Blackstone Rovers

Blackstone Rovers was formed in 1886.

It was reported that Sergeant Frederick Wort(1863-1932) drill instructor for the Defence force introduced Soccer to Blackstone.Sergeant Frederick Wort would be the clubs captain and players were principally drawn from those who served in the “Old Volunteers”

The original Rovers ground was directly across the creek on Lewis Thomas's land on Blackstone Road next to the now Heritage listed Welsh Church and was donated by Lewis Thomas on the condition no games would be played on a Sunday.The ground is the oldest where Soccer has been played continuously The Welsh influence on Blackstone Rovers would continue to today with the Blackstone Welsh United Dragons (QCSA) playing on the ground after forming in 1970.

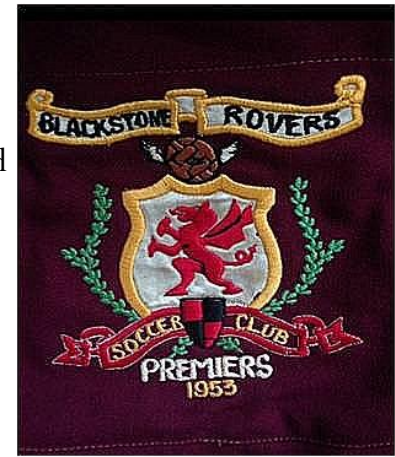
Blackstone was known as the district of Colliers and Choristers

Rovers played in Red and then from 1904 Black striped shirts with white shorts and black socks with red tops

.The war cry was “Play up Rovers” Andrew Hamilton became the first Secretary of Blackstone Rovers and was responsible for importing the first Black and Red Guernsey’s from Scotland.

Tom Barker would become the first Ipswich player selected for Queensland.Tom was secretary of The Ipswich and West Moreton Football Association,

The Ipswich Shelley brothers were also selected but they were living and playing in Brisbane at the time but move to Ipswich in 1896 Rovers would win the first Ipswich trophy in The Ipswich and West Moreton Competition in 1891 defeating Silkstone in the Final

In 1895 some players went to Dinmore Bush Rats and in 1896 the Club did not compete and its players and officials eventually joined a new club Ipswich Rovers. Ipswich Rovers would win the QBFA Challenge Cup Final and Charity Cup that year. Ipswich Rovers would become Blackstone Rovers after 1900
In 1911 Rovers changed to Rugby Union returning to Soccer in 1912
Rovers were also nicknamed the “Boo Boos”

Rovers would win 30 trophies in all until the club merged with Bundamba Rangers in 1965 to form Coalstars

Blackstone Rovers would produce twenty five players who would play for Queensland and six for Australia
Jack(Toddy)Edwards, Les Halls,Redvers Kitching,Ron Hughes,Robert Lawrie,Don Leo, Alwyn Warren.

A number of Queensland and Australian players played for Rovers including Col Kitching, Mervyn Shanks,Brian(Chooky)Vogler
Richard James,Redvers Kitching who represented Australia.

Two of the of the most successful Blackstone teams were the 1926 side that won the Premiership/Tristram Shield,Ipswich Challenge Cup and Special Trophy.

The side included eleven home grown players with eight born in Blackstone and three in Dinmore.

The 1953 side that won four trophies Premiership/Tristram and Hilton Shield Winners, Ambulance Shield only losing to St Helens in the Cribb and Foote Cup

Notable families who played and were administrators for Blackstone were the Dobbie,Evans,Hughes,Williams and Woolleys

In 1970 Blackstone Welsh United Dragons (QCSA) formed, Coalstars owned the ground and played matches there and when Sunday matches were played to the annoyance of church goers in the nearby Welsh Church some ex-Rovers players bought the ground and United Dragons was born. Eric Jones and Norm Rule were instrumental in the formation of the club

Unfortunately the Blackstone Rovers Clubhouse was destroyed by arsonists

Bily Williams, who is well known as treasurer and provider of the Booval Bowling Club, and who spent 50 years in various mines in the Ipswich district, recalled during the week that he had scored for the Blackstone team before the old Coolgardie shaft was put down at Blackstone, prior to 1893

