Bundamba Clubs

Bundanba was named in 1879 but changed to Bundamba officially in 1932

Bundamba Rangers commenced in 1894 who in 1895 merged with Coursers. Merged with Rosebells in 1936 and again merged with Blackstone Rovers to form Coalstars in 1964. In 1998 the club merged with St Helens to form Ipswich Knights
Colours: red and white (1895) War cry “ Buck in Rangers”

The club played on the current site of the car park of the Ipswich Race Course then Eric Evans Reserve
Bundamba Rangers had forty Queensland Representatives and fifteen Internationals
Alec Gibb the first Australian captain played for the club and was inducted in to the Football Hall of Fame

Rangers first ever match was on the 18th May 1894 against Whitwood
They would go on to win thirty five titles,third most of any club

Queensland Times (Ipswich, Qld. : 1909 - 1954), Saturday 11 July 1953,

If a plan formulated by a bunch of Bundamba youngsters about 60 years ago had come to fruition, Bundamba Rangers' Soccer ground today would be part of a large recreation area catering for a number of sports.

Tom Spall, of Booval, who helped to "stump" and level the Soccer ground. recalled during the week that it had been intended to extend the ground to Brisbane Road. He said the work had been done by members of the Corsairs Soccer Club. which was the first to use, the ground. Comprised mostly of lads on, the Ipswich side of the loop line. the club's membership included the Sparks brothers Stafford's and Biggams as well as the Spall brothers. Tom who is just on 82 said the plans went astray when some of the lads got married and others drifted seeking employment, and the club ceased to function According to Tom there have been at least five Soccer grounds in Bundamba. Before clearing the present Bundamba ground the Corsairs had played on the city side of the creek near where a garage now stands. Bundamba Rangers had first played on a ground near 'the bottom of the racecourse. Other grounds were on Brisbane Road towards Ipswich at the site of the old Racehorse Hotel, and in the racecourse itself. Tom said he didn't remember the exact date when the Bundamba ground was played, but he knew it was at the same time as the old West Moreton shaft was being sunk. He said the lad finished work in the mines until 5pm and worked until 8pm or later on the Ground. "We never thought we would see games like they are playing there now said Tom. He remembers the time when 'footballers thought nothing of riding horseback to Fernvale for a game

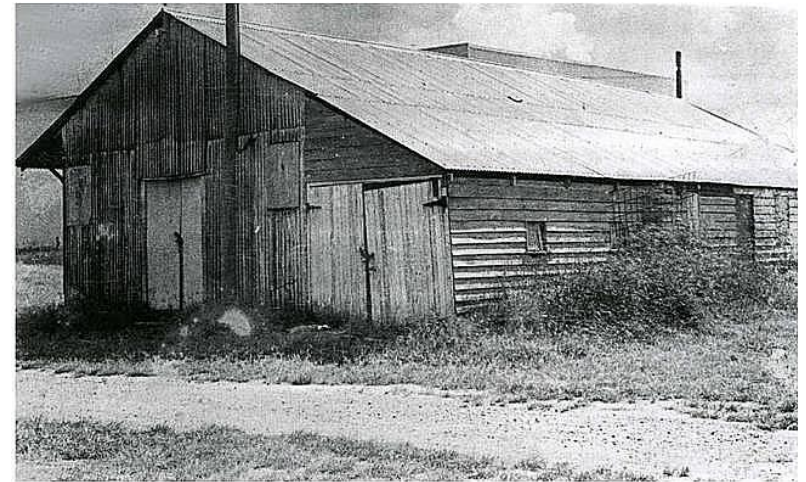

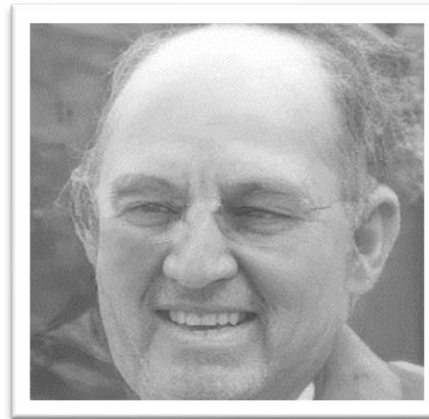


Original Bundamba Rangers Clubhouse

The annual meeting of the Ipswich and West Moreton British Football Association was presided over on February 8 by Mr. W. Routledge (President). The clubs represented were Rovers, Stars, Rosebells, Railways, Montes, and Rangers. The finance report showed an Income of £20/6/4 against an expenditure of £18/16/6.

