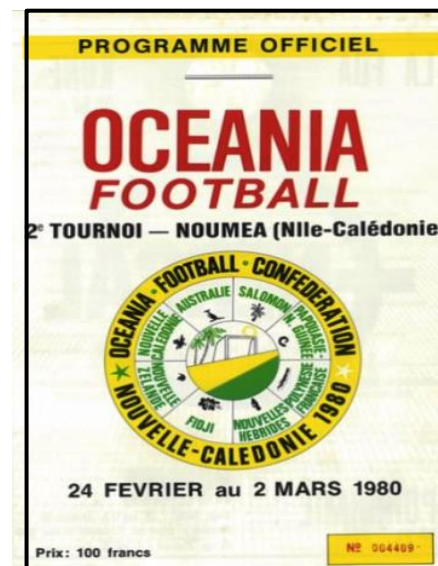

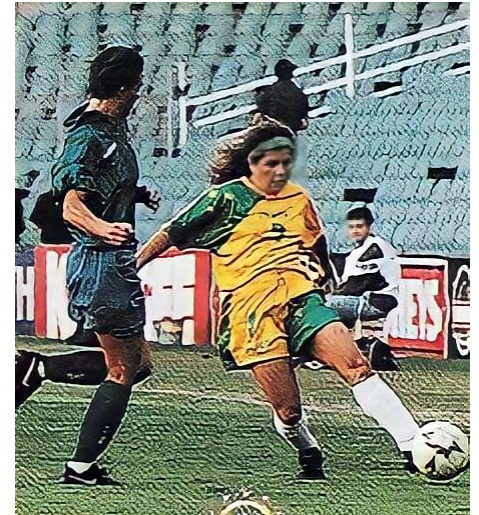

Coalstars women set standard

In the mid 1990s, it was the turn of regional women's players to start making an international impact.

Michelle Sawyers (cap 46) led the way, lining up in 29 games for Australia between 1983 and 1991.

She was the first of Coalstars "Magnificent Seven" after the Matildas (female Socceroos) were born in 1995.

Sawyers recalled having to self-fund in her early national trips with raffles, car washes and lamington drives.

"We did everything," she said, having helped build an important foundation for Australian Matildas teams that would capture world attention in years to follow.

During her career, Sawyers said the players eventually had half their costs covered.

"We had all the skills and everything. We just didn't have the opportunity," Sawyers said.

"It's good to see that they are doing that now."

The Coalstars ace was later joined by international players Teri McQueen (cap 38), Sonia Gegenhuber (cap 63), Kaylene Janssen (cap 64), Louise McMurtrie (cap 87), Bryony Duus (cap 96) and Belinda Kitching (cap 98).

Janssen, nicknamed KJ, represented her country 27 times between 1991 and 1995. That included the 1995 World Cup.

Duus played in 54 games around the world between 1994 and 2004, including the 2000 Olympics and 2003 World Cup.

Clifford McClurg (1929-2013)

Cliff was born in Northern Ireland

As a Junior he captained Northern Ireland and was selected for Great Britain.

Cliff coached Coalstars Under 18 Premiership team.

Cliff was President of Coalstars from 1966-1968

He was a member of the Queensland Soccer Federation Management Committee and became a state team selector, sat on the disciplinary committee and was involved in bringing famous teams such as Dynamo Moscow and Chelsea to Queensland.

A strategic vision created the Queensland Junior Soccer Council (QJSC) incorporating eight junior regions for State Championships, and invested Cliff as founding president. Ultimately, a national U16 title was achieved, the winning team containing four players who were to become the heart of the Brisbane Strikers, Queensland's first team to become National Soccer League Champions.

Cliff was honoured with Life Membership of the Queensland Soccer Federation for his service.

The qualities he brought to his football roles were manifold as he was a skilled and forward-thinking administrator.

Football was in great hands with Cliff McClurg as custodian. Cliff had four sons Peter, Scott, Brett

