## Meet the Men from ENGLAND..

**PETER GRUNDT,** goalkeeper (Sheffield Wednesday) — Three times England under 23 international and a Football League representative. Played almost 400 games for Forest, a club he joined as a ground staff boy, signing professional in 1940. At 18 in November, 1960, he became the youngest keeper since the war to play for Forest.

**JOHN BARRON,** goalkeeper (Nottingham Forest) — Sound in technique. Transferred from Oxford United for \$60,000. Joined Oxford in 1946 from Chelsea, a club he had joined from Wolverhampton Wanderers, where he first became a professional at the age of 17.

**KEITH EDNEY,** halfback (Walsall) — Captain of his club. A midfield general, who cost the club only \$2,600 from Barrow. Made his debut for Barrow when he was 17, scoring in his team's 3-2 win over Walsall.

**PETER WALL,** fullback (Crystal Palace) — Fast, attacking fullback who is also strong and resolute in defense. A valuable addition to Palace after he signed last May for \$20,000 from Liverpool, where he spent four years.

**CHRIS CHILTON,** forward (Hull City) — One of the Second Division's most prolific scorers. Has played more than 400 games for Hull City.

**NORMAN PIPER,** halfback (Portsmouth) — An under 23 representative, who joined Portsmouth from Plymouth, where he had more than 215 appearances. A skilful young player who shows promise.

**ALAN STEPHENSON,** halfback (West Ham United) — An expensive reinforcement for the Hammers' defense at \$170,000, when he signed from Crystal Palace in March, 1960. A strong, uncompromising centre half, he has made many under 23 appearances for England. Missed much of the past season through cartilage trouble.

**PETER HINDLEY,** fullback (Nottingham Forest) — Strong, tackling fullback, who signed professional terms for Forest in 1961. He made his team debut at centre forward — in March, 1961. Won an under 23 cap against Czecho in 1967, and has made over 300 appearances for his club.

**MIKE KEEN,** fullback (Luton Town) — A solid hard-tackling defender who has helped Luton to the brink of promotion with a good season.

**GEORGE McVITIE,** forward (West Bromwich Albion) — Signed for Albion in the 1959-61 season from Carlisle United for \$70,000. Joined Carlisle as an apprentice and was a regular with that side for two years.

**KEN MAGSTAFFIE,** forward (Hull City) — In more than 400 matches with Mansfield Town and Hull City has scored more than 150 goals and is valued at over \$230,000 on the transfer market.

**MICK MILLS,** fullback (Ipswich Town) — A strong, sturdy defender who plays either at fullback or in midfield. He joined Ipswich as an apprentice in 1963 and has played for England in several youth internationals.

**BARRY BRIDGES,** forward (Middlesbrough) — A powerful forward who toured Australia with Chelsea in 1965. Since joined Queens Park Rangers before going to Middlesbrough. Signed professional first with Chelsea in 1958. A former England schoolboy representative who played 18 times in under 23 youth internationals.

**CHRIS GARLAND,** forward (Bristol City) — Local Bristol player who has spent all of his professional career with the one club. Has made over 100 club appearances.

**DENNIS MORTIMER,** forward (Coventry City) — One of the last minute replacements when Rodney Marsh and Mike Bailey withdrew from the tour.

**DAVE WATSON,** forward (Sanderson) — Other replacement forward.

**MARK WALKER (St Helens) —** Flawless goal keeper who has been an automatic selection in this position for the past two seasons. Extraordinary save handling with the ability to clear the ball well under pressure. Had a great match against the Dynamos earlier this year and despite strong pressure from Morris Cox and Peter Roberts has managed to hold his place as No. 1 keeper.

**GEOFF GAULT (Barrow-Latrobe) —** Tall, quiet fullback playing his first year in First Division after being signed by Barrow from Second Division Accrington. Equally at home either as fullback or centre half and is unlikely to be worried by "big match" nerves, judging by his sound performance against St. George-Bendigo in April.

**ALEX SENJUSCHENKO (Marion-East) —** Making his first appearance for the State but has previously represented West Australia before coming to Queensland. Has switched from a midfield role to a double centre half position for his club and his height and strong tackling should be the perfect foil to the middle for Party Dean.

**BARRY DANN (Orange-Thurde) —** Almost unbeatable in the air in club football and this will be his chief asset against the English forwards. Never turns in a bad performance in a representative match and with Senjuschenko, will provide the State with its toughest defense down the middle for some time.

**PETER NIELSEN (Aixford) —** One of the fittest and most consistent footballers in the State. Queensland's best player against the Dynamos and his chief attribute is the ability to work non-stop for the full 90 minutes. Another strong tacker and constructive clearer of the ball under pressure.

**ALAN JAMES (Toowoomba) —** Happy and determined little halfback who has been on the verge of State selection for some time. Consistent club displays and a solid match for Edithvale last Wednesday night, in which he scored two goals, earned him his selection. Has a powerful shot and will be useful to Queensland both in defense and attack.

**ALAN SINCLAIR (Barrow-Latrobe) —** Another extremely fit player who has a flair for overlapping into attack, when the occasion arises. A robust tacker who plays along the same lines as James. Would not surprise by doing a ton of work in attack on the left wing today.

**GARY WILKIN (Mildura-Latrobe) —** Powerful State skipper who has recovered fully from a long spell on the sidelines to be reselected in the team after only a few matches for Mildura since his comeback. Always one of the top players in big matches and the selectors will be hoping for a repeat of his brilliant Kappa Cup match for Tasmania, which gave the State side a great lift both in defense and attack.

**GEERT SCHIEDENDORFER (Aixford) —** One of the few attacking wings in Britain with a deadly right foot shot. Improved in his return series against St. George and was unlucky not to have scored a goal in that match. His unrelenting speed on the right flank could prove troublesome for the English defense.

**KEVIN CALDWELL (Cairns) —** Young forward centre forward with a lot of promise. Was having an impressive match against St. George until forced to leave the field with a bad injury, is supported by experienced men and could prove to be one of the stars against the tough English defense.

**JIM ANCLIFFE (Orange-Thurde) —** Has created a tremendous impression since coming from England. Displays a ball well, plays constructively and has become one of our most consistent scorers in club football. His brilliant ball control will be another valuable asset against the English.

**MARTIN COE (Barrow-Latrobe) —** Unable to strike a man of Walker's capability, which has been the only obstacle preventing his selection as No. 1 goalkeeper. Outstanding in the air and also has a powerful closing kick.

**TREVOR CATCHPOLE (Marion-East) —** Discarded from the State team earlier this year his remarkable displays for Marion have demanded his re-inclusion. Works like a trojan during a match and is a forward who is certainly not worried by reputations and is a willing tacker.

**PETER GEMMELL (St Helens) —** Promising young Ipswich player who has been one of Scotland's most consistent men this year. Deserves a run at least once during the match, but in any case is assured of an exciting football career in future State teams.