It was decided to approach the trustees of the Bundamba racecourse ground with the purpose of using the course for playing fields.

Grand Finals were only played from 1959. Playoffs for Premiers(not Grand Final)occurred in 1919/23/25/30/31/33/38/48/49

Premiers are team who finished first on points table. (Grand Final wins in Brackets)

Of the leading clubs if Grand Finals instead of Premiership is the measure Hollandia/Lions number reduces by 2 and Azzurri/Brisbane City increases by 5 Hellenic reduces by 4 and Latrobe by 2

Brisbane City/Brisbane Lions won the Phillips Cup a National Competition but also fielded teams in the Brisbane Competition. Only Brisbane Trophies counted

Pre season winners included. First and second round Cup competitions included but prior to 1941 these competitions did not exist

As an example Hollandia/Lions numbers include 10 of these trophies and Brisbane City 4

During split Brisbane Ipswich competitions trophies won in both leagues included

Ipswich Clubs also continued to compete for Ipswich Challenge Cup for some years during combined competition

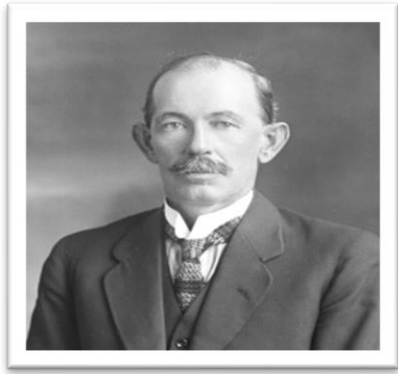

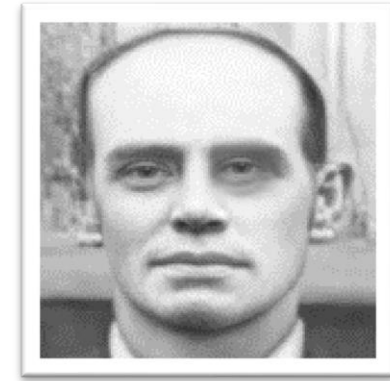

Some of the players have proper Jerseys, but some have makeshifts strips of red ribbon sewn on to singlets. Some have only singlets with sashes over shoulders. They were the days when a player bought a jersey if he could afford one. If he couldn't, he did the best he could with the material at his disposal. They were the days of short work in the mines, and Butcher boots (with bars or studs fitted as Soccer gear. They also were the days when anyone who showed the slightest sign of going for the ball could be knocked over, and when the goal-keeper was nobody's friend who often went in danger of his life from charges. Clashes with the Bush Rats and Blackstone Rovers were classic occasions on the Bundamba ground in the 1890's. "We used to get fairly big crowds at our games," said Ern. "We did not charge for admission but depended on passing the hat along the sideline for funds." Playing shorts usually were moleskins cut down to fit below the knees, and shin guards were made at home from moleskin and strips of cane.