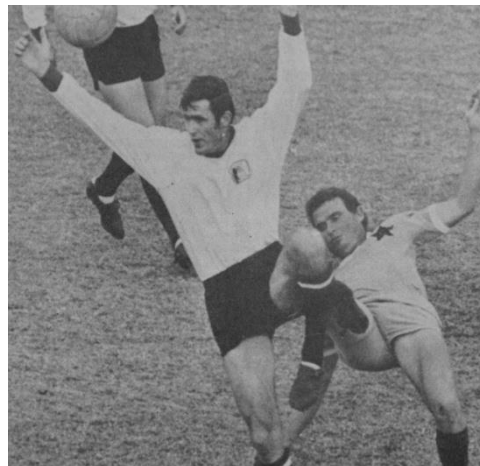

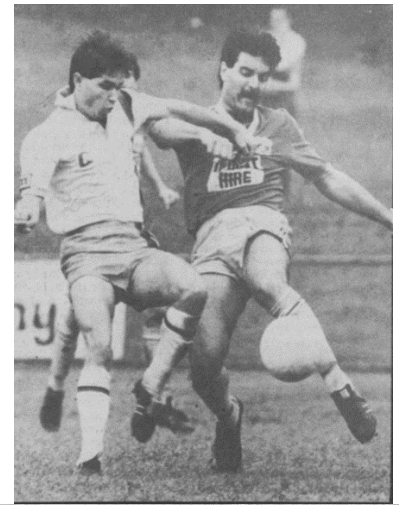

The winner came when Dave Wheeler played a fine ball for Andy Ogden to fire a low shot under North Star keeper Noel Lord.

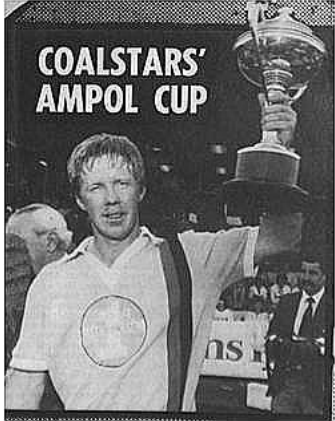

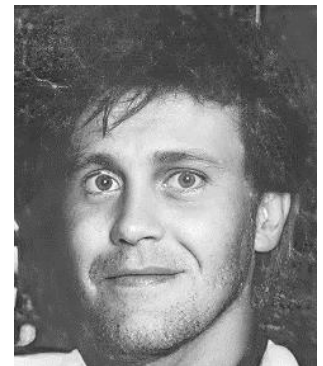

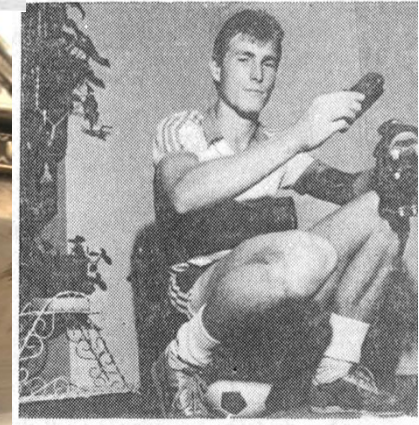

He was in the 1981 NSL Cup Final winners and won premierships with Brisbane Lions in the State League scoring in the 1987 final

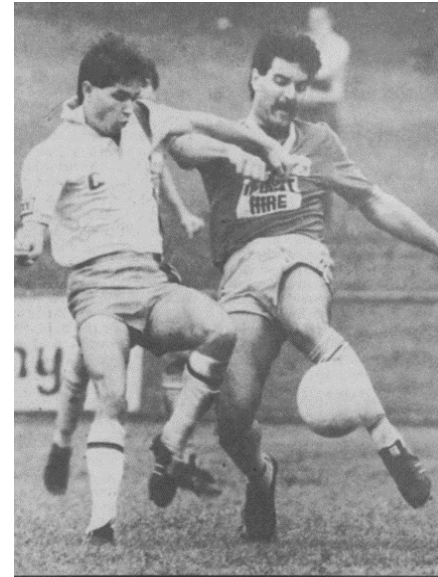
John played twelve times for Qld and represented Ipswich and also coached Taringa Rovers, Coalstars and Ipswich

Andrew played for Dinmore Bush Rats, Brisbane Lions, Olympic and Coalstars

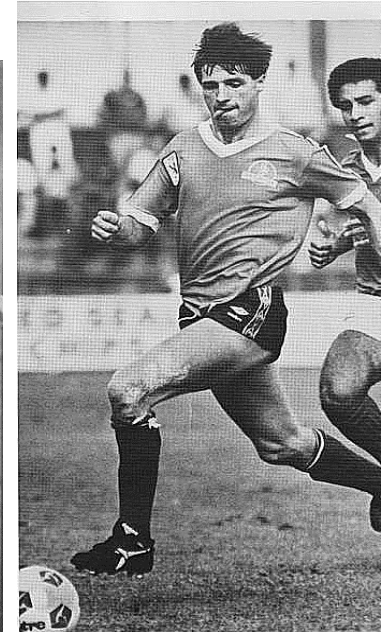
He scored the winning goal in the 1983(Olympic)1986 (Coalstars) Grand Final. Coalstars also won the Ampol Cup in 1986 and 1987
