First Interstate Schoolboy match

Queensland Times (Ipswich, Qld.: 1909 - 1954), Thursday 15 August 1912

This was a most interesting engagement between tile youths of the two States, being the first school grade representative match, played under "soccer" codes in Australia.'rhe ground was under water, consequently the ball became very heavy and greasy.

The first half terminated in favour of the New South Wales boys, they having gained 3 goals to their opponents 1. This half was marked by distinctly good play, J. M'Gill (of the Ipswich Central State Sehool and P. Statham (of the Dinmore School) being frequently prominent

The second term was, however, responsible of brilliant expositions on both sides, the Southern boys giving a really attractive display. Shortly after the ball was put in motion, the New South Welsh boys gained their No. 4 goal. From this out, the Queenslanders warmed up, and their efforts were warmly applauded. Shirras the Queensland goalie, gave another attractive exhibition in goal. Tie following are the names of the players

-New South Wales school boys: In goal, Murray; half-hacks, Holliday, Neilsen, and Aikes; forwards, O'Hara, Thompson, Carts, Davies, and Neilsen.

Queensland boys: In goal, Shirras; backs, R. Whiteman and W. M?'Donnell; half-backs, Cairns. L. Lindsay, Barnes: forwards, J. M'Gill (Ipswich), Leahy, P. Statham (Dinmore), Hay, and Nesbit.

The game ended--New South Walfes, 4 goals; Queensland, 1.