The Rangers, whose victory was a popular one, are thus the winners of the badges in the second division of the West Moreton British Football Association, and, according to its rules, they will have to go in the senior ranks next season. The following are the names of the competing teams:--Rangers: R. Dobbie (goal), Perrett, J. Lindsay (full backs), Sneedam, Richards, S. Dobbie (right wing), Besgrove, A. Noble (centre), J. Dobbie, D. Waugh, and Gledson (left wing). Bush Rats [=Rats]: Pioch (goal), J. Routledge, J. Whalley (full backs), J. Burns, E. Hudson, W. Hudson (half backs), H. and S. Skellern (left wing), W. Caddies (centre), C. Gooch, and T. Stewart (right wing). James Lindsay captained the Rangers, and, winning the toss from Caddies (skipper of the Rats) elected to kick down the hill, with a strong wind at his back, the convincing-ground being situated at the back of Bundamba, on Scarborough's flat. Both teams played with great spirit, and there was a large attendance of spectators, including a good number of the fair sex. D. Waugh scored "first blood" for the Rangers--a grand low shot, Pioch not being able to hold the sphere. Excellent all-round play ensued, when T. Stewart equalised matters by scoring for the Rats. The excitement became intense. In the midst of close battling in front of the Rats' goal, Perrett kicked the ball over the head of the back division, and it rolled between the goal-posts. No. 2 goal for the Rangers. Shortly after the whistle sounded for half-time-Rangers, 2; Rats, 1. "Time;" and the ball had not long been in motion when Jim Dobbie obtained No. 8 goal for the Rangers. The Rats now forced the game, and, from a corner kick, Jim Burns headed the ball between the posts-No. 2 goal for T'Bats. Several times after this the Rangers' citadel was in danger from the constant bombardment, but Bob Dobbie was on the right spot always. Once Jack Routledge was within an ace of scoring the third goal for the Rats, but the Rangers were playing a magnificent defensive game, and when the whistle sounded "cease firing," they were the winners by 3 goals to the Rats' 2. Mr. T. Dwyer gave every satisfaction as referee, as did also Messrs. & Auld and O. Coleman as line umpires. Cheers were heartily given at the termination of the game. Just as the people were leaving the ground, Mr. Jacob Tapp's pigeons had arrived from the Pineapple ground, South Brisbane, doing the distance in splendid time, with the news that, at half-time, the result of the match there between the first Rats and the Rosebanks was-Bush Rats, 2 goals; Rosebanks, nil. FrzST BusH RHaTs v. Boss?EKA?. The Bush Rats-the same team that defeated the Normans--journeyed to Brisbane last Saturday to meet the Rosebanks in a challenge cup fixture, and the West Moreton representatives succeeded, after a very fast and fine passing game, in beating the Rosebanks by 2 goals to nil. Mr. J. Fowler was referee. The Rosebanks have yet to meet the Normans, and if the latter are beaten, this practically means that the Bush Rats will be the winners of the challenge cup; or if they play a drawn game with the Normans, the Rats will have to meet the latter in a final match. If the Normans are victorious, however, they will gain the cup by one point.

Original Member Of Bundamba Rangers



Mr. Ernest Richards (pictured), the only surviving member of the original Bundamba Rangers Soccer Club, founded at Bundamba in 1893, celebrates his 90th birthday at his home in Dudleigh Street, Booval, today.

Yesterday, Mr. Richards recalled the days when the names of Bill Lindsay, Alf. Perrett, Bill Seymour and Dave Clendon were the big names in Ipswich soccer.

"We were all pals together," Mr. Richards said. Mr. Richards, then aged 10 years, came from Warwickshire, England, in 1886 in the steamer Dorinda.

"There were cattle and sheep penned on the only deck and the young boys on board had great fun getting amongst them," he laughed.

"We came via Cape York and ran into a bad storm along the eastern coast. I don't mind telling you I was pretty scared."

As soon as he turned 12, Mr. Richards started working in a mine with his father.

"Most nights I was so tired that Dad used to piggy-back me home across the paddocks," he said yesterday.

Mr. Richards left the Box Flat mine in 1932 when illness forced him to retire.

In 1900, Mr. Richards married Miss Margaret Risdale, of Little Ipswich (now One Mile) and thought nothing of walking the distance between there and Bundamba during their courting days.

Five of Mr. Richards' brothers and sisters are still living near Ipswich.

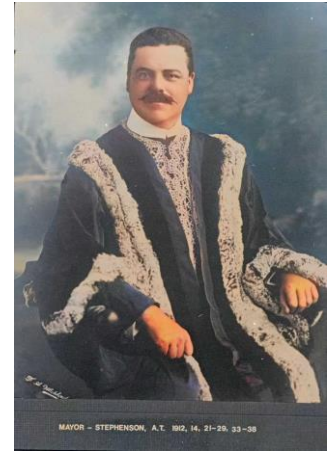

Bundamba Rangers defeat Thistles—Winners of Q.F.A. Premiership Kruger Lebeter returns to form

About 2000 spectators visited Bundamba last Saturday to witness the last of the local Rangers League matches