He was only a schoolboy then, but he can remember games being played in the Coolgardie paddock before the mine was flooded. It was necessary to build a drain across the playing field, so the late Lewis Thomas cleared another site and gave it to the sporting bodies. It was necessary to shift five houses which were erected on the creek bank and two near the railway line. Today that ground is still known as the Blackstone oval and is used for Soccer fixtures

Total Trophies

Grand Finals were only played from 1959. Playoffs for Premiers(not Grand Final)occurred in 1919/23/25/30/31/33/38/48/49

Premiers are team who finished first on points table. (Grand Final wins in Brackets)

Of the leading clubs if Grand Finals instead of Premiership is the measure Hollandia/Lions number reduces by 2 and Azzurri/Brisbane City increases by 5 Hellenic reduces by 4 and Latrobe by 2

Brisbane City/Brisbane Lions won the Phillips Cup a National Competition but also fielded teams in the Brisbane Competition. Only Brisbane Trophies counted

Pre season winners included. First and second round Cup competitions included but prior to 1941 these competitions did not exist

As an example Hollandia/Lions numbers include 10 of these trophies and Brisbane City 4

During split Brisbane Ipswich competitions trophies won in both leagues included

Ipswich Clubs also continued to compete for Ipswich Challenge Cup for some years during combined competition

Under “Other”Trophies are Charity/Queensland,Brisbane,Java,Moore,Telegraph,Cribb and Foote,Ambulance,Presidents,Hospital O’Callaghan Shields,Cantle Badges,Special Compettion,Duce Shield,Craven Cup,Fedaration Cup

Robert Dobbie, in conjunction with his brother, William Dobbie started the Bonnie Dundee Colliery

Robert and William were born in Fyfehire, Scotland.

William played for and captained Call Backs

Roberts sons were Alexander Robert James and Archibald

Alexander played with Bundamba Rovers in 1886 and Little Rangers in 1887 and Blackstone Rovers in 1888

Robert also played for Little Rangers in 1887

Alexander, Robert and James played for Bundamba Rangers. Robert also played for Booval Enterprises

Alexander and Archibald also refereed

William’s Granddaughter marries Lex Gibb

James was the grandfather of Gordon(Bunny)Nunn. and his two sons Robert and James Roy who was a WW2 Veteran also played

Robert Jnr’s son Thomas was Manager of Wattles FC and his sons Ron, Arthur and Mervyn played for Blackstone Rovers and Wattles and Grandson Bruce played for Coalstars

John’s sons Bruce and Greg played for St Helens and Coalstars

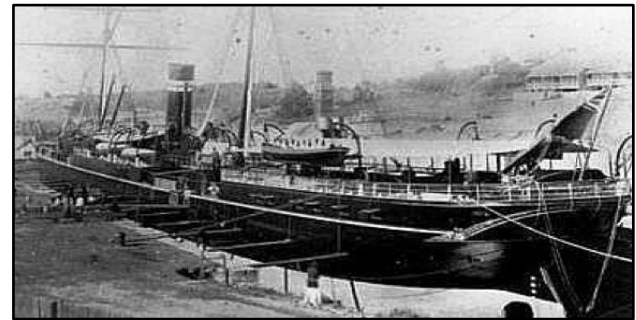

Evans of Blackstone

The Evans family had an association with Blackstone Rovers from its inception in 1886 until it merged with Bundamba Rangers in 1964

William Evans arrived in Australia in 1884 and was captain in 1892

Richard his brother played in the 1888 team

William Evans was a selector in 1915

William's sons William, David and Griffith played for Blackstone Rovers

Owen William and Mary sons all played for Blackstone Rovers. Owen was killed at the Cardiff mine explosion in 1919

Their sons were Robert (WW1 Veteran) Hugh, Owen and Cradoc (Craddy)

Cradoc played for Blackstone Rovers and represented Ipswich and was reserve for Qld

He moved to Townsville and the Crad Evans Memorial trophy is named after him

His son Des was a Townsville Representative and also played for the RAAF

Owen was Chairman of Blackstone Rovers his sons were Colin, Cecil, Elwyn

Cecil played with Blackstone Rovers with Cecil winning a Premiership in 1941 and representing Qld in 1946. Cecil was killed in 1948 and a testimonial fund was instigated raising 452 pounds.

