- R. KELLY (20), talented goalkeeper, graduated from Queensland schoolboys and juniors, gained representative honours this year.
- G. HUGHES (24), right-back, solid, reliable defender.
- J. RODERICK (19), left-back, under 18 Queensland representative, very promising fast player.
- S. DEDMAN (21), right-half, the solitary Englishman in a team of Australians. Queensland representative, ex-Azzurri, tireless worker.
- G. KATHAGE (31), centre-half and captain, with 38 Queensland representative honours to his credit, plus three Tests for Australia against Hearts of Midlothian. Shrewd, first-class defender.
- B. PARKES (18), left-half, ex-Queensland schoolboy and captain and chockful of promise.

- R. HUGHES (21), right-wing, another Queensland schoolboy and junior player. Fast, prolific goal-scorer.
- B. PAYNE (19), inside-right, twin brother of centre-forward, from ranks of Queensland schoolboys and junior. Dangerous, intelligent forward.
- T. PAYNE (19), centre-forward, free-scoring forward with both feet. Always a danger in front of goal.
- I. JOHNSTONE (18), inside-left, possibly the most promising Queensland player, has represented the State for schoolboys, juniors and seniors. The man to watch.
- N. PEUT (20), outside left, another graduate from Queensland schoolboys and juniors. Extremely fast and strong shooter for goal.
- J. DAVIS, handy utility player in goal or field.
- C. SMITH, defence replacement.

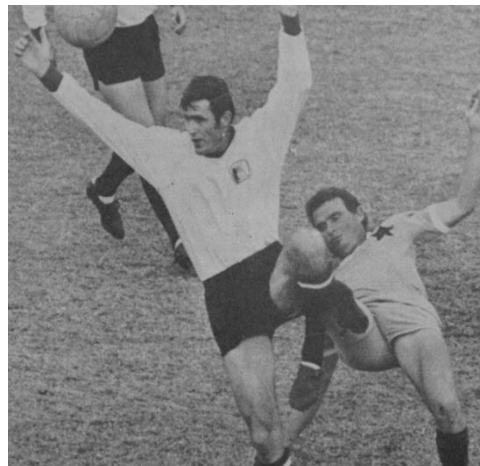

Coalstars won the first part of Queensland's soccer treble with a thrilling 3-2 win over North Star in the Ampol Cup final at Perry Park.

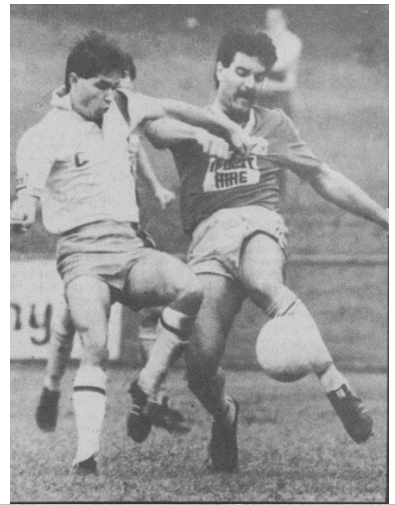
It was 21 years since the Bundamba club last won the statewide knockout trophy. Coalstar's win thwarted North Star's hopes of a third consecutive cup victory. Despite the wet weather, a huge crowd turned out for the match which turned into a classic final.

North Star lead 1-0 at halftime after a good goal from Billy Williamson, but a Mark Brusasco chip five minutes after the break levelled terms. Another chip, this time from Murray Kitching put Coalstars ahead but North Star showed their character to comeback through a well worked goal involving Alan Marley and finally Ross Swan.

The winner came when Dave Wheeler played a fine ball for Andy Ogden to fire a low shot under North Star keeper Noel Lord.

In the earlier Ampol challenge match, Taringa Rovers beat Lions 2-1. Rovers' goalscorers were Marty Ratcliffe and Rob Kirby while Jarrod Austin netted Lions' effort.

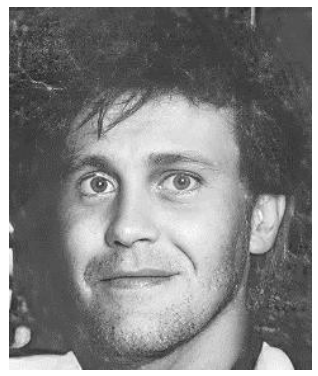

1 KIM WISHART: Age 30. Former Queensland and Brisbane City NSL player who last year returned to Coalstars to make a comeback from a broken leg.

2 MARK McNAUGHTON. Age 31. Led his side to triumph in Cup final last year but has been troubled by a knee injury this season, playing only a handful of games.

