

'Becoming a Habit,' says Lord

Mayor in Welcome

"This is becoming a habit," said the Lord Mayor, Cr. F. Selleck, in welcoming the Rapid Soccer team at a civic reception at Melbourne Town Hall on Tuesday.

He was referring to the welcoming of visiting Soccer

"Only a fortnight ago we welcomed the South China team, and I believe there will be another visiting team here later in the season, I imagine we will welcome them, too," he said.

"We realise that Soccer is the type of football to be played at the Olympic Cames next year." He said that he had discussed it with the Austrian Manager, Mr. Gold, and felt it was a pity that some of the Austrians could not stay here, return to amateurism, and he enrolled in the Australian side.

"I never was very clear on the definitions of professionals and amateurs, but I am told it cannot be done," he said with a smile.

Cr. Selleck said he visited Vienna two years ago and thoroughly enjoyed his fortnight's stay. He hoped that the Austrians enjoyed their visit to Melbourne as much.

He was pleased to welcome any overseas team here if it was to improve the standard of Australian sport, and he was sure that the Rapid team would do that.