James Evans won a Premiership with Blackstone Rovers in 1941

Frederick Evans won Premierships with Blackstone Rovers in 1912 and 1919 and represented Qld in 1912

Frederick served in WW1 his father Edward served in the Boer War

Griffith (Giffy) won Premiership with Blackstone Rovers in 1912 and 1919 and represented Qld in 1912

Mervyn Evans (1920-1994) played for Ipswich in 1941 and was Treasurer of Blackstone Rovers

L Evans Erroll and Greg Evans won the Stewart Shield with Coalstars.

Eric played for Rovers and RAAF and was Secretary of Coalstars for twenty years and the Bundamba Field was named in his honour

Eric Junior a Vietnam Veteran and Erroll played for Coalstars

First Interstate match(Queensland 3 v New South Wales 1) 16 August 1890

Tom Barker and Ipswich brothers George and *Sam Shelley tour

The intercolonial football match, under 'British Association rules, and between New South Wales and Queensland attracted a fair sprinkling of spectators to the Sir Joseph Banks Ground's this afternoon. The weather was beautiful, and much interest was evinced in the contest, which from the outset was keenly contested.

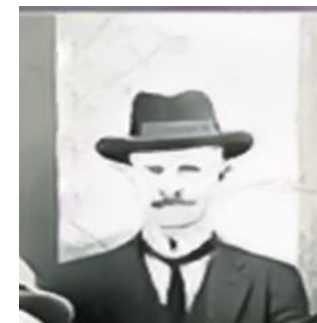

"There was no wind, so that no advantage was gained by winning the toss. New South Wales "kicked towards the northern goal, and were not long in gaining a goal, through the instrumentality of Ferguson Alter a brief interval Queensland made matters level Manson being the successful kicker. The game thence to half time was very even, and the scores when the whistle sounded were 1 goal each, Soon after starting again, Queensland carried the ball forward, and Brown evading Logan in goal, kicked the second goal .for Queensland, and after a number of unsuccessful shots Queensland again carried the ball forward, but Logan shaped in fine style. Once more the scene of battle was in Queensland territory, but the ball was again sent to tho front of Now SouthWales goal, when Logan ran out to. save, but collided with Menzies and fell heavily, breaking his leg While Shelley, of Queensland, left in undisputed possession of the ball, placed the third goal to the credit of the Queenslanders. Tho unfortunate accident to young Logan caused tho suspension of the play ten minutes before time, and tho game terminated in a "victory 'for Queensland by 3 goals to 1 Menzies who was also injured in the collision with Logan, is believed to have some of his "ribs broken."

*J Inglis was selected and played in a game at Newcastle against the Northern District then returned to Brisbane. Another full back, Lamont, was on the wharf but failed to board the ship, leaving only two reserves Instead of three. While the team was on the ship the great maritime strike started. The ship made for Newcastle and delayed the arrival of the team to Friday morning instead of Thursday The first inter State match was played on Saturday, the day following the arrival of the team, which left little time for practice or training. At the end of the tour due to Maritime strike the players had to find their own way back to Brisbane