A great deal depended on the result as Rangers were leading in the competition by two points, and defeat would have meant a play off, on the Brisbane cricket ground. However, Rangers ran out easy winners by 5 goals to 2, and they remain premiers for 1922. At intervals, "barrackers" could be heard complaining what they considered were unsatisfactory decisions of the referee, however, the best team won, and the players fully deserved their victory. The teams were as follows:--Rangers T Wade, J Routledge, C Gedge, J Pedley, A Heaton, A Gibb (captain) G Long, K. Lebetar, M Burton, and A Pedley Thistles 'Brownlie, W McBride, D. Ross, J. Love, J. Peebles (captain) Todd, J. Kitching, Steele, D Cumberford, J. Cumberford, Keogh, referee, Mr., Phillips Rangers won the toss, and Alex Gibb decided to take advantage of a light wind in his favour. Thistles kicked off Heaton let Burton, and Pedley away on the left, and J. Peebles was called on to relieve in a dangerous position. J Cumberford gave a nice opening but Keogh did not take advantage. Rangers again attacked, and Lebeter sent past at the other end. Brownlee saved a goal shot a minute later from Burton. Rangers were pressing at this stage and Donald Ross, at back for the Visitors, nipped in and broke up some good combined movements, which, would have been dangerous otherwise. T Wade, at the other end, was called on to clear from J Cumberford, and just cleared from D. Cumberford, who followed in A Gibb also cleared from the same players, when a good chance came the visitors' way. Burton failed, and a free kick was awarded to Thistles but Routledge relieved. Brownlee again saved from Lebetar, who sent in a good shot, and G Long had a nice chance but he also sent past. A corner was awarded to Rangers, and A Pedley sent in a lovely kick, G. Long scoring for Rangers. Rangers, 1 goal; Thistles, nil. Immediately from the kick off Gibb let Burton away, and he missed a golden opportunity to put Rangers farther ahead, the ball going past. Thistles were awarded a free from G Lang, but C Gedge cleared in good style. Another corner was awarded to Rangers, who secured their second goal. Thistles were trying to reduce the leeway, and J. Cumberford was the only forward for the visitors who could shoot. Rangers pressed, and Brownlee again brought off a great save from 10 yards off G Long Peebles let Steele and Keogh away, and the former headed past from close in. Routledge tried to score from a long shot, but Brownlee cleared, a good combined movement by Rangers forwards resulting in Kruger Lebeter scoring No. 3 Half time Rangers 3 goals; Thistles nil. Rangers kicked off on resuming, and T Wade was called on to save from J Cumberford A corner was awarded Thistles off Gedge, but Kitching sent post. The visitors were having a good deal of the game with support J Cumberford would have made things very awkward. Rangers secured their fourth goal when G Long received close in from J Pedley and he made no mistake. Rangers 4; Thistles nil. The visitors rallied, and their first score came from the only forward they had J Cumberford. Rangers 4 Thistles 1 Brownlee had to leave his goal for ambulance attention for injury to a leg. Ross went to goal, and Thistles battled on gamely under adverse conditions. Cumberford secured Thistles second goal and livened their supporters up a bit. The game was very evenly contested for a while and the only excitement was when Lebeter secured the last goal. The game finished with the scores: Rangers 5 goals Thistles 2 goals. During the interval members of the Ipswich Thistle Pipe Band discoursed a programme of music, under the supervision of Pipe-Major Angus McPherson.

