## Meet the Men from ENGLAND..

**ALAN STEPHENSON**, fullback (West Ham United) - An expensive reinforcement for the Hammer's defence at \$170,000, when he signed from Crystal Palace in March, 1965. A strong, uncompromising centre half, he has made over 23 appearances for England. Missed much of the past season through cartilage trouble.

**PETER HINDLEY**, fullback (Nottingham Forest) - Strong, tackling fullback who signed professional for Forest in 1961. He made his team debut at centre forward - in March, 1963. Won an under 23 cap against Greece in 1967, and has made over 300 appearances for his club.

**MIKE KEIN**, fullback (Luton Town) - A solid hardtackling defender who has helped Luton to the brink of promotion with a good season.

**GEORGE McVITTIE**, forward (West Bromwich Albion) - Signed for Albion in the 1955-56 season from Carlisle United for \$70,000. Joined Carlisle as an apprentice and was a regular with that side for two years.

**KEN WAGSTAFFE**, forward (Hull City) - In more than 400 matches with Mansfield Town and Hull City has scored more than 150 goals and is valued at over \$250,000 on the transfer market.

**MICK MILLS**, fullback (Ipswich Town) - A shrewd, sturdy defender who plays either at fullback or in midfield. He joined Ipswich as an apprentice in 1965 and has played for England in several youth internationals.

**BARRY BRIDGES**, forward (Millwall) - A forceful forward who toured Australia with Chelsea in 1965. Since joining Queens Park Rangers before going to Millwall. Signed professional first with Chelsea in 1958. A former England schoolboy representative who played 18 times in under 23 youth internationals.

**CHRIS GARLAND**, forward (Bristol City) - Local Bristol player who has spent all of his professional career with the one club. Has made over 100 club appearances.

**DENNIS MORTIMER**, forward (Coventry City) - One of the last minute replacements when Rodney Marsh and Mike Ratley withdrew from the tour.

**DAVE WATSON**, forward (Sunderland) - Other replacement forward.

**MARK WALKER** (St Helens) - Flurry goalscorer who has been an automatic selection in this position for the past two seasons. Extremely calm leader with the ability to shoot his line and under pressure. Had a great match against the Dynamos earlier this year and despite strong pressure from Martin Cox and Peter Roberts has managed to hold his place as No. 1 keeper.

**GEOFF GAULT** (Bardon-Latrobe) - Tall, speedy fullback playing his first year in First Division after being signed by Bardon from Second Division Ashbury. Equally at home either at fullback or centre half and is unlikely to be worried by "big match" nerves, judging by his sound performance against St. George's-Budapest in April.

**ALEX SENJUSCHENKO** (Morton-East) - Making his first appearance for the State but has previously represented West Australia before coming to Queensland. Has switched from a midfield role to a double centre half position for his club and his height and strong tackling should be the perfect foil in the middle for Barry Dunn.

**BARRY DANN** (Orange-Thirle) - Almost uncatchable in the air in club football and this will be his chief asset against the English forwards. Never turns in a bad performance in a representative match and with Senjuschenko, will provide the State with its toughest defence down the middle for some time.

**PETER NIELSEN** (Aspers) - One of the fittest and most consistent footballers in the State. Queensland's best player against the Dynamos and his chief attribute is the ability to work non-stop for the full 90 minutes. Another strong tackler and constructive clearer of the ball under pressure.

**ALAN JAMES** (Polera) - Happy and determined little halfback who has been on the verge of State selection for some time. Consistent club displays and a solid match for Brisbane last Wednesday week, in which he scored two goals, earned him his selection. Has a powerful shot and will be useful to Queensland both in defence and attack.

**ALAN SINCLAIR** (Bardon-Latrobe) - Another extremely fit player who has a flair for overlapping into attack, when the occasion arises. A robust tackler who plays about the same lines as James. Would not surprise by doing a ton of work in attack on the left wing today.

**GARY WILKIN** (Macksville-Lewis) - Powerful State striker who has recovered fully from a long spell on the sidelines to be reinstated in the team after only a few matches for Macksville score his comeback. Always one of our top players in big matches and the selectors will be hoping for a repeat of his brilliant Kruger Cup match for Ipswich. Will give the State side a great lift both in defence and attack.

**GERRY SCHINDORFER** (Aspers) - One of the few effective wingers in Brisbane with a deadly right foot kick. Improved in his debut outing against St. George and was actually not to have scored a goal in that match. His undoubted speed on the right flank could prove troublesome for the English defence.

**KEVIN CALDWELL** (Coakart) - Young Ipswich centre forward with a lot of promise. Was having an impressive match against St. George until forced to leave the field with a knee injury. Is surrounded by experienced men and could prove to be one of the stars against the tough English defence.

**JIM ANCLIFFE** (Orange-Thirle) - Has created a tremendous impression since coming from England. Shields a ball well, passes constructively and has become one of our most consistent scorers in club football. His brilliant ball control will be another valuable asset against the Englishmen.

**MARTIN COE** (Bardon-Latrobe) - Unlucky to strike a man of Walker's capability, which has been the only obstacle preventing his selection as No. 1 goalkeeper. Outstanding in the air and also has a powerful clearing kick.

**TREVOR CATCHPOLE** (Morton-East) - Discovered from the State team earlier this year his workmanlike displays for Morton have demanded his re-inclusion. Works like a Trojan during a match and is a forward who is certainly not worried by reputation and is a willing tackler.

**PETER GEMMELL** (St. Helens) - Promising young Ipswich player who has been one of Saints' most consistent men this year. Deserves a run at some stage during the match, but in any case is assured of an exciting football career in future State teams.