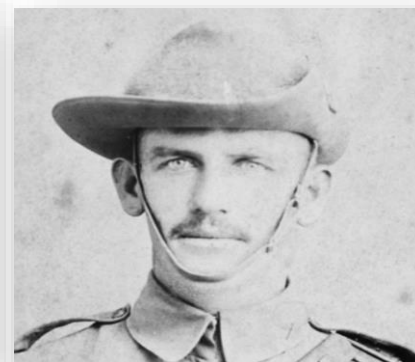

This match was rendered necessary by the fact that in the competition both clubs had obtained an equal number of points. The match evoked considerable interest, and there were about 1,000 spectators present. G. Shelly captained the Rovers, and J. Finlayson the Normans. From the start it was seen that the Rovers had the superior team. The Normans were the first to become dangerous, but with little delay the Rovers cleared their lines, and they in turn attacked the Normans' goal. Here a corner was awarded, which was nicely kicked by Shelley, and enabled his brother to score. No sooner kicked off than the Rovers again pressed, and a bad piece of play by the Norman hacks, nearly lost a goal to their side, but the ball was got away and Dreghorn put in a nice run, and passed to Anderson who shot and scored. The game up to this point had been pretty even, but the Rovers warming up, completely run through their opponents, and scored three goals in quick succession, and at half-time the score stood, Rovers 4 goals, Normans 1 goal. The game was very slow in the second half. Each side scored a goal, so that the final result was Rovers 6 goals, Normans 2 goals. For the winners, Thurstan, Barker, and the brothers Shelley played best; J. Finlayson, Blake, and Jack were the pick of the Normans. Mr J Fowler acted as referee.

Rosebanks: In goal, M'Coy; full-backs, T. and A. Inglis; half-backs, M'Intosh, Brown, and C. Hawker; forwards—right wing, Joe Skellern and W. Inglis; centre, J. Inglis; left wing, R. and B. Galt. A very exciting game resulted in a win for the visitors by 3 goals to 2. With the wind at their backs in the first half, the Rovers had all the best of the game—in fact, it was only on rare occasions during this period that the Rosebanks' citadel was not in a state of siege. After about twenty minutes' hard play Sam Shelley drew first blood for the Rovers. Another ten minutes had gone by when Joe Marsh sent the sphere between the sticks, and about ten minutes before the whistle sounded for the usual spell George Marsh scored the third goal for the Bovers. Just prior to halftime, the Rosebanks broke away with a rush, the ball was taken right up to the Bovers' goal, and J. Inglis sent it through. Rovers, 3 goals; Rosebanks, 1. With the wind in their favour in the second half the Rosebanks persistently attached the Rovers' territory. But the latter's defence was good, and though their opponents were continually down on them for about half-an-hour they only got another goal, this being secured by J. Inglis a minute or two after the kick-off. When the Rosebanks were so pressing in their attentions the Rover captain, George Shelley, very wisely brought his brother Sam back to the rear division. Towards the end of the game the Rovers again assumed the aggressive, and when time was called they were giving their opponents all they could do to hold their own. All the winners strove hard to gain the coveted eup, the two Shelleys being about the cream of the team; while the losers, too, made a big bid for victory. Mr. T. Jenkinson was referee, and Messrs. A. Rankin and J. Fowler linesmen. News of the success of the Rovers was first received in Blackstone by pigeon post, Messrs. Jacob and William Tapp despatching birds from the ground when each goal was scored and at halftime and full time. The Rovers deserve congratulation on their success. They began the season badly; but, once they started on their career of wins, they went on with an unbroken record. They were only beaten on the playing-field once (by the Normans), and have won ten games, scoring, we believe, 40 goals against 16 to the credit of opponents. And this is only the first year of the Rover's existence.

