

Matthew(Matth)Bailey(1862-1941)

Matthew Bailey sailed to Australia on the Quetta in 1882 and played for the 1890 Dinmore Bush Rats team
Matthew married Charlotte Shaw whose brothers (Campbell's) were all involved in Dinmore Bush Rats
Matthew was President of Dinmore Bush Rats for many years and was the first Secretary
He was the first President of New Chum wanderers. He was also on team Management in Qld teams and was selector for the 1898 Queensland side

His daughter Harriet married Thomas Cruickshanks in 1916.

Thomas played for Dinmore Wanderers. Harriet Bailey's sister married Joseph Hainsworth the brother of Dinmore Bush Rats and Qld Representatives Tom and John

Their son Lyle represented Ipswich and won Premierships with St Helens
Grandson Trevor played for St Helens, Wattles and was a member of the 1950 Dinmore Bush Rats Premiership team and was on the committee
Grandson Thomas played for Northtown United and Blackstone Rovers
Great Grandsons Dennis and Neville also played for Dinmore Bush Rats (Redbank Dinmore) and St Helens

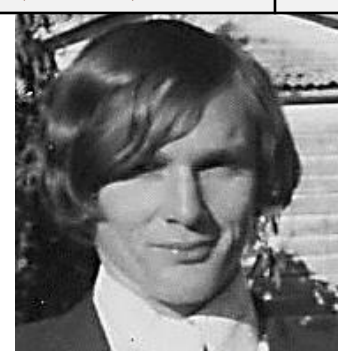

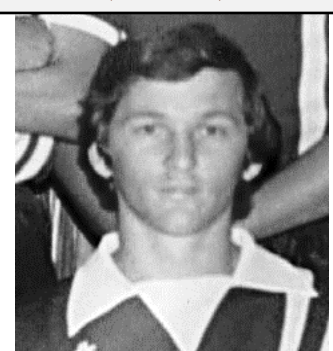

William Bailey (1869-1936)

William was born at Bracken Hill, Yorkshire, England. He sailed for Australia with his parents in 1885 in the Duke of Westminster and landed in Brisbane January 11, 1886.

His first Job was at Dinmore Pottery, after which he worked in coal mines in Bundamba.

He married Jane Campbell, of Tivoli, and took up residence at New Chum

He was a member of the first Dinmore Bush Rats team in 1890 and won four Premierships

William’s son James played for Dinmore Bush Rats and was in the 1930 Dinmore Wanderers Premiership team and son William was in the 1911 Dinmore State School Premiers and Cup Winning team