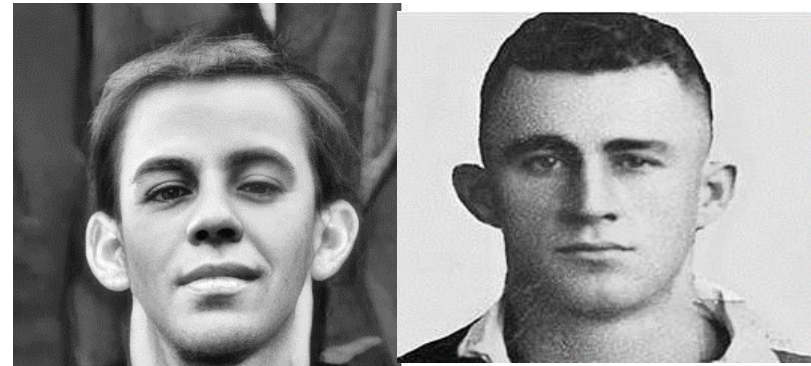

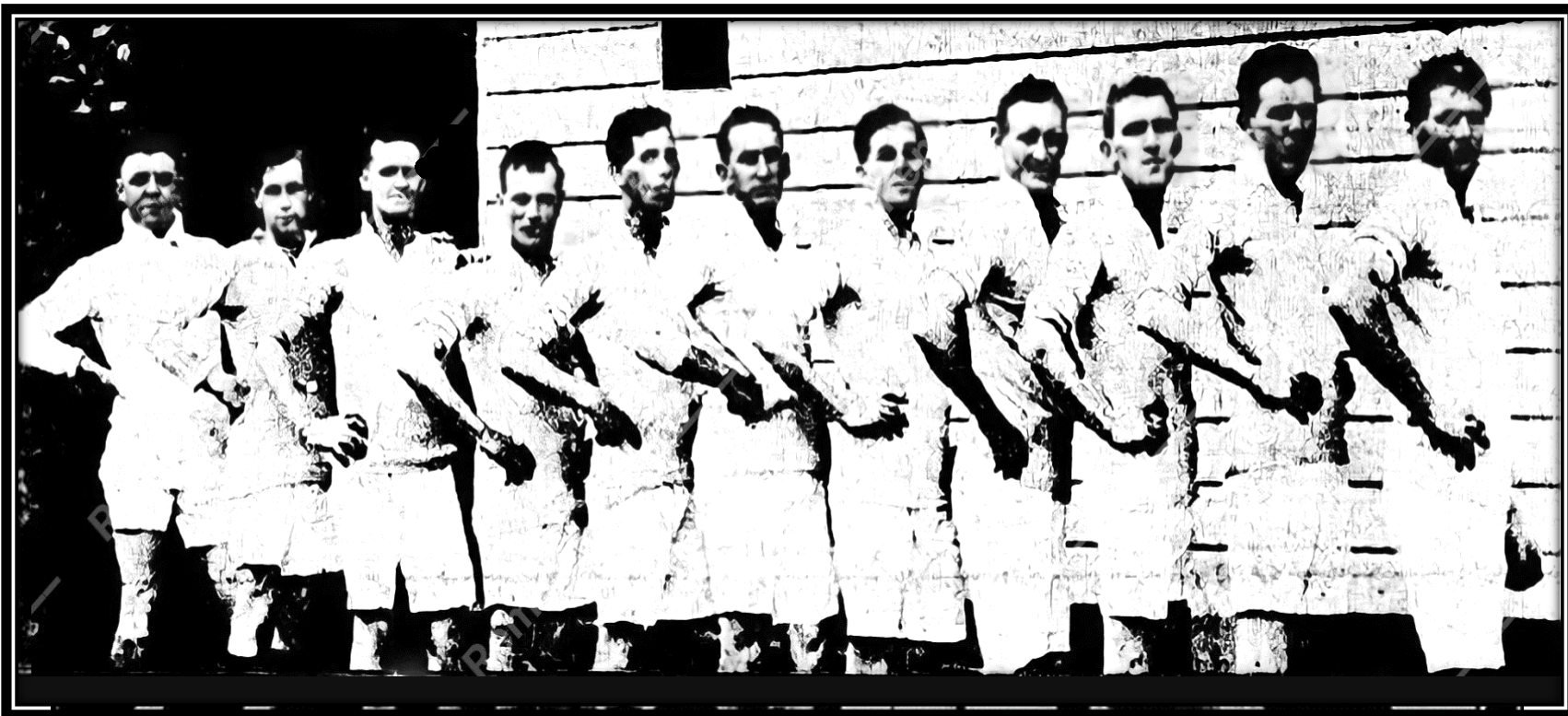
Still "Bobbed Up!"

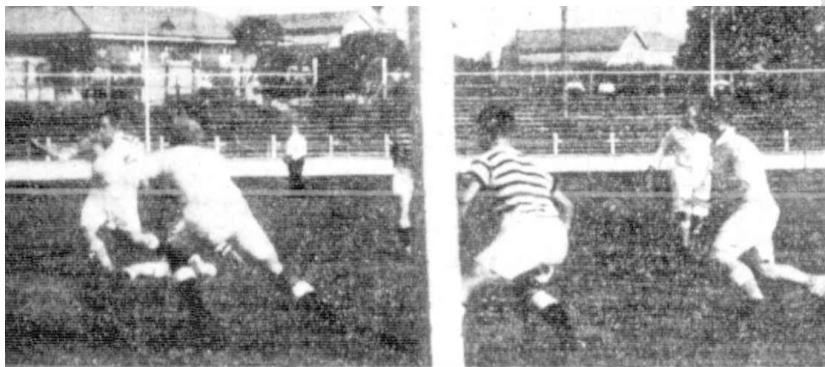

Alec Gibb (1888-1976)

Alec represented Australia fourteen times

Alec Gibb was Captain of first 1922 Australian team that toured New Zealand

Born in Ireland, moved to Scotland, Alec migrated to Australia in 1911

He played with Bundamba Athletics in 1912 winning a premiership and then Bundamba Rangers

In 1914 he played for Dinmore Bush Rats and in 1916 for St Helens and in 1925 Ipswich City.