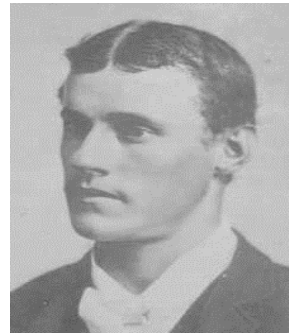

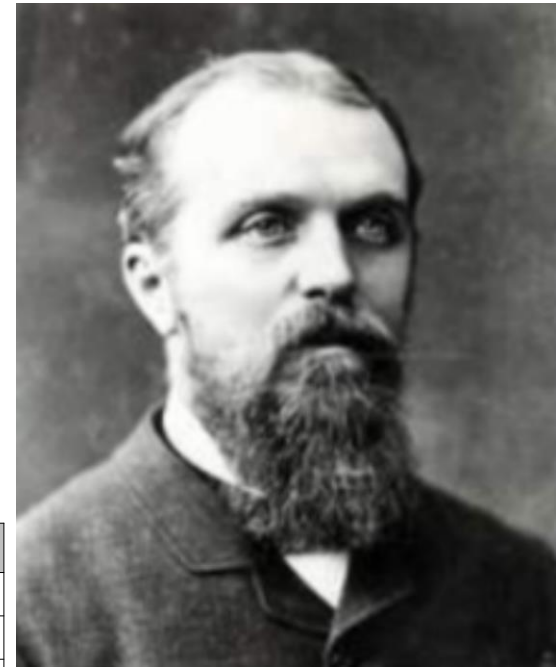

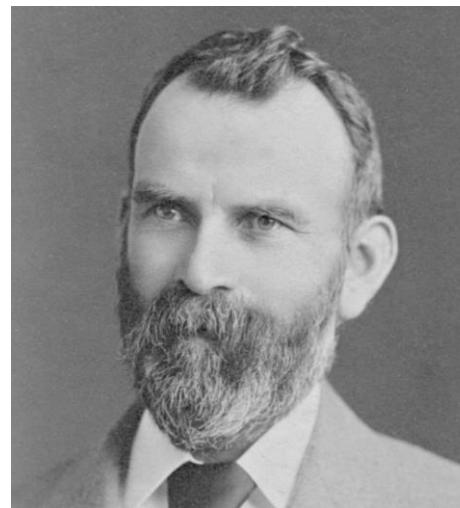

Extraordinary sports record of Mr F Elson

To gain international selection in one code of sport is a worthy enough achievement for anyone, but to reach international status in another, and to be offered first class posting in still another is indeed extraordinary. Such is the versatile record of Mr. Fred Elson, of Blackstone. He was selected as a Welsh Rugby Union forward in 1911, but was unable to line out at Cardiff with the side because his amateur standing had been upset by his playing professional Soccer. In 1910, Fred was a reserve for the Welsh Rugby Union side against Scotland. He was a Welsh international rink hockey centre-half, and a Soccer full-back. who may have risen to top flight ranking in the round ball game if his first love had not been for Union.

Fred's club Union was played with Peny Craig, Rhondda Valley, where the colliers were tough and where cauliflower ears were the badges of the big men in the pack. With Fred in Peny Craig's forwards was Bob Jenkins, of Booval. Fred's playing weight in those days was about 139 stone It was Soccer which claimed the versatile Welshman's attention first. He played full-back for Porth for seven years, and "Fatty" Wedlock, international Soccer star, offered him a game with Bristol. In 1910-11 he played rink hockey for Wales, football being played in the daytime and hockey at night. His club rink hockey team was Forth All Blues.

When he came to Blackstone from Wales, Fred played Rugby League with the Blackstone Club and West Ends.

In 1915 he was a member of the West End team, which won a premiership. After the final League game for the season he transferred to the Blackstone Soccer side, played the last few-games of the season with them, and saw them win their premiership, two premierships in different codes in one season.

