Oueensland and Australian Soccer representative, Gordon ("Bunny") Nunn, is the "Brisbane Telegraph" Blue of Blues for winter 1949.

This fine sportsman, the outstanding centre forward in Australia, at 22 years, is the first Soccer player to have been awarded the Blue of Blues, which rates him Queensland's No. 1 sporting identity.

Nunn commenced playing soccer in 1939, with a schoolbay record of 48 goals in 10 games.

At 15 years he played for St. Helens first division, and his goal scoring record is unchallenged in Queensland.

He has never been penalised for a deliberate infringement.

"Bunny" comes from a real footballing family. His father played for Bundamba, Uncle Coc. ("Bunny") Num represented the State, Uncle Roy was one of the stalwarts of the old Toombul club, and brother Doug, also plays


