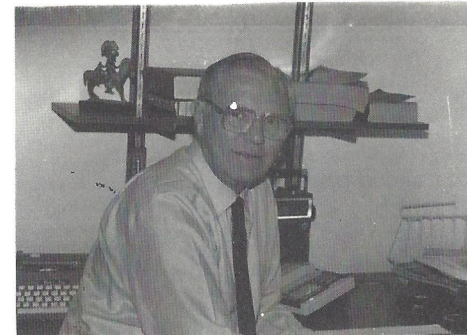
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FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.

She is completely at home between the sticks, and her size is no disadvantage in her agility, with the reflexes of a cat. She also plays Touch Footy - Cricket & Volley Ball in the off season, though prefers her role as a Goalie where her ability gains her extra height.
2. Mary Helen Burke: Age 19. Sweeps back into State after a break from Rep football, to collect her 2nd State Cap. Led the U/15 team in Brisbane in 1981 and made her debut with the Seniors in 1982:- She's a player who's always thinking ahead, & a powerful defender. Her 6 years playing experience has been played in the halves and back where she never shirks her responsibility: Has loads of potential.
3. Susan Buswell: Age 23. A soccer player of 12 years standing-She had 7 State Caps to her credit in Sydney in 1981. Having been named in the "Australian Squad" has had a break of (3 years) from Rep. Soccer, but it now determined to pick up from where she left off. She has played most of her career in the backs with plenty of skill and reads the game well to enable her to turn defence into attack. A dedicated player.
4. Karen Menzies: Age 22. Gains her 7th State Cap for N.N.S.W. in eight years of play. Travelled with the "National Squad" to Noumea in 1983 for the "Oceania Cup". She is a very useful Utility Player, with ability to play several positions on the field, using either foot in midfield or as a Central defender, she has a built in compulsion to score goals, but is happy just to be on the field. She is an aggressive tackler but a 100% Soccer Player.

Being the longest serving State Rep player for the Magpies - A two footed-forward, with either a power packed drive, or a placement around the goalie always seeking the back of the net like a true Striker - First named in Darwin in 1979 as a "Future Player for Australia" - made the "Australian Squad" the next year in Adelaide in 1980. Travelled with the "National Team" to Noumea in 1983 for the "Oceania Cup", again - Hawaii 1983 - Last year again to China 1984 and Taiwan 1984 for the world Womens Invitation Tournament: A great Team Player, giving 100% to the game she loves.

Has represented the Hunter Region + N.S.W. in the combined High Schools Soccer. As she enters her 7th year of soccer, she is reaching her peak form. She has played right half but excells as a goal keeper, where her ability and tenacity shows no fear, as she defends her area with very safe hands. Gives 100% with a great attitude to the game.
 15. Deborah Saunders: Age 24. Began playing soccer in 1979 and picked up her 1st State Cap same year in Darwin: Took time out of Rep Sport to travel overseas where she managed to see many of the major games in England and Europe. Returned last season to soccer 1984 though unavailable for Reps: Available this year, she gains her 2nd State Cap playing as if she has never left off playing, which now gives her a total of 5 yrs in soccer. Gives 100% as a non stop player and great team player. She loves tackle and is a prolific defender - Worth watching.
 16. Monique Sutherland: Age 19. Although she has been playing soccer for 12yrs she couldn't make herself available to State, as Hockey State Rep claimed her from 81-84 also the (Australian 16 yrs team in 1981) with a litter persuasion this year she will now gain her 1st State Soccer Cap - She plays half-forward for her club & reps, & reads the game expertly, and any loose ball coming her way will find the net. A great Team player and Sportswomen.
 17. Sharon Dewar: Age 24. A Teacher, and a great athlete, being a State Rep for N.S.W.C.A.E. from 79-81 for Soccer-Hockey-Touch Football & Athletics (cross country) Moving to the Central Coast she resumed her Soccer career and now gets her 1st State Cap for N.N.S.W. She plays midfield forward for her club, and midfield centre in Reps: She uses either foot, with accurate ball distribution, a great reader of the game, not afraid to tackle, makes an all round Team Player:

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S SOCCER ASSOCIATION
CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

1. The Australian Championship is open to teams representing State Associations which are affiliated with the AWSA.
2. All players taking part in this tournament must be registered as players with Associations affiliated to the State Association they represent.
3. This tournament adopts the Laws of the Game as contained in the Referees' Chart and Players Guide to the Laws of the Game (current edition) as published by the Football Association (England) and as modified by these playing rules.
4. A size 5 ball shall be used in all games.
5. Duration of game shall be 2 x 35 minute halves, half time no less than 5 minutes, no more than 10 minutes. Injury time may be allowed at the referee's discretion.
6. Teams will consist of no more than 18 players and 4 officials.
7. Three substitutes may be used at any time during the game.
8. Should a team bring 18 players to the Championship then they will be allowed to list 7 reserves on the team sheet - only 3 of whom may be used in any one game.
9. Each participating State Association is required, wherever possible, to have a second strip in case of colour clash.
10. Should there be a colour clash then the AWAY team will be required to change their strip.
11. Points shall be awarded on the following basis - Win (2) Draw (1), Loss (0).
12. Each team shall play each other team once, and the team with the highest points shall be declared the Champions.
13. In the event of teams being equal on points at the end of the Championship then goal difference will decide the order of finish. If goal difference is the same, then the team with most wins will be placed higher in the Championship table. Should the number of wins be equal then the team which has scored the most goals will be placed higher. If goals scored are equal, they will be joint placegetters.
14. If for any reason a State reports that it cannot field a team on a certain day during the tournament, then the opposing team shall be awarded 2 goals and 2 points.
15. Neutral referees shall be used wherever possible. All State Associations will be invited to nominate a referee.
16. Trophies and medals for winners and runner-ups are to be supplied by the AWSA. Perpetual trophies remain the property of the AWSA.
17. Players shirt numbers are to remain constant throughout the tournament. Any alterations to the printed program must be notified to the organisers prior to the first game.