Alec played Right half and was captain of the 1922 Bundamba Rangers Premiership team

In 1923 he became Captain/Coach of South Brisbane Scottish

From 1913 to 1924 (with the exception of the war years) he played in every Ipswich and

Queensland team and played 16 times for Ipswich and 21 times for Queensland

In the 1922 series in New Zealand Alex was captain and again against New Zealand in Australia

Alec won two medals presented for the best Australian player in both series.

Age (Melbourne, Vic. : 1854 - 1954), Monday 26 June 1922 (10)

About 15,000 people attended the soccer game between Australia and New Zealand.

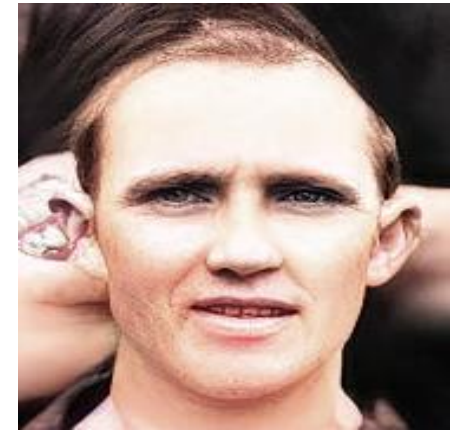
It ended in a draw 1 goal each. The match was "willing" and no fewer than five men were temporarily knocked out

In 1970 Alec at the age of 82 attended the Qld Auckland match in Brisbane and donated a Trophy

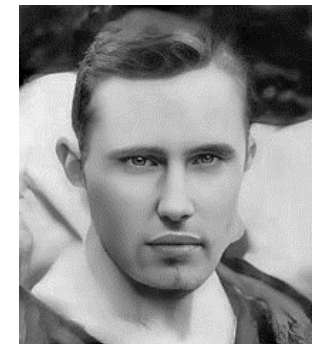
for the Best and Fairest Auckland player to reicprocate his 1922 Medal

Alec was offered the captancy of the Australian team against the Chinese XI

in 1923 but could not accept for business reasons

Alec continued his association with the game, when he retired as an Ipswich, Queensland and Australian selector and was also President of the local Association from 1926 until 1940.

Alec was on the Queensland Football Association Executive and was Patron of the Ipswich and West Moreton Junior Committee and also wrote for the Queensland times

During the war years Alec was President of the Ipswich Soccer Patriotic organisation that raised funds for the war effort

Alec played centre forward for Bundamba Rangers (old boys) against Latrobe at the age of 59 in 1947

Alec was the first of five from the Gibb family to represent for either Ipswich, Qld or Australia.

The others were Alf, Allan, Lex and Buddy.

Alec worked for 25 years at Cribb and Foote retiring in 1954

In retirement Alec played bowls and became secretary of Booval Bowls Club

In 2020 the Gibb-Masters Cup is named for matches between Qld and NSW

*The Ashes

The Soccer Ashes were created after Australia first win over New Zealand(2-1) in Brisbane in 1923.

The ashes consisted of the remains of cigars smoked by the two captains, Alex Gibb and George Campbell and all team members and officials

The ashes were collected by the NZ team manager into a cigarette case used at Gallipoli by W Fisher who was the Australian manager and Qld FA secretary.

The case was then set in wood from both countries.

The trophy was played for until 1954 and is currently under consideration to be resurrected

SOCCER "ASHES."

MORE THAN A MYTH.

Mr. Alex. Gibb's Contribution.

With the Australian Soccer team who arrived at Auckland by the Wanganella recently came a real casket of ashes to be the stake of the three Test matches that are to be played between the Commonwealth and New Zealand (states the Auckland "Star" in a recent issue). Admittedly the idea of playing for "the ashes" is cribbed from international cricket, but on the outcome of this season's matches between Australia and New Zealand depends the custody of a casket of actual ash.