3 IAN LAWRIE: Age 30. Experienced defender who returned to Bundamba to finish his career after spells at Ipswich United and Lions. Dead ball expert.

4 STU WESTON: Age 25. Versatile and underrated player who has filled in in a variety of roles this season. Determined tackler who never gives up.

5 ALAN McFARLANE: Age 18. Former Acacia Ridge junior who has stamped himself as an honest defender since moving to Coalstars. Rookie of the Year last season.

6 FRANK BYRNE: Age 21 Another who has done a job this season in a number of positions. Former Lions player who had a stint at Taringa before moving to Bundamba.

7 DALE DAWES: Age 19. Former Townsville

player who came to notice in State Youth teams. A reliable defender who is being groomed for the future.

8 ANDY OGDEN: Age 24. One of the hardest working players in Brisbane. A Lions junior who won a grand final with Olympic before moving to Coalstars.

9 MARK BRUSASCO: Age 26. Starred for Queensland this season in finally showing the potential he promised for many years. Played previously with Brisbane City, Easts and Ipswich United.

10 DAVID RICHARDSON: Age 27. Came to Coalstars mid-way through the season when Dave Wheeler went to Lions. An Irish import who thrives on turning the halfchange into a goal.

11 DARREN FREIBERG: Age 16. Represented Australia in the Junior World Cup finals in Canada a month ago. A tough defender from Townsville who came to Bundamba this year.

12 BRAD KEARTON: Age 21. Gave the game away at beginning of the year but has been coaxed back and beginning to find all his goal-scoring form. Scored on his NSL debut with Lions.

13 BRUCE PENMAN: Age 29. Midfield worker who never stops. Determined tackler who returned to Bundamba after a long stint at nearby Ipswich United.

14 JOHN COUSIN: Age 21. Scottish Second Division player signed only two months ago. Normally a defender but has been playing with success in midfield.

15 DAVID O'LEARY: Age 24. A consistent player who has been a fine clubman and squad member. Always ready to come off the bench and fill a spot anywhere on the park.

20 BRENT DIFLO: Age 27. Starred for Coalstars in all the big games last season, including the Cup final. Went overseas this year and now is waiting for his opportunity to get back into the first team.

COACH — BRIAN STYLES: Scotsman who was firstly at Ipswich United before switching to Coalstars and taking the team to triumph last year. A good motivator and thinker of the game.

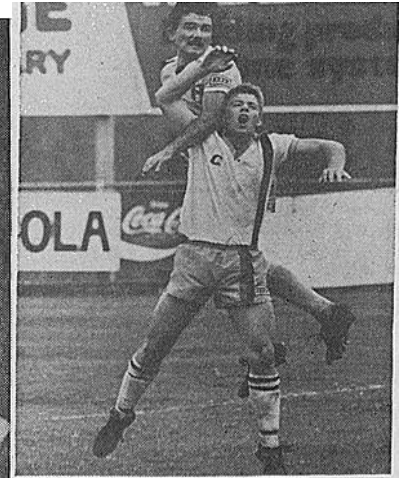

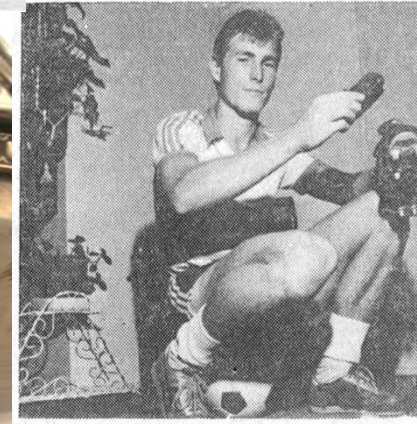

Andrew played for Dinmore Bush Rats, Brisbane Lions, Olympic and Coalstars

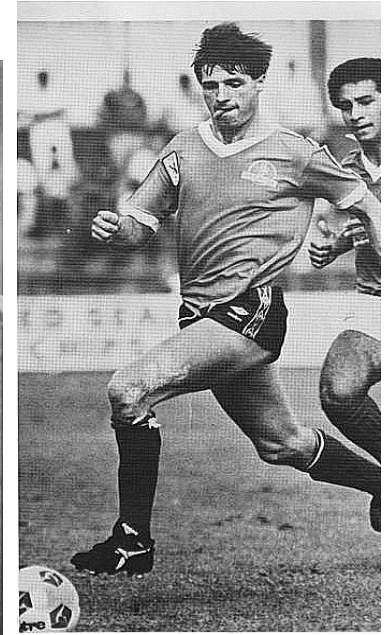
He scored the winning goal in the 1983(Olympic)1986 (Coalstars) Grand Final. Coalstars also won the Ampol Cup in 1986 and 1987
