

The National Championships return to Adelaide for the 2nd time and mark the 8th year of participation by S.A. in the Championships. Unfortunately, the 13th National Championship will take place without West Australia which is a foundation State and without doubt their absence will affect all participants.

The 13th Championships have been revised to accommodate 8 teams in a compact draw and for the first time the AWSA will trial a Challenge series at the completion of the main Championships. 



TERI MCQUEEN (27yrs) A dedicated player in defence who gives 100% whether training or playing the game. Teri's dedication paid off when she was chosen to represent Australia for the first time last year. Other sporting interest is Touch Football. MARIA RODGERS (17yrs) This is Maria's first year as a senior rep player. One of our younger players

who has come up through the ranks of the Under 15's and Under 17's State teams. Maria, a very cool customer is at home in all three lines.

GAYLE SCHNEIDER (23yrs) This is Gayle's second year in the Queensland team. A willing midfielder and a good player. She gained valuable experience in the state team last year. Gayle enjoys softball and squash.

LYN SPENCER (27yrs) Another totally dedicated player who gives a top performance every game. Lyn controls the game from the midfield through skill, determination and great distribution of the ball. This is her eighth year with the Qld. team.

STEPHANIE MCMAHON (24yrs) Steph is our most experience utility player, this year concentrating mainly on the midfield and forwards. A very fit player with devastating speed. This is Steph's fourth year with the Qld. team, and she has represented Australia in indoor soccer in 1985.

KLARA SZABA (20yrs) A very solid striker in her second year with the Qld. team. Klara has an ability to shoot the ball from any angle leaving many a goalkeeper stunned. Other sporting interest are athletics and softball.

JOANNE MILLMAN (24yrs) A dynamic defender who gives 100% to the sport she loves whether it's training, playing or coaching juniors. This is Jo's 7th year for Qld. and she was a very worth recipient of the Qld. Associations "Player of the Year" in 1985. She has travelled to Noumea, Hawaii, China, Taiwan and New Zealand from 1983-85 with the Australian team.

LEANNE PRIESTLEY (22yrs) A very dangerous striker with a very high scoring rate. Her ability to create a goal from any area of the field is uncanny. At home in any position on the field, she reads the game to perfection, and is a great distributor of the ball. Connie has represented Australia from 1978-83.

DONNA FREDRICKSEN (26yrs) The find of 1985 for Qld. Donna is a very speedy player with untapped potential, who adapts to any position whe is called upon to play. This will be her second year representing Qld.

LEONIE YOW YEH (25yrs) A very fast and cunning forward who loves to run. Given half a chance, she will put the ball in the back of the net. Leonie represented Qld. in 1980. This year is her first serious attempt since then.

MICHELLE SAWYERS (25yrs) Out longest playing member, Michelle has been playing for Qld. since 1974. A player who lives for her soccer and her family. She sets herself a very rigorous standard for training and games. Michelle has represented Australia in Hawaii. KAYLEEN JANSSEN (17yrs) Has spent long hard years coming through the ranks of the U/15's and U/17 State teams. Named in the Carnival Allstars in 1982 and '85 Kayleen has matured into an agressive attacking midfielder. This will be her 1st year in the senior ranks. 

CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

- 1. The Australian Championship is open to teams representing State Associations which are affiliated with the AWSA.
- 2. All players taking part in this tournament must be registered as players with Associations affiliated to the State Association they represent.
- 3. This tournament adopts the Laws of the Game as contained in the Referees' Chart and Players Guide to the Laws of the Game (current edition) as published by the Football Association (England) and as modified by these playing rules.
- 4. A size 5 ball shall be used in all games.
- 5. Duration of games shall be 2 x 35 minutes halves, half time no less than 5 minutes, no more than 10 minutes. Injury time may be allowed at the referee's discretion.
- 6. Teams will consist of no more than 18 players and 4 officials.
- 7. 3 substitutes may be used at any time during the game.
- 8. Should a team bring 18 players to the Championship then they will be allowed to list 7 reserves on the team sheet only 3 of whom may be used in any one game.
- 9. Each participating State Association is required, wherever possible, to have a second strip in case of colour clash.
- 10. Should there be a colour clash then the AWAY team will be required to change their strip.
- 11. Points shall be awarded on the following basis Win (2), Draw (1), Loss (0).
- 12. Each team shall play each other once, and the team with the highest points shall be declared the Champions.

- 13. In the event of teams being equal on points at the end of the Championships then goal difference will decide the order of finish. If goal difference is the same, then the team with most wins will be placed higher in the Championship table. Should the number of wins be equal then the team which has scored the most goals will be placed higher. If goals scored are equal, they will be joint placegetters.
- 14. If for any reason a State reports that it cannot field a team on a certain day during the tournament, then the opposing team shall be awarded 2 goals and 2 points.
- 15. Neutral referees shall be used wherever possible. All State Associations will be invited to nominate a referee.
- 16. Trophies and medals for winners and runners-up are to be supplied by the AWSA. Perpetual trophies remain the property of the AWSA.
- 17. Players shirt numbers are to remain constant throughout the tournament. Any alterations to the printed program must be notified to the organisers prior to the first game.
- 18. After receiving 3 yellow cards during the tournament, a player must be automatically suspended for one game.
- 19. Any suspension imposed under Rule 18 and/or a red card offence shall be for championship games only and can be carried forward if necessary to the next championship.