It happened this way. At the conclusion of the New Zealand eleven's tour of Australia in 1923 George Campbell, captain of the New Zealand team and Alec Gibb, captain of the Australian team, sat puffing cigars at the farewell banquet, and dropping their ashes into the same tray. Mr. H. G. Mayer, who, with Mr. H. I. Graves was managing the New Zealand team suggested that the ashes in the tray should be made the stake of future Soccer matches between the Commonwealth and the Dominion.

The ashes were placed in a plate safety-razor case 4in. long by 1in. deep and 2in. wide, which Mr. W. Fisher, Secretary of the Queensland Football Association that year, has carried with him at the historic landing at Anzac Cove. He gave it to Mr. Mayer, who offered it as a suitable receptacle for the ashes.

With the cigar ashes in it, the metal case was soldered, and subsequently enclosed in a casket of Australian and New Zealand woods. The body is of Australian maple, and the lid and base of rewaro—a New Zealand honeysuckle. It is surmounted with a Soccer ball of silver, with a silver kangaroo between the twin fern leaves of New Zealand, with the letters "N.Z." in blue enamel.

On the underside of the lid an inscribed plate tells the story of the ashes, while the base bears a silver plate with the following inscription:—

"New Zealand and Australian Soccer Ashes. This casket is made of New Zealand and Australian woods and was presented by H. G. Mayer manager of the New Zealand team touring Australia, 1923 season. The ashes are contained in a canister inside this casket."

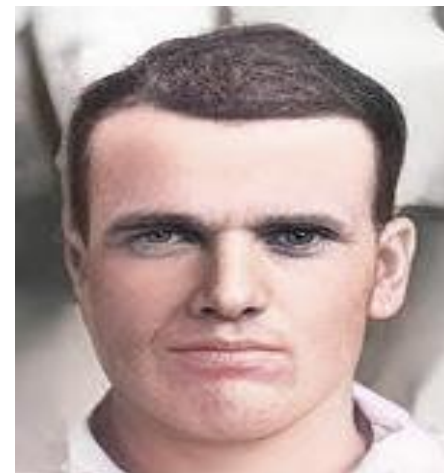

Before the big match started it was reported that the Australian players took decided objection to Edwards being dropped for Mitchell. They adopted their attitude on the principle that once a player was selected he should play. It was stated that the team would not go on without Edwards and the officials were at once confronted with a delicate situation. Conferences took place, and it was finally resolved by the Australian executive, by nine votes to two, that Edwards should play. The news of the dispute caused something of a sensation and was the cause of free and outspoken comment. The Press were informed that Edwards refused to stand down in favour of Mitchell. The voting shows that this action was officially endorsed'

Toddy was again selected for Australia in 1927 for matches against Chinese XI and Bohemians (Czechoslovakia)

Career

Toddy played 26 times for Ipswich and 19 times for Queensland

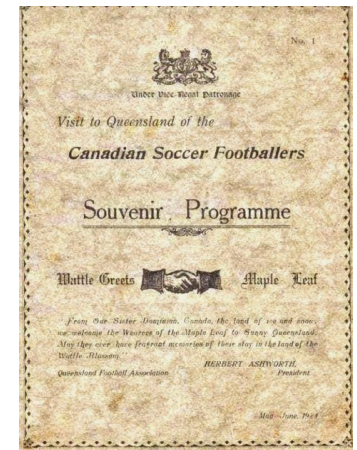

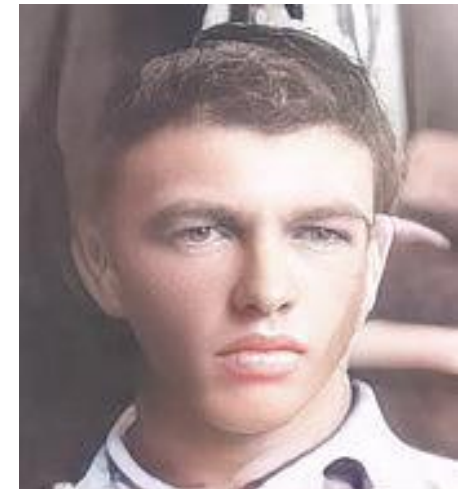

This was reported as an unhappy tour as there was a player revolt over payment and conversion to local currency.