Thomas Tapp wrote the letter below home in 1916

The Queensland Times Thursday 9 November 1916,

Under date of September 11, from -somewhere in France, " Cpl. Tom Tapp writes to his parents (Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Tapp), in Bundamba, as follows :-Just a line to let you know that I am in the best of health. I have been up in the front line, and it is no fun. All my mates have gone-some killed, others wounded and I am lucky to be here. We are having a spell, but it will not be long, so it is anticipated, before we are at the front again-at some other place. The last place we were in was as hot as Hades is alleged to be. But do not worry about me. There is no place like Sunny Australia--she stands on her own. In reference to the photo, I sent you of myself and a cobber, " I am sorry to say that he was killed four hours subsequent to he and I having a chat about our future. He said Hello, Tappie, how goes it ? Do you think we'll get home again ?' and I said, "Yes," He then told me, if he got knocked out, to take his book, which I promised to do on the condition that he would do the same for me. But I was the lucky, and he the unlucky, one. I was not near him when he was killed, however although I would have given the world to have been alongside of him at the time. When we first came to France there were six of us-all mates,- and I am now left on my own. I will find new mates, but none like them. Each of them was a fine fellow. We took two lines from the Germans, and it was no trouble, for the beggars put up their hands. It is the, German shells that do the harm, and, to tell you the truth, we were just waiting our turn to come, but luck was with me. I will close with best love and good wishes to all at home.

Women's Soccer football, so popular in Brisbane for a time in the early 20's, is being revived in the Ipswich district.

[Blackstone is one of the few football clubs in Queensland which owns the freehold of its own ground. Blackstone team is being coached by 25-year-old Ron Hughes, an Ipswich workshops employee, and captain of Blackstone's First Division Team. Veteran footballer, George Kitching, of Booval, is coaching the Bundamba women. Good prospect Blackstone club's treasurer, George Williams, who is on the staff of the Taxation Department, thinks women's Soccer will become very popular in the Ipswich' district. If the appeal it had at the Brisbane Cricket Ground in 1925 is any guide.

*Blackstone's ground should be packed out next Friday week. Living at Bellevue Street, Milton, is a woman who helped pioneer women's Soccer in Brisbane. She is Mrs. Lil Weaver, an Englishwoman, well-known in Brisbane hockey circles as a star player until her retirement a year ago. Women's Soccer became quite a favourite sport in England, according to Mrs Weaver. Factory girls formed teams all over the country. Mrs Weaver played in goal for an English XI and was a centre-forward in Brisbane. 'I am still more interested in Soccer than hockey,' she confessed yesterday. 'I think that Soccer is more scientific with the head and feet than hockey is with a stick.' Sprint star - TEENAGER Margaret * Dixon, of Short Street Bundamba, promises to be the speed merchant of Ipswich women's Soccer. She is the daughter of a Bundamba club committeeman, Bill Dixon, and has starred as a sprinter in local athletic events.*

Other Bundamba players will include Agnes Batching wife of a former First Division player, Cedric latching, and Irene Powell, an Ipswich shop assistant. Both live in Brisbane Road, Bundamba. In Blackstone's XX Shirley Hughes, sister of well-known Blackstone players, Bon and Col Hughes, will be striving hard to uphold the family's high reputation in local Soccer. Among other Blackstone players will be East Street (Ipswich) residents, Maureen Leo, wife of Donald Leo, Australia's goalkeeper in the Second Test against the Chinese, and Doreen Woolley, wife of another senior player, Errol Woolley. 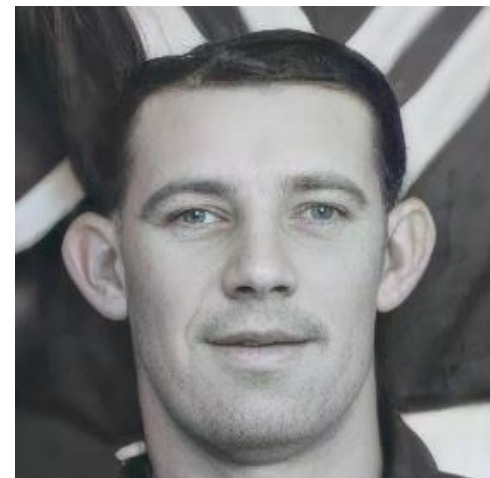

It was stated that the team would not go on without Edwards and the officials were at once confronted with a delicate situation. Conferences took place, and it was finally resolved by the Australian executive, by nine votes to two, that Edwards should play. The news of the dispute caused something of a sensation and was the cause of free and outspoken comment. The Press were informed that Edwards refused to stand down in favour of Mitchell. The voting shows that this action was officially endorsed'
